1. (C) US VISIT OF LIEUTENANT GENERAL LECPCLDC FORTUNATO GALTIERI,
COMMANDER IN CHIEF OF THE ARGENTINE ARMY, ARGENTINA IS APPROVED
UNDER DA VIP TOURS PROGRAM. FOLLOWING LETTER WAS DISPATCHED THIS
DATE FOR DELIVERY TO LIEUTENANT GENERAL GALTIERI: "DEAR GENERAL
GALTIERI: IT IS AN HONOR FOR ME TO EXTEND A MOST CORDIAL INVITATION
FOR YOU AND MRS. GALTIERI AND TWO OFFICERS OF YOUR CHOICE TO VISIT
THIS COUNTRY AS GUESTS OF THE UNITED STATES ARMY DURING THE PERIOD
5 - 14 AUGUST 1981. I WOULD HOPE THAT YOUR VISIT WILL PROVIDE AN
OPPORTUNITY FOR US TO REINFORCE THE WARM BONDS WHICH EXIST BETWEEN
OUR TWO FORCES.

DURING YOUR STAY I WOULD PLAN FOR YOU TO VISIT A VARIETY OF
INSTALLATIONS AND MILITARY ACTIVITIES WHICH I AM SURE WILL BE OF
BOTH PERSONAL AND PROFESSIONAL INTEREST TO YOU.

CAROL AND I LOOK FORWARD TO WELCOMING YOU AND LUCIA TO THE UNITED
STATES.

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DELIVERY OF ACTUAL LETTER TO LIEUTENANT GENERAL GALTIERI IF RESPONSE TO INVITATION IS NOT RECEIVED SOONER.

B. RECOMMEND LTG GALTIERI AND PARTY PLAN FOR ARRIVAL IN MIAMI, FLORIDA ON 5 AUGUST 1981 AND DEPART MIAMI, FLA., ON 15 AUGUST 1981. WASHINGTON, DC PORTION SCHEDULED FOR 13-14 AUGUST 1981. WASHINGTON, DC DATES ARE FIRM AND CANNOT, REPEAT CANNOT BE CHANGED.

C. TRAVEL TO AND FROM CONUS IS RESPONSIBILITY OF GOVERNMENT OF ARGENTINA. THE USE OF US AIRCRAFT FOR THIS PURPOSE IS NOT AUTHORIZED AND SHOULD NOT BE OFFERED.

D. YOU WILL NOTE THAT INVITATION IS FOR PRINCIPAL, HIS WIFE, AND TWO STAFF OFFICERS. IF ONE OF THE STAFF OFFICERS DOES NOT ACCOMPANY, THE ARGENTINEAN MILITARY ATTACHE IN WASHINGTON MAY BE INCLUDED IN ALL WASHINGTON, DC ACTIVITIES. THE TOTAL NUMBER IN THE PARTY FROM ARGENTINA MUST NOT EXCEED FOUR.

E. ALL CONUS TRAVEL WILL BE BY USAF SPECIAL AIR MISSION (SAM) AIRCRAFT OR FIRST CLASS COMMERCIAL AIR. ALL ESSENTIAL CONUS EXPENSES (MEALS, HOTEL, OFFICIAL ENTERTAINMENT, ETC.) WILL BE PAID BY DA.

F. IF MRS. GALTIERI ACCOMPANIES, SHE WILL BE INCLUDED AS A MEMBER OF OFFICIAL PARTY THROUGHOUT TOUR. WHERE APPROPRIATE, SEPARATE ACTIVITIES WILL BE ARRANGED FOR HER. IF SHE DOES NOT ACCOMPANY, A THIRD STAFF OFFICER MAY BE SUBSTITUTED.

G. DA WOULD LIKE TO USE US ARMY ATTACHE TO SERVE AS US ARMY ESCORT OFFICER FOR CONUS TOUR. IF YOU CONCUR, ARMA SHOULD ARRIVE CONUS ON 2 AUGUST 1981, FOR BRIEFINGS 3 AUGUST 1981. DA WILL PAY PER DIEM FOR ARMA IN CONUS. DA CANNOT FUND ARMA TRAVEL TO OR FROM CONUS, BUT WILL ASSIST IN ARRANGING TRAVEL.

H. REQUEST ANY ADDITIONAL INDICATIONS OF LTG GALTIERI'S SCOPE OF INTEREST AS WELL AS AREAS OF INTEREST WHICH SUPPORT DAO MISSION (I.E., WHAT THINGS SHOULD WE DO FOR HIM TO MAKE YOUR JOB EASIER). ALSO ADVISE OF ITEMS HE SHOULD NOT SEE. UPON RECEIPT OF THIS INFORMATION, THIS OFFICE WILL PREPARE ITINERARY FOR APPROVAL BY CSA.

I. UNIFORM REQUIREMENTS: PARTY SHOULD BRING EQUIVALENT OF ARMY GREENS, AND SUFFICIENT CIVILIAN ATTIRE. THERE MAY BE OCCASIONS WHEN THE FIELD UNIFORM, US FATIGUE EQUIVALENT, IS APPROPRIATE. THE WEARING OF THIS UNIFORM IS OPTIONAL AND BRINGING IT TO THE US SHOULD BE LEFT TO THE DISCRETION OF THE PRINCIPAL.

3. (C) FOLLOWING WILL BE REQUIRED FROM YOUR OFFICE ASAP TO PERMIT

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DETAILED PLANNING:

A. ACCEPTANCE WITH ETA AND ETO CONUS, AND PORTS OF ENTRY AND EXIT PREFERABLY AS INDICATED IN PARAGRAPH 2B ABOVE.

B. FULL NAMES, EXACT POSITIONS, BIO DATA, AND PHOTOS FOR EACH MEMBER OF PARTY, TO INCLUDE WIFE. DATA SHOULD INCLUDE PERSONAL PREFERENCES REGARDING FOOD, BEVERAGES, RECREATION AND ENTERTAINMENT, RELIGION, DIETARY OR OTHER RESTRICTIONS, PERSONAL ANIMOSITIES, SUBJECTS TO BE AVOIDED AND PROTOCOL DATA ON ADDRESSING, TOASTING, ETC.

C. INFO ON WHETHER OR NOT LTG GALTIERI WILL WANT TO PLACE A WREATH AT TOMB OF UNKNOWN SOLDIER AT ARLINGTON NATIONAL CEMETERY, AS MOST VIP'S DO WHEN IN WASHINGTON, D.C. SINCE THIS CONSTITUTES AN HONOR TO THE US, THIS QUERY SHOULD BE PUT SO AS NOT TO BE CONSTRUED AS A REQUEST.

D. IF WIFE IS TO ACCOMPANY LTG GALTIERI, PLEASE ADVISE AS TO ANY AREAS OF INTEREST WHICH MRS. GALTIERI MAY HAVE WHILE VISITING CONUS.

