On May 27, 1972, BALDWIN stated that he slept the majority of the day and pointed out that when he returned to the Howard Johnson's Motel on May 25, 1972, that there was a number of items he described as electronic equipment in Room 419 and that on either the evening of May 25 or 27, 1972, MC CORD was "fiddling" with one of these instruments. BALDWIN described it as a C.E.I.-Communication, Electronics Incorporated, Rockville, Maryland, Receiving System Type R.S.-111-1B-12, 30-1000MC, and that during his tuning of this instrument it went to 113.9 megacycles and picked up a conversation to which BALDWIN listened. This conversation was in regard to a [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] MC CORD then tuned this receiving unit to

135 megacycles, apparently attempting to pick up an additional conversation but all that could be heard by him or BALDWIN was a radio station. BALDWIN stated that there was another receiving system, manufactured by the Mason Engineering Company of Connecticut, in a brown attache case. MC CORD described this unit as a debugging unit as well as a receiver. At this time there was also one tape recorder in Room 419 but the recorder could not be adapted to the C.E.I. receiving system. During this time MC CORD made the comment that "We'll have to move to a higher level."

BALDWIN stated that sometime that weekend he traveled to the Registration Desk of the Howard Johnson's Motel putting in a request for a room on the seventh floor of the Howard Johnson's Motel and that either on the afternoon of May 29 or on the morning of May 30, 1972, he moved to Room 723, taking the previously described electronic equipment with him. The C.E.I. receiving system was maintained in a blue suitcase, apparently manufactured to fit the receiving system.

BALDWIN advised that he began monitoring the receiving system through an earphone on May 29 or 30, 1972, and he did so per Mr. MC CORD's instructions from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. every day and was told by MC CORD that if he was in the room after hours, he should continue to monitor. BALDWIN was to keep daily logs of the conversations on this line, described as having the date, time and conversational activity. BALDWIN stated that he began keeping these logs on accounting paper and then began using legal-size yellow pads.


BALDWIN advised the only conversations he could overhear were telephone conversations and that in discussion with MC CORD determined that four extensions on one phone at some office of the Democratic National Headquarters, located in the Watergate, across from the Howard Johnson's Motel, were being monitored. MC CORD told BALDWIN to ascertain the identity of the individual whose telephone lines were being monitored. BALDWIN stated that the identity of this individual was ascertained in the first one or two days of listening. He described this individual by name as
