Mrs. Meriam Jenkins made the following statement to Chief Judge Sirica on the above date. There were also present besides the Chief Judge, Todd Christofferson, law clerk, James Capitanio, courtroom clerk and Alease Holley, secretary.

About ten o'clock this morning I received a telephone call from Mr. Bernard Shankman and he inquired if the Court would take a cashier's check for \$100,000 so that his client might go out on bond. I asked him what case he was calling about and he replied, "The Watergate case." [Mr. Shankman is local counsel for defendant James W. McCord in Crim. No. 1827-72.] I told him that I did not know whether our clerk's office could accept a cashier's check and I would have to check with them. I also told him that in a conversation I had with Chief Judge Sirica at the time Mr. Hunt went out on bond, he specified that the bond must be with a surety company, and I believed that he intended for this to apply to the other defendants in the case. Mr. Shankman asked what difference it made and I told him there was a great deal of difference between cash bond and bond by surety company, and that the Chief Judge had impressed upon me the fact that the bond must be with a reliable surety company. I told Mr. Shankman that I would have to call him back. I then contacted Todd Christofferson, law clerk to Judge Sirica, and informed him of the call. Mr. Christofferson took the matter up with Judge Sirica, and the Judge told me by phone to tell Mr. Shankman to file a formal motion setting forth in the motion what he had to say and to serve a copy on the U. S. Attorney and all parties involved. I told Mr. Shankman that the Judge would think about it and advise him whether or not he would hold a hearing in the matter. Mr. Shankman said that he did not have the money yet -- "I am just asking in the event that I should get it."

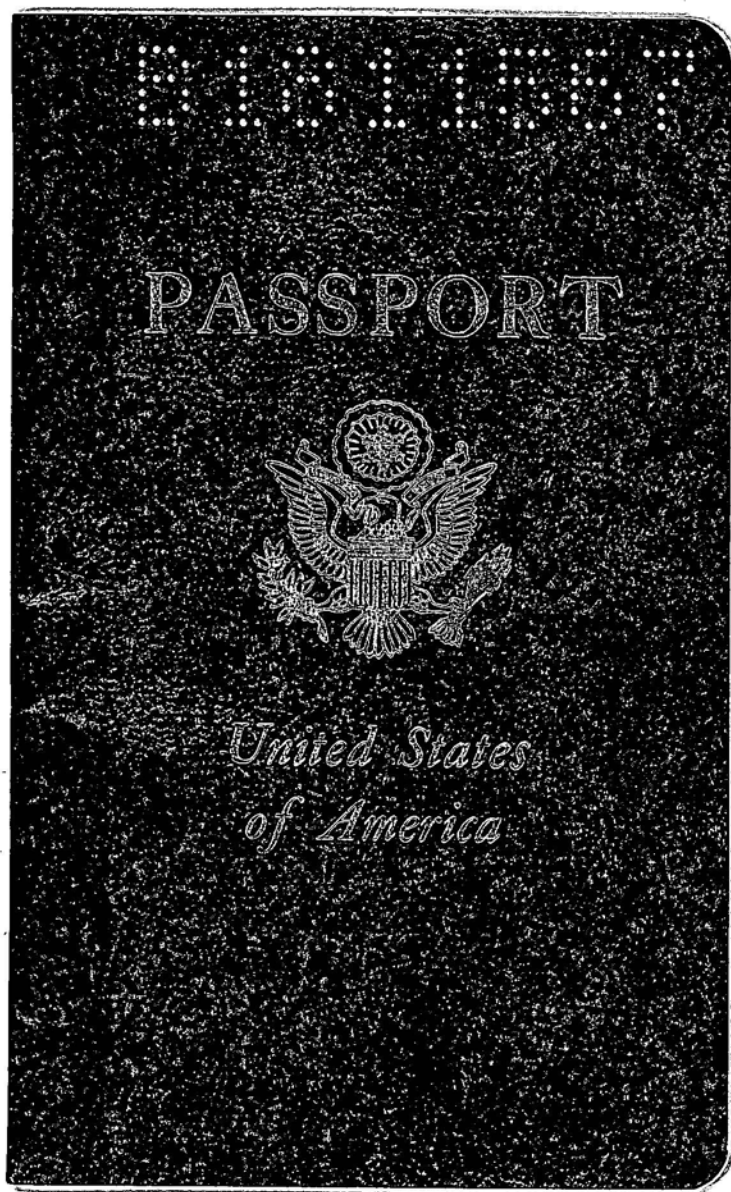

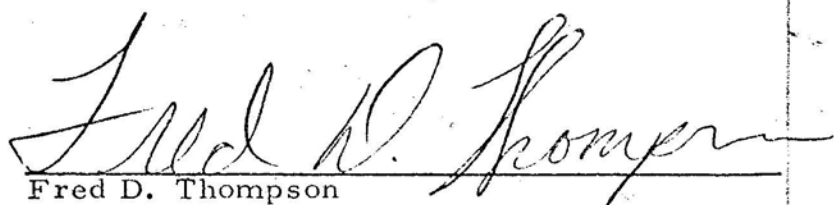

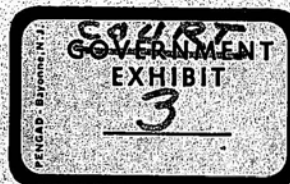