4. CU) COPY OF THE ABOVE INVITATION WILL BE DELIVERED TO ARGENTINEAN MILITARY ATTACHE IN WASHINGTON, DC.

5. (C/NOFORN) REQUEST COMMENTS OF THE COUNTRY TEAM REGARDING THE DESIRABILITY AND FEASIBILITY OF PRESENTING THE LEGION OF MERIT, DEGREE OF COMMANDER, TO LTG GALTIERI. RECOMMENDATION SHOULD INCLUDE A REMARK THAT THE INDIVIDUAL HAS NOT MADE ANY STATEMENT OR ENGAGED IN ANY ACTIVITY THAT MIGHT EMBARRASS THE U.S. GOVERNMENT SHOULD THE AWARD BE PRESENTED. LUCIA GALTEIRI; BRIGADIER GENERAL MIGUEL "MALLEA GIL" MILITARY ATTACHE TO WASHINGTON FROM ARGENTINE; COLONEL NORBETO RICARDO "FERRERO", MILITARY SECRETARY TO LTG GALTEIRI; LIEUTENANT COLONEL CARLOS ALBERTO "SETTEL", AIDE DE CAMPTO LTG GALTEIRI. 2. (C/NOFORN) THE GALTIERI PARTY HAS LIMITED ENGLISH LANGUAGE CAPABILITY. BG MALLEA GIL WILL ACT AS INTERPRETER FOR LTG GALTIERI. REQUEST FT. LEWIS AND FT. CAMPBELL PROVIDE AN INTERPRETER FOR MRS. GALTIERI. BRIEFERS ARE REMINDED TO AVOID SLANG AND ACRONYMS AND TO SPEAK SLOWLY. THE FACT THAT AN INTERPRETER IS BEING USED WILL ALMOST DOUBLE THE TIME OF THE BRIEFING. THE ONLY HONORS CEREMONY WILL BE IN WASH DC. SCHEDULE EVENTS SHOULD BEGIN NO EARLIER THAN 0900 HOURS AND TERMINATE BY 1600 HOURS EACH DAY.

3. (S/NOFORN) THE BIO IS AS FOLLOWS:

(U) NAME: LIEUTENANT GENERAL LEOPOLDO FORTUNATO GALTIERI
(GAHL-TEE-EHR-REE) ARMY.

(U) POSITION: COMMANDER IN CHIEF OF THE ARGENTINE ARMY AND A
MEMBER OF THE THREE MAN MILITARY JUNTA SINCE 1 JANUARY 1980.

(S/NOFORN) SIGNIFICANCE: LIEUTENANT GENERAL LEOPOLDO FORTUNATO
GALTIERI IS THE ARGENTINE ARMY COMMANDER IN CHIEF AND IS CURRENTLY
A MEMBER OF THE THREE MAN MILITARY JUNTA. WITH THE EXCEPTION OF
PRESIDENT VIOLA, GALTIERI IS ONE OF THE MOST POWERFUL FIGURES IN
ARGENTINA. HIS APPOINTMENT INDICATES THE INCREASED POWER OF POLITI-
CAL AND MILITARY MODERATES, AND AN INFANTRY BRANCH VICTORY IN THEIR
INTERNECINE RIVALRY WITH THE CAVALRY BRANCH. ALTHOUGH HE IS IN THE
ENGINEER BRANCH, GALTIERI ENJOYS SOLID INFANTRY BRANCH SUPPORT. HE
ALSO HAD THE FULL BACKING OF EX-PRESIDENT VIDELA AND FORMER ARMY COM-
MANDER IN CHIEF, NOW PRESIDENT ROBERTO VIOLA. SEVERAL RECENT REPORTS
SHOW THERE MAY BE A RIFT COMING BETWEEN PRESIDENT VIOLA AND THE AM-
BITIOUS GENERAL GALTIERI. IF THE PRACTICES OF THE RECENT PAST PER-
SIST, GALTIERI'S PRESENT POSITION WOULD INDICATE THAT HE IS BEING
GROOMED FOR THE PRESIDENCY. HIS POLITICAL VIEWS ARE GENERALLY CONSIDERED
TO BE A MIRROR IMAGE OF THE OLD VIDELA/VIOLE TEAM. HE IS NOT OVERTLY PO-
LITICAL, AND ENJOYS AN EXCELLENT MILITARY RECORD HAVING SERVED IN ALL OF
THE PROPER STAFF AND COMMAND POSITIONS. GALTIERI EMERGED FROM A PACK OF
SENIOR ARMY OFFICERS IN LATE 1979 FOLLOWING AN ABORTED MINI-COUP
STAGED BY CORPS COMMANDER, GENERAL MENENDEZ IN SEPTEMBER 1979.

(C/NOFORN) POLITICS: LIEUTENANT GENERAL GALTIERI SUPPORTS AND
IS LOYAL TO THE RULING GOVERNMENT. HIS ANTI-PERONIST STANCE LED TO
HIS FORCED RESIGNATION IN 1954 BY THE GOVERNMENT OF THEN PRESIDENT
JUAN PERON, BUT HE WAS REINSTATED IN SEPTEMBER 1955. IN THE MID-
SEVENTIES, IT IS ALLEGED THAT HE HAD MADE CONTACT WITH PERONIST LEAD-
ERS. LIEUTENANT GENERAL GALTIERI WAS KNOWN TO BE PRO-UNITED STATES,
NO DOUBT HAVING BEEN INFLUENCED BY HIS STUDENT DAYS AT THE UNITED
STATES ARMY SCHOOL OF THE AMERICAS, FT. GULICK, CANAL ZONE (1949)
AND THE UNITED STATES ARMY ENGINEER SCHOOL, FORT BELVOIR, VIRGINIA
(1960-61). AS CHIEF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LOGISTICS AND FINANCE, ARMY
GENERAL STAFF (1973-74), GALTIERI HAD AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN THE AC-
QUISITION OF UNITED STATES ARMS AND EQUIPMENT. UNITED STATES PERSON-

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NEL RESPONSIBLE FOR THE MILITARY ASSISTANCE (SALES AND GRANTS) PROGRAM FOUND HIM COOPERATIVE AND HELPFUL.

(C/NOFORN) PERSONAL DATA: GALTIERI WAS BORN ON 15 JULY 1926 AT BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA. HE IS OF MEDIUM BUILD (ABOUT 6'3" OR 1.9M; 190 LBS OR 86KGS), WITH BLUE EYES, AND BROWN HAIR. HE HAS A TALL COMMANDING PRESENCE, BUT SOMETIMES APPEARS TO STOOP. HE SUFFERED A MILD HEART ATTACK IN JULY 1973 FROM WHICH HE HAS APPARENTLY RECOVERED. GALTIERI IS A PRACTICING ROMAN CATHOLIC. HE HAS A POOR COMMAND OF THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE. A FRIENDLY AND OPEN PERSON, HE SPEAKS SLOWLY AND DELIBERATELY. HE IS MARRIED TO THE FORMER LUCIA NOEMI GENTILI. SHE IS A PRACTICING ROMAN CATHOLIC. THEY HAVE THREE (3) CHILDREN: ADRIANA SARA (F), BORN ABOUT 1953; DIANA (F), BORN ABOUT 1954; CARLOS (M), BORN ABOUT 1958.

