In 2023, congress passed the Consolidation Appropriation Act, which eliminated the requirement for practitioners to have a waiver to prescribe Buprenorphine. All practitioners who have a current DEA registration that includes Schedule II - V authority, may now prescribe buprenorphine for opioid use disorder in their practice if permitted by applicable state law.

Item Title	BWNS database and Files
	The BWNS was used to collect information from practitioners who wished to participate in the DATA Waiver program. This requirement was removed under the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 and the database itself will no longer be maintained after April of 2024. Physicians who wished to apply for the waiver would provide their DEA registration number, state license number, full name, state where licensed, physical address, telephone number, fax number, and email address, training certificates, or board certification. Applicants were evaluated to determine if physicians qualified for administering, dispensing, and prescribing specific FDA approved controlled substances according to the terms of the Drug Addiction Treatment Act of 2000, and certify their waivers under the act. Records include the applications and supporting documents submitted by practitioners, as well as approval letters, Voluntary and Involuntary Surrender letters, decision-making documents, and other related records maintained within the system. Also included are locator files that are made available for public use on SAMHSA's website. These locators are used to identify practitioners who can provide Buprenorphine treatment. Inclusion in the locator was opt-in or opt-out, so not all practitioners who were not previously waivered can be added since the removal of the waiver requirement.
