Timeline for the Revolutionary War, the Schooner *Dolphin*, George Barber, and William Middleton

The Revolutionary War was between the American patriots and the British, ruled by King George.

Lexington and Concord – Paul Revere's ride – the Revolution began. **April 18, 1775** May 1775 George Washington was appointed general and commander-in-chief of the Continental Army. The Declaration of Independence was signed. July 4, 1776 December 1776 Washington crossed the Delaware and spent the winter in Valley Forge. Marquis de Lafayette arrived from France, volunteered to work without pay, and **July 1777** became one of Washington's most trusted aides. The Battle of Saratoga was the first major American victory October 1777 **November 1777** The Articles of Confederation were written. Americans signed a treaty with France, bringing in French support. February 1778 British General Clinton sailed from New York to Chesapeake Bay. **December 1779** March 31, 1780 First orders for the Dolphin May 1780 British captured the city of Charleston George Barber went on board the schooner Dolphin. **October 16, 1780** More orders for the *Dolphin* February 17, 1781 Dolphin assigned lookout duty in Chesapeake Bay. The Chesapeake Bay was full of British ships. February 1781 Washington ordered Lafayette to take his 1200 troops south and be in Yorktown, Virginia, by March 8 – on the way he got more troops in Philadelphia March 3, 1781 Lafayette arrived at Head of Elk, Maryland, but there weren't enough boats to carry the troops, so they stopped moving. March 8, 1781 Lafayette arrived in Annapolis on his way to Yorktown in Virginia. Lafayette got on board the *Dolphin* in Annapolis. March 9, 1781 Lafayette, aboard the *Dolphin*, wrote a letter to George Washington, March 11, 1781 ... and they sailed to the Patuxent River. There were many British ships in the Chesapeake Bay; it wasn't safe, so Lafayette got off the *Dolphin* and took a barge [smaller, rowboat-like vessel] to Virginia. The *Dolphin* was captured by the British ship *Madeira*. March 12, 1781 George Barber, Captain Middleton, and the other members of the crew were sent to Forton Prison in England. March 14, 1781 Lafayette arrived in Yorktown and, with his troops, helped block the British army's escape route to the sea. September 1781 British, French, and American troops were gathered at Yorktown, Virginia. The British were caught between Washington's troops and Lafayette's troops and French ships in the bay. The British surrendered. October 17, 1781 The Americans won the war - and their independence from Britain. April/May 1782 Captain Middleton escaped from prison, went to France, and, with the help of the Marquis de Lafayette, returned to America. 1783 George Barber returned to America.