MEMBER OF THE THREE MAN MILITARY JUNTA SINCE 1 JANUARY 1980.

{S/NOFORN} SIGNIFICANCE: LIEUTENANT GENERAL LEOPOLDO FORTUNATO
GALTIERI IS THE ARGENTINE ARMY COMMANDER IN CHIEF AND IS CURRENTLY
A MEMBER OF THE THREE MAN MILITARY JUNTA. WITH THE EXCEPTION OF
PRESIDENT VIOLA, GALTIERI IS ONE OF THE MOST POWERFUL FIGURES IN
ARGENTINA. HIS APPOINTMENT INDICATES THE INCREASED POWER OF POLITI-
CAL AND MILITARY MODERATES, AND AN INFANTRY BRANCH VICTORY IN THEIR
INTERNECINE RIVALRY WITH THE CAVALRY BRANCH. ALTHOUGH HE IS IN THE

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ENGINEER BRANCH, GALTIERI ENJOYS SOLID INFANTRY BRANCH SUPPORT. HE ALSO HAD THE FULL BACKING OF EX-PRESIDENT VIDELA AND FORMER ARMY COMMANDER IN CHIEF, NOW PRESIDENT ROBERTO VIOLA. SEVERAL RECENT REPORTS SHOW THERE MAY BE A RIFT COMING BETWEEN PRESIDENT VIOLA AND THE AMBITIOUS GENERAL GALTIERI. IF THE PRACTICES OF THE RECENT PAST PERSIST, GALTIERI'S PRESENT POSITION WOULD INDICATE THAT HE IS BEING GROOMED FOR THE PRESIDENCY. HIS POLITICAL VIEWS ARE GENERALLY CONSIDERED TO BE A MIRROR IMAGE OF THE OLD VIDELA/VIOLA TEAM. HE IS NOT OVERTLY POLITICAL, AND ENJOYS AN EXCELLENT MILITARY RECORD HAVING SERVED IN ALL OF THE PROPER STAFF AND COMMAND POSITIONS. GALTIERI EMERGED FROM A PACK OF SENIOR ARMY OFFICERS IN LATE 1979 FOLLOWING AN ABORTED MINI-COUP STAGED BY CORPS COMMANDER, GENERAL MENENDEZ IN SEPTEMBER 1979.

{C/NOFORN} POLITICS: LIEUTENANT GENERAL GALTIERI SUPPORTS AND IS LOYAL TO THE RULING GOVERNMENT. HIS ANTI-PERONIST STANCE LED TO HIS FORCED RESIGNATION IN 1954 BY THE GOVERNMENT OF THEN PRESIDENT JUAN PERON, BUT HE WAS REINSTATED IN SEPTEMBER 1955. IN THE MID-SEVENTIES, IT IS ALLEGED THAT HE HAD MADE CONTACT WITH PERONIST LEADERS. LIEUTENANT GENERAL GALTIERI WAS KNOWN TO BE PRO-UNITED STATES, NO DOUBT HAVING BEEN INFLUENCED BY HIS STUDENT DAYS AT THE UNITED STATES ARMY SCHOOL OF THE AMERICAS, FT. GULICK, CANAL ZONE {1949}

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AND THE UNITED STATES ARMY ENGINEER SCHOOL, FORT BELVOIR, VIRGINIA {1960-61}. AS CHIEF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LOGISTICS AND FINANCE, ARMY GENERAL STAFF {1973-74}, GALTIERI HAD AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN THE ACQUISITION OF UNITED STATES ARMS AND EQUIPMENT. UNITED STATES PERSONNEL RESPONSIBLE FOR THE MILITARY ASSISTANCE {SALES AND GRANTS} PROGRAM FOUND HIM COOPERATIVE AND HELPFUL.

{C/NOFORN} PERSONAL DATA: GALTIERI WAS BORN ON 15 JULY 1926 AT BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA. HE IS OF MEDIUM BUILD {ABOUT 6'3" OR 1.9M; 190 LBS OR 86KGS}, WITH BLUE EYES, AND BROWN HAIR. HE HAS A TALL COMMANDING PRESENCE, BUT SOMETIMES APPEARS TO STOOP. HE SUFFERED A MILD HEART ATTACK IN JULY 1973 FROM WHICH HE HAS APPARENTLY RECOVERED. GALTIERI IS A PRACTICING ROMAN CATHOLIC. HE HAS A POOR COMMAND OF THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE. A FRIENDLY AND OPEN PERSON, HE SPEAKS SLOWLY AND DELIBERATELY. HE IS MARRIED TO THE FORMER LUCIA NOEMI GENTILI. SHE IS A PRACTICING ROMAN CATHOLIC. UNFORTUNATELY GENERAL WILLIAMS WILL NOT BE ABLE TO ACCEPT THIS INVITATION, AT LEAST FOR THE TIME BEING. ON 14 APRIL HE UNDERWENT SURGERY FOR CORRECTION OF A DETACHED RETINA IN ONE EYE, AND IS NOW FACED WITH SEVERAL WEEKS OF CONVALESCENCE. NEVERTHELESS, BOTH GENERAL WILLIAMS AND I FEEL THAT HIS VISIT WOULD BE OF VALUE TO BOTH ARMIES AND HOPE THAT IT CAN BE RESCHEDULED AFTER GENERAL WILLIAMS HAS RETURNED TO DUTY. HANDLE THE THREAT FROM GALTIERI BECAUSE HE RETAINS SUPPORT IN THE ARMY AND BECAUSE THE OTHER TWO ARMED SERVICES WILL BACK HIM. HE SAID HE HAD NO PROBLEM WITH THE INVITATION TO GALTIERI TO VISIT THE U.S. AND HOPED THE ARMY CINC WOULD GO. COMMENT: I THINK THE PRESIDENT IS CORRECT IN HIS ASSESSMENT OF HOW THE POWER GROUPS LINE UP, AT LEAST FOR THE TIME BEING. HOWEVER, THE TENSION BETWEEN THE TWO GENERALS TENDS TO PARALYZE A GOVERNMENT ALREADY BURDENED BY AN EXCEEDINGLY CUMBERSOME STRUCTURE. THE RESOLUTION OF THE VIOLA-GALTIERI PROBLEM, IF AND WHEN IT COMES, WILL ALTER THE POWER RELATIONSHIPS WITHIN THE GOA AND COULD CHANGE THE STRUCTURE ITSELF. FINALLY, THE VIOLA-GALTIERI CONFLICT GOES BEYOND PERSONAL RIVALRY TO THE QUESTION OF WHETHER THE NEAR-TERM FUTURE HERE IS TO BRING FURTHER PROGRESS TOWARD POLITICAL LIBERALIZATION OR A RETREAT INTO INCREASED AUTHORITARIANISM. END SUMMARY.

