 and are not entitled to freedom under these Laws, at a certain time, and after a known period of service. — So Help us God. held to Service or Labour, as Slaves.

I, *Austen Woolfolk* Collector of the District of Baltimore, do hereby Certify that the within is a true copy of the Original Manifest or List of Slaves, left on file in this office; and I do further certify, that *Christen Woolfolk owner* of the said Slaves, and *Heman Foster* Master of the within mentioned *Brig Algerine* have this day made oath, in manner directed by the ninth Section of the Act of Congress, passed the Second day of March, 1807, prohibiting the Importation of Slaves into the United States—I do hereby authorise the said Master to proceed with the said Slave, named as within, and being *Soutten* in number, to the Port of *New Orleans* in the State of *Louisiana*