3. I CALLED MAY 7 ON VIOLA AT MY REQUEST. THE APPOINTMENT WAS KEPT OFF HIS PUBLIC CALENDAR AND I WAS ABLE TO ENTER AND LEAVE THE CASA ROSADA WITHOUT RUNNING INTO THE PRESS. VIOLA BEGAN WHAT TURNED OUT TO BE ABOUT AN HOUR OF CONVERSATION BY SAYING THAT IF I AGREED WE WOULD DISCUSS THREE TOPICS. THESE HE JOTTED DOWN ON A PIECE OF PAPER IN HIS MILITARY FASHION: THE CURRENT STATE OF ARGENTINE-U.S. RELATIONS, THE DISPUTE WITH CHILE AND THE INTERNAL SITUATION. ON THE FIRST I COVERED HUMPHREY-KENNEDY (SEPTEL), THE VISIT OF ASSISTANT SECRETARY-DESIGNATE MALONE, ONGOING EFFORTS TO IMPROVE COOPERATION IN A NUMBER OF FIELDS AND SCHEDULED MILITARY VISITS. THE CHILEAN PROBLEM IS TREATED IN A SEPTEL.

4. WITH RESPECT TO THE THIRD TOPIC I ASKED VIOLA ABOUT HIS WIDELY-RUMORED CONFLICT WITH ARMY CINC. GALTIERI. THE PRESIDENT CONCEDED THAT HE HAD A PROBLEM WITH GALTIERI BUT ASSERTED THAT HE WAS NOT LOSING MUCH SLEEP OVER IT FOR THREE REASONS: HE--THE PRESIDENT--MAINTAINS A "CUOTA" OF SUPPORT IN THE ARMY, THE OTHER TWO ARMED SERVICES KNOW THAT IF

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GALTIERI WERE TO ACHIEVE HIS AMBITIONS THEY WOULD LOSE THEIR SHARE OF POWER IN THE GOVERNMENT, AND HE HAS NOT BEEN IN OFFICE LONG ENOUGH TO MAKE A MOVE TO DEPOSE HIM CREDIBLE TO THE COUNTRY AT LARGE. VIOLA SAID THAT GALTIERI DOES INDEED WANT TO BE PRESIDENT, BUT PRESIDENT WHILE AT THE SAME TIME RETAINING HIS POST AS ARMY CINC. THAT THE NAVY, THE AIR FORCE AND MANY IN THE ARMY COULD NOT PERMIT.

5. IN ANSWER TO ANOTHER QUESTION, VIOLA SAID HE DID NOT BELIEVE GALTIERI WAS ACTIVELY MOVING AGAINST HIM. GALTIERI'S DESIRE, ACCORDING TO VIOLA, IS TO GAIN THE PRESIDENCY WITHOUT APPEARING TO BE DISLOYAL TO HIS FORMER CHIEF AND WITH VIOLA'S ACQUIESCENCE. I AGREED THAT THE IDEA WAS INCREDIBLE. THE PRESIDENT THOUGHT THE CLOSING OF THE FRONTIER WAS NOT DELIBERATELY DESIGNED TO EMBARRASS HIM. RATHER IT WAS THE IMPULSIVE ACT OF THE "CAUDILLO" GALTIERI PICTURES HIMSELF TO BE-- AND, VIOLA OBSERVED, CAUDILLOS MUST BE SEEN ABOVE ALL
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C C R R E C T E D C O P Y (PARA 8)

AS READY TO DEFEND THEIR MEN. WHAT IS GOING ON, THE
PRESIDENT SAID, IS A CAMPAIGN OF SNIPING AGAINST THE
GOVERNMENT. VICLA TICKED OFF THE WELL-KNOWN COMPLAINTS
FROM THE HARDLINERS ABOUT TOO RAPID A POLITICAL
OPENING, MINISTER OF INTERIOR LIENDC'S STATEMENT
THAT THE PERONISTAS WERE VALID INTERLOCUTORS, CONTACTS
WITH LABOR LEADERS AND EXCESSIVE CRITICISM OF THE
ARMED FORCES IN THE PRESS. VICLA NOTED ACCURATELY
THAT THE POLITICAL OPENING HAS AMOUNTED TO VERY LITTLE
SO FAR, THAT LIENDC'S STATEMENT AND THE CONTACTS WITH
LABOR WERE ONLY ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS OF REALITIES FULLY
RECOGNIZED IN THE VICELA GOVERNMENT AND THAT THE CRITICISM
IN THE PRESS HAD STARTED MONTHS BEFORE HE TOOK OFFICE
AND WAS NO MORE EXCESSIVE NOW THAN THEN.

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6. VIOLA WENT ON TO SAY THAT HE HAD SURVIVED AND PROGRESSED FOR MANY YEARS WITH THE HELP OF HIS INTUITION. THAT SENSE TOLD HIM NOW THAT GALTIERI HAD OVERREACHED HIMSELF. THE PRESIDENT WAS CONFIDENT THAT HE COULD HANDLE THE PROBLEM. I SAID THAT WE HAD HEARD THERE MIGHT BE SOME DISCOMFORT OVER GENERAL MEYER'S INVITATION TO GALTIERI TO VISIT THE U.S. IN AUGUST. I SAID THERE WAS NOTHING POLITICAL INVOLVED, THAT THE INVITATION WAS A NORMAL STEP IN THE SEQUENCE VIOLA HIMSELF SET IN MOTION BY INVITING GENERAL MEYER TO VISIT ARGENTINA. THE PRESIDENT SAID HE HAD NO PROBLEM WHATSOEVER WITH THE INVITATION. ON THE CONTRARY, HE THOUGHT IT WAS AN EXCELLENT IDEA FOR GALTIERI TO GO TO THE U.S. HE REPEATED THAT STATEMENT TWICE.

7. COMMENT: I THINK VIOLA WAS REASONABLY CANDID WITH ME, ALTHOUGH HE IS PROBABLY MORE CONCERNED ABOUT HIS SITUATION THAN HE LET ON. HIS ANALYSIS OF WHERE THE CHIPS LIE STRIKES ME AS ACCURATE. FROM THE OUTSET OF THE "PROCESS" IN 1976, AND PARTICULARLY FROM 1978 ON, THE MILITARY ESTABLISHMENT AS A WHOLE ALONG WITH THEIR CIVILIAN SUPPORTERS HAS TRIED TO STRUCTURE POWER IN ARGENTINA SO AS TO PREVENT THE EMERGENCE OF A SINGLE STRONGMAN AT THE TOP. THE MEMORIES OF PERON AND URGANIA ARE STILL FRESH. NOW THAT GALTIERI IS THE THREAT AND VIOLA THE THREATENED I THINK THE LATTER CAN EXPECT STRONG SUPPORT--ALWAYS BEARING IN MIND THE BIG IF WITH RESPECT TO THE STATE OF THE ECONOMY. IF THAT IS PERCEIVED AS GOING DOWNHILL FAST, VIOLA WILL BE HARD PRESSED INDEED.

8. THE PROBLEM WITH ALL THIS, AS THE FOREIGN MINISTER OBSERVED IN A CONVERSATION WITH WIAAM ME, IS THAT THE TENSION BETWEEN THE TWO GENERALS TENDS TO PARALYZE THE GOVERNMENT. REACHING DECISIONS ON ANYTHING WITHIN THE GOA SEEMS TO GET PROGRESSIVELY MORE DIFFICULT. IN PART, THAT SITUATION ALSO RESULTS FROM THE CUMBERSOME STRUCTURE OF THE GOVERNMENT. THE RESOLUTION OF THE PROBLEM BETWEEN VIOLA ON GALTIERI, IF AND WHEN IT COMES, SHOULD ALSO BRING AT LEAST AN ADJUSTMENT IN THE POWER

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RELATIONSHIPS. WE CAN HOPE THAT IT WILL TAKE THE
FORM OF A RETURN TO THE ORIGINAL CONCEPT OF A PRESIDENT
WHO GOVERNS WITH A JUNTA THAT PROVIDES ONLY GENERAL
GUIDELINES. FINALLY, IT IS WORTH NOTING THAT THE
TROUBLE BETWEEN GALTIERI AND VICLA IS ABOUT MORE THAN

1. C - ENTIRE TEXT.

2. DURING TWO DAYS OF TALKS WITH ARGENTINE GOVERNMENT LEADERS, MARCH 24-25, AMBASSADOR SMITH DISCUSSED A WIDE RANGE OF ISSUES, INCLUDING HUMAN RIGHTS, NUCLEAR PROBLEMS, SOUTHWEST ASIA, ARGENTINE-SOVIET RELATIONS, THE US GRAINS EMBARGO, THE SUMMER OLYMPIC GAMES, CENTRAL AMERICA, AND US-ARGENTINE MILITARY RELATIONS. SMITH MET WITH PRESIDENT VIDELA, FOREIGN MINISTER PASTOR, MINISTER OF ECONOMY MARTINEZ DE HOZ, AND THE PRESIDENT OF THE ARGENTINE NUCLEAR ENERGY AGENCY ADMIRAL CASTRO MADERO. DURING HIS REMAINING DAY IN BUENOS AIRES, MARCH 26, HE WILL MEET WITH COMMANDER-IN-CHIEF OF THE ARGENTINE ARMY, GENERAL GALTIERI, AND OTHER MAJOR FIGURES OF THE ARGENTINE ARMED

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FORCES, AND WITH LEADERS OF THE ARGENTINE HUMAN RIGHTS MOVEMENT. WE BELIEVE VISIT HAS BEEN SUCCESSFUL IN STRENGTHENING RELATIONS AND PROMOTING US OBJECTIVES, AND THUS BROADENING THE DIALOGUE BEGUN BY THE GOODPASTER MISSION. FOLLOWING IS A RESUME OF THE MAJOR POINTS COVERED IN THE TALKS.

3. HUMAN RIGHTS: SMITH STRESSED THE IMPORTANCE OF HUMAN RIGHTS. HE SAID WE RECOGNIZED THERE HAD BEEN CONSIDERABLE IMPROVEMENT. IT WOULD BE HELPFUL FOR US TO KNOW WHAT LAY AHEAD.

4. THE ARGENTINES SAID IMPROVEMENTS WOULD CONTINUE. THE CITED:

-- DISAPPEARANCES HAD CEASED AND WERE A THING OF THE PAST;

-- ABOUT HALF OF THE REMAINING PEN PRISONERS WOULD BE RELEASED OR PROCESSED THIS YEAR;

-- THEY WERE BEGINNING A POLITICAL DIALOGUE WITH PERSONALITIES OF THE CIVILIAN SECTORS.

-- THEY STRESSED THEIR DESIRE TO RETURN TO ARGENTINA'S DEMOCRATIC TRADITION BUT THEIR INTENTION TO DO SO WITHOUT REPEATING THE PATTERN OF CHRONIC INSTABILITY OF THE PAST.

ON THE OTHER HAND, THEY HELD OUT LITTLE ENCOURAGEMENT OF MORE RAPID PROGRESS ON THE RIGHT-OF-OPTIONS CASES. THEY GAVE NO EXPLANATION ABOUT THE FATE OF THE SIX COMMUNICATING DISAPPEARED (SEIZED LAST AUGUST) WHO RECENTLY CEASED CONTACT WITH THEIR FAMILIES. FINALLY, THEY GAVE NO TIMETABLE FOR MOVING BACK TOWARD A DEMOCRATIC SYSTEM; INSTEAD THEY STRESSED THAT THE NEW POLITICAL ORDER WOULD HAVE TO PROVIDE A STABLE, WORKABLE SYSTEM.

5. JS-ARGENTINE DIFFERENCES AT THE UNHRC. UNDER SECRETARY CAVANDOLI SAID SOLE OPPOSITION TO A RESOLU-

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TION ON THE ARGENTINE ITEM (ITEM 12.B), ACCEPTABLE TO ARGENTINA, HAD COME FROM THE US DELEGATION. AT ONE POINT THE US DELEGATION HAD EVEN CONSULTED MEMBERS OF THE CUBAN DELEGATION. SMITH SAID WE HAD ABIDED BY THE LETTER OF OUR COMMITMENT. ARGENTINA HAD CLOSELY COOPERATED WITH THE SOVIET UNION, PROVIDING HELP TO THE SOVIETS ON A RESOLUTION CONCERNING SAKHAROV. WE WOULD CONTINUE TO SEEK MORE EFFECTIVE INTERNATIONAL MACHINERY.

6. NUCLEAR ISSUES: SMITH COVERED THE FOLLOWING POINTS:

-- TLAELDLCO: THERE WAS NO ENCOURAGEMENT THAT ARGENTINA WILL RATIFY ANYTIME SOON; ON FULL SCOPE SAFEGUARDS WE AGREED TO DISAGREE.

-- BILATERAL COOPERATION: ARGENTINA MAY BE INTERESTED IN MAINTAINING THE PRESENT LEVEL OF COOPERATION (I.E. HEU FUEL FOR THE RESEARCH REACTORS) IF US IS WILLING TO CONTINUE ON THE BASIS OF SAFEGUARD ASSURANCES AS RECENTLY PROPOSED BY THE US.

--THE PROLIFERATION RISK. THEY ARE GENUINELY CONCERNED OVER THIS AND INTERESTED IN MAINTAINING A DIALOGUE ABOUT POLITICAL SOLUTIONS.

7. SMITH SAID WE WELCOMED ARGENTINE-BRAZILIAN COOPERATION. CASTRO MADERO SUGGESTED THAT ARGENTINA WOULD, AS PART OF THEIR ARRANGEMENTS, LET THE BRAZILIANS SEE THEIR PLANTS; THE TWO COUNTRIES THUS MAY BE MOVING TOWARD MUTUAL INSPECTION. CASTRO MADERO, LOOKING A LONG WAY AHEAD, SPECULATED THAT THE ARGENTINE- BRAZILIAN COOPERATION MIGHT ULTIMATELY LEAD TO A LATIN AMERICAN "EURATOM," ALTHOUGH THE PROPRIETARY CONCERNS AND JEALOUSIES OF THE VARIOUS COUNTRIES PRECLUDED SUCH AN ARRANGEMENT IN THE NEAR TERM. THE ARGENTINE LEADERS STRESSED THE POLITICAL DIFFERENCES BETWEEN THE INDIAN SUB-CONTINENT AND LATIN AMERICA, GIVEN THE ABSENCE OF DEEP-ROOTED HOSTILITY AMONG THE NATIONS IN SOUTH AMERICA

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8. SOUTHWEST ASIA. AMBASSADOR SMITH STRESSED THE PRESIDENT'S DETERMINATION TO STAY THE COURSE, AND THE STRENGTH OF US PUBLIC SENTIMENT IN SUPPORT OF HIS POLICIES. HE REVIEWED THE DIFFICULTIES THE SOVIETS HAD ENCOUNTERED IN THEIR OPERATIONS IN AFGHANISTAN, THE PROSPECTIVE SPRING OPERATIONS, THE DANGER OF CROSS-BORDER OPERATIONS INTO AFGHANISTAN, AND OUR EFFORTS TO ENHANCE THE SECURITY OF PAKISTAN AND THE REGION. SMITH STRESSED THAT OUR COMMITMENT WAS ONLY ONE ELEMENT IN THE WEB OF RELATIONS SUPPORTING PAKISTAN'S SECURITY. THE SOVIETS HAD MADE A SUBSTANTIAL COMMITMENT IN AFGHANISTAN AND, BY ALL THE EVIDENCE, WERE PREPARING FOR A LONG STAY. SMITH NOTED THAT WE WERE WILLING TO CONSIDER NEUTRALIZATION BUT ONLY UPON THE WITHDRAWAL OF SOVIET FORCES.

9. GRAINS EMBARGO. SMITH SAID THE PRESIDENT WAS DETERMINED TO MAKE THE MEASURE WORK. WE APPRECIATED

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ARGENTINE COOPERATION. THE PRESIDENT WAS DETERMINED TO CHOP OFF THE LEAKS. MARTINEZ DE HOZ SAID HE HAD KEPT HIS WORD. HE HAD TOLD GENERAL GOODPASTER HE WAS WILLING TO WORK OUT A CONFIDENTIAL ARRANGEMENT WITH THE SOVIETS THAT WOULD REQUIRE THEM TO LIMIT THEIR PURCHASES. THE FREE MARKET WAS A PILLAR OF THE GOVERNMENT'S ECONOMIC PROGRAM. HE HAD WORKED YEARS TO DISMANTLE THE CONTROLS OF THE PERON PERIOD; HE COULD NOT GO BACK AND REIMPOSE EXPORT CONTROLS. A DISPROPORTIONATE SHARE OF THE BURDEN WAS PLACED ON ARGENTINA; CANADA AND AUSTRALIA HAD NO CORN AND SORGHUM. A TEST HAD BEEN THE PROPOSED MEAT EMBARGO; AUSTRALIA AND THE COMMON MARKET HAD REFUSED TO GO ALONG.

10. MARTINEZ DE HOZ STRESSED THAT THE SEVERE DROUGHT HAD LARGELY SOLVED THE PROBLEM. ARGENTINA DOES NOT HAVE SUBSTANTIAL AMOUNTS OF EXPORTABLE GRAIN IN EXCESS OF THE INFORMAL LIMITS. HE EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE LOSS OF TRADITIONAL MARKETS, SUCH AS JAPAN FOR SORGHUM, AND SPAIN AND ITALY FOR CORN; US EXPORTS WERE UNDERSELLING ARGENTINE GRAIN, A POINT HE HAD RAISED WITH GENERAL GOODPASTER. OFFICIAL SOVIET PURCHASES OF CORN WERE AT THIS TIME ONLY HALF THE UNOFFICIAL LIMIT.

11. SUMMER OLYMPIC GAMES. AMBASSADOR SMITH PRESSED THE IMPORTANCE OF THIS MEASURE. ARGENTINA HAD A CRITICAL ROLE IN SWAYING OTHER LATIN COUNTRIES. THE ARGENTINES EXPRESSED DOUBT WHETHER MOST OF THE EUROPEANS WOULD COME ALONG AND BE ABLE TO CONTROL THEIR OLYMPIC COMMITTEES. SMITH SAID WE EXPECTED ALMOST ALL THE EUROPEANS WOULD EVENTUALLY WITHDRAW. WE WOULD KEEP ARGENTINA INFORMED ON DEVELOPMENTS.

12. TRADE RELATIONS. MARTINEZ DE HOZ EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE SIZE OF ARGENTINA'S TRADE DEFICIT WITH THE US. IN THE PAST, A MUCH SMALLER DEFICIT HAD BEEN FINANCED BY A SURPLUS WITH WESTERN EUROPE. THIS SURPLUS WAS BEING REDUCED BY COMMON MARKET POLICIES. ARGENTINA WAS DIVERSIFYING ITS EXPORTS TO COMPENSATE FOR THIS.

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THE MAIN GROWTH FOR AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS, HOWEVER, WAS WITH THE SOVIET UNION AND EASTERN EUROPE; THE SOVIET UNION HAD BEEN ARGENTINA'S LARGEST EXPORT MARKET LAST YEAR. SMITH INFORMED THE MINISTER OF OUR DECISIONS ON LEATHER APPAREL, CORNED BEEF AND SUGAR.

13. CENTRAL AMERICA. FOREIGN MINISTER PASTOR EXPRESSED PESSIMISM ABOUT THE SITUATION IN NICARAGUA AND EL SALVADOR. THE THEORY HAD BEEN TO HELP NICARAGUA AND THROUGH MODERATE ELEMENTS. MEANWHILE, CUBAN INFLUENCE AND PRESENCE WERE GROWING. MR. RUSER SAID, THAT, WHILE WE RECOGNIZED THE DANGER, IN OUR VIEW, THE SITUATION WAS STILL FLUID. THE SANDINISTA GOVERNMENT ENJOYED WIDE-SPREAD SUPPORT EVEN WHILE CRITICISM OF ITS PERFORMANCE AND ECONOMIC POLICIES WERE GROWING. THERE WAS DANGER THAT GROWING ECONOMIC DIFFICULTIES MIGHT PUSH THE GOVERNMENT TOWARD CUBA AND AN INCREASINGLY STATE CONTROLLED ECONOMY. LARGE AMOUNTS OF OUTSIDE ASSISTANCE WERE NEEDED TO SUPPORT THE PRIVATE SECTOR.

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14. CUBA, MR. RUSER SAID, HAD BEEN ENCOURAGED BY THE SUCCESS OF THE SANDINISTAS AND THE LEFTIST COUP IN GRENADA, WHICH THEY HOPED TO TURN INTO A SHOWCASE FOR CUBAN AID. NICARAGUA HAD PROVIDED NEW ENCOURAGEMENT FOR THE CUBAN THESIS, DEEMPHASIZED DURING THE '70'S, THAT NON-DOCTRINAIRE REVOLUTIONARY GROUPS WERE A MORE EFFECTIVE MEANS FOR PROMOTING RAPID POLITICAL CHANGE THAN ORTHODOX COMMUNIST PARTIES. CUBA WAS PROVIDING LIMITED SUPPORT TO GUERRILLA GROUPS IN EL SALVADOR AND GUATEMALA THROUGH HONDURAS; IF THEIR PROSPECTS IMPROVE, CUBA UNDOUBTEDLY WOULD UPGRADE ITS EFFORTS. AS REGARDS EL SALVADOR, WE WERE ENCOURAGED BY WHAT THE JUNTA HAD DONE; THE REFORM MEASURES WERE OFF TO A GOOD START. A COUP FROM THE RIGHT WOULD BE NO HELP. IN OUR VIEW, ARGENTINA COULD BE HELPFUL WITH ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE. PERHAPS THE GOA COULD SEND SOMEONE TO LOOK INTO POSSIBILITIES. PASTOR SAID A RECENT MEETING OF ARGENTINE AMBASSADORS HAD CONCLUDED THAT ARGENTINA SHOULD CONCENTRATE ITS ASSISTANCE ON GUATEMALA AND HONDURAS. HE HAD DOUBTS ABOUT THE

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US STRATEGY IN EL SALVADOR AND NICARAGUA. RUSER SAID, IN OUR VIEW, WHILE THE GUATEMALAN ECONOMY IS RELATIVELY STRONG, REFORMS ARE MOVING TOO SLOW AND THE POLITICAL PROCESS IS NOT WORKING. ALSO, WE WERE CONCERNED OVER THE HIGH LEVEL OF VIOLENCE. FRIENDLY GOVERNMENTS SHOULD URGE THE GOG TO TAKE MEASURES.

15. PASTOR SAID ARGENTINA WOULD BE PROVIDING SOME AID IN THE CARIBBEAN, AND HE MENTIONED THE IDEA OF INTER ISLAND SHIP SERVICE AT THE ISLANDS. RUSER SAID THAT DEMOCRATIC INSTITUTIONS IN THE CARIBBEAN, A LEGACY OF THE METROPOLITAN POWERS, WERE ENDANGERED BY ECONOMIC DETERIORATION. OUR STRATEGY WAS TO PROVIDE AID, BOTH BILATERALLY AND THROUGH THE CARIBBEAN DEVELOPMENT GROUP. WE WERE WORKING ALONG PARALLEL LINES.

16. US-ARGENTINE MILITARY RELATIONS. SMITH SAID IT STILL IS OUR POLICY TO IMPROVE RELATIONS. GENERAL GOODPASTER HAD REFERRED TO THE POSSIBILITY OF HIGH-
✓ LEVEL MILITARY VISITS. IF ARGENTINA WAS INTERESTED, WE WOULD BE PREPARED TO RECEIVE A SENIOR ARGENTINE MILITARY OFFICER SOMETIME LATER THIS YEAR; THIS, OF COURSE, WOULD DEPEND ON EVENTS MOVING FAVORABLY. PASTOR SAID THE SUGGESTIONS WAS INTERESTING AND ENCOURAGING.

17. PASTOR SAID IT WAS IMPORTANT TO REVIEW ALL ASPECTS OF THE EMBARGO ON EQUIPMENT AND TRAINING AND TO REESTABLISH A RELIABLE SUPPLY RELATIONSHIP. DOUBTS ABOUT JS RELIABILITY WOULD SPILL OVER INTO THE CIVILIAN SECTOR WITH RESPECT TO LARGE PROJECTS SUCH AS YACYRETA FOR WHICH US COMPANIES WISHED TO SELL EQUIPMENT. THE
✓ PROHIBITION AGAINST MILITARY PURCHASES HAD BUILT UP HOSTILITY AGAINST THE US. SMITH SAID WE WERE PLEASED TO SEE ARGENTINA'S CONTINUED PARTICIPATION IN UNITAS, AND APPRECIATE ARGENTINE SUPPORT FOR THE EXERCISE. ON HUMPHREY-KENNEDY WE WOULD NOT BE ENCOURAGING; THIS DEPENDED ON CONTINUING IMPROVEMENT OF ARGENTINA'S IMAGE IN WASHINGTON.

SUBJECT: CSA's Desire to Invite GEN Galtieri, Argentine Army CINC (U)

1. (S) Immediately following GEN Goodpaster's visit to Argentina, there was a meeting between then Secretary of State Vance and Dr. Brzezinski at which it was agreed that as a measure to improve US-GOA relations, GEN Galtieri, CINC Argentine Army, should be invited to visit United States. In response, State directed ASD/ISA, on expedited basis, to have Army issue necessary invitation. Accordingly, CSA's calendar was rearranged to accommodate June visit. Then State unexpectedly refused to release DA msg extending invitation. Instead, word came back that Galtieri was unacceptable because he is member of Junta, but that State would approve invitation being extended after Aug 80 timeframe to MG Vaquero, C/S Argentine Army.
2. (S) GEN Meyer disagrees with State and believes that if we truly want to improve relations with Argentina, we must invite GEN Galtieri and not GEN Vaquero (a second-stringer). The fact that GEN Galtieri is a military professional and a member of the ruling Junta should mitigate in favor of inviting him instead of vice versa. As was evidenced by the Goodpaster visit, US-Argentine military connection can have positive spinoff effects in other national interest areas. In this regard, CSA is prepared to address matter with Chairman, Dr. Brzezinski, or SECSTATE if necessary.
3. (U) Since the purpose of today's PRC meeting is to examine state of Soviet-GOA relations as well as steps US can take to improve US-GOA relations (to include military initiatives), it would be most appropriate if GEN Meyer's concerns can be aired. As recent intelligence reports indicate, the Argentine Army, through its dominating influence over Argentine government, has successfully opposed numerous Soviet overtures and was determining factor in recent Argentine decision to boycott this summer's Moscow olympics. What better way to capitalize on this influence than by having CSA extend invitation to CINC Argentine Army to visit the United States.

SUBJECT: Invitation to Argentine General to Visit the United States

(C) We have been trying for more than two years to get State Department approval to invite a senior officer from Argentina to the United States. Only recently have we been successful. The timing of the visit and the person to be invited has, for political reasons, been a subject of considerable discussion with State.

(C) As you know, we wanted to have the Argentine Army Commander in Chief, General Galtieri, invited up in June but, because he is also a Junta member, his visit might create unwanted problems for us. It was subsequently decided to invite the second-in-command General Vaquero and to move the visit to August, the proposed time of the Venezuelan Chief's visit. I understand the invitation has not gone out to the Venezuelan as yet, therefore, I ask that the Army exchange the dates of these two officers' visits--General Vaquero in August and the Venezuelan Chief in June.

(C) We would like to send an informal invitation to General Vaquero as soon as possible followed by a formal invitation in the mid-May time frame. I appreciate your support and understanding for our efforts to revitalize our military ties with Argentina.

1. (U) PURPOSE. To obtain VCSA approval for extending invitation to Chief of Staff, Argentine Army for Jun 80 visit.

2. (C) DISCUSSION.

a. As result of US embargo on additional grain sales to Soviet Union, Argentina, a large grain exporter, is receiving renewed attention from State. GEN Goodpaster went to Argentina in January to request that country not sell additional grain to Soviet Union.

b. ~~As follow from Goodpaster visit and subsequent meeting between Vance and Brzezinski, DOD was told to invite LTC Galtieri, Commander, Argentine Army, to visit US. Accordingly, ASD/ISA requested that CSA invite Galtieri at earliest possible occasion. Since CSA sponsored visit for Jun (De La Fuente from Mexico) had been killed in helicopter crash, Galtieri visit was proposed to fill vacancy.~~

c. In early March, standard feasibility message to US Embassy Argentina on Galtieri visit was staffed through ASD/ISA for release. ASD/ISA, in turn, requested clearance from State.

d. On 21 Mar 80, State indicated to ASD/ISA that Galtieri should not be invited because he is also member of ruling junta. Instead, State requested that MG Vaquero be invited.

e. From national security standpoint, it's important that good relations exist between strategically located Argentina and US. For this reason, it is important to reestablish closer ties with Argentine military. Consequently, visit by MG Vaquero is favored.

f. Because Vaquero is number 2 man in Argentine Army, it would be inappropriate from protocol standpoint for CSA to invite him. It would be appropriate, however, for VCSA to extend invitation.

1. (S) Per your written remarks of 13 May (Tab A) LTC Caristo discussed your desires with DAMO-SSM. Since a PRC meeting was already scheduled for today to counter increased Soviet-Argentine relations while initiatives are developed to improve US-Argentine relations, DAMO-SSM believed that said meeting would be excellent time and place to surface your desires to invite Galtieri.
2. (S) Accordingly, memorandum at Tab B was prepared this AM by DAMO-SSM and provided to J-5 action officer responsible for PRC meeting. He in turn provided it to LTG Pustay who attended PRC and who made argument that Galtieri should be invited. Indications are that LTG Pustay's comments were well received by all PRC attendees and that DEPSECSTATE indicated that he would restudy issue.
3. (U) Although you've indicated that you want letter on subject sent to National Security Advisor and SECSTATE, I believe in light of comments made at this morning's PRC meeting, that a telephone call from you to Warren Christopher would be more appropriate, rationale being it takes advantage of momentum already developed on issue and reinforces LTG Pustay's comments.

1. (S) PURPOSE: To respond to CSA's handwritten comment of 13 May 80 concerning invitation for LTG Galtieri. (Tab A)

2. (S) DISCUSSION:

a. (S) In response to your desires, ODCSOPS had Joint Staff (LTG Pustay) enter Galtieri invitation as appropriate invitation for 14 May Policy Review Committee (PRC) meeting that met to develop methods of improving US-Argentine relations. Feedback from that meeting indicated a general acceptance for extending an invitation, with DEPSECSTATE Christopher recommending that US Ambassador to Argentina be queried on issue.

b. (S) 15 May message from Amb Castro at Tab B recommends against extending invitation in near future because of pending Argentine national elections.

c. (S) As follow-on to 14 May PRC, an interagency group meeting was conducted on 29 May at which time RADM Lyons, Deputy Director for Politico-Military Affairs, J-5, OJCS, again surfaced Galtieri visit as means of improving US-Argentine relations. As result it was agreed that high-level military visit, one each way (no names or dates at this time), was desirable for this CY. It was also agreed that based on Deputy Assistant Secretary Bowdler's July visit to Argentina, decision would be made on whether or not to invite LTG Galtieri.

d. (S) Galtieri visit has been appropriately addressed at interagency arena. Joint Staff and ASD/ISA have supported position that Galtieri should be invited. State, based on Ambassador Castro's message, is reluctant to approve. Bowdler visit to Argentina in July should clarify issue. Any further action by ARSTAF at this time would be fruitless. Latter part July appears to be best time to resurface.

1. IS - ENTIRE TEXT

2. I UNDERSTAND THAT THE DEPARTMENT HAS APPROVED IN PRINCIPLE THE CONCEPT OF A VISIT TO THE UNITED STATES OF A HIGH-RANKING ARGENTINE MILITARY OFFICER WITH TENTATIVE TIMING OF A JUNE INVITATION FOR A SEPTEMBER VISIT. IN RESPONSE TO AN ARA REQUEST FOR COMMENTS ON THIS PROPOSAL, I HAVE THE FOLLOWING TO OFFER.

3. TIMING. PROSPECT OF SUCH AN INVITATION HAS BEEN RAISED WITH GOA THREE TIMES THAT I AM AWARE OF. ONCE WITH FORMIN BY AMBASSADOR SMITH, WHEN THERE WAS NO REACTION THAT I COULD SEE. I HAVE RAISED IT WITH GENERAL GALTIERI AND WITH GENERAL VIOLA IN VERY INFORMAL TERMS. BOTH OF THEM RESPONDED WITHOUT MUCH ENTHUSIASM, AND BOTH SAID THE TIMING WAS NOT RIGHT. GALTIERI, ABOUT A MONTH AGO TOLD ME WE OUGHT TO PUT THE IDEA ON THE BACK BURNER, AND VIOLA SAID IT WOULD NOT BE TIMELY UNTIL AFTER SEPTEMBER, MEANING AFTER THE DECISION ON PRESIDENTIAL SUCCESSION.

4. GOA PERCEPTIONS OF AN INVITATION. UNCERTAINTY ON PART OF THESE ARGENTINE LEADERS IS BECAUSE THEY DON'T SEE A VISIT AS AN UNMIXED BLESSING. WHILE VISIT CONFERS EXTERNAL RESPECTABILITY ON GOA AND ESPECIALLY ARMED FORCES, AND WILL BE HEAVILY PLAYED THAT WAY ABROAD, DOMESTICALLY THERE WILL ALSO BE HINTS THAT THE INVITEE IS SOMEHOW GOING TO WASHINGTON TO GET HIS ORDERS. THIS KIND OF THING HAPPENED WHEN VIDELA WENT TO WASHINGTON TO ATTEND THE SIGNING OF THE PANAMA CANAL TREATY, AND AGAIN THE OTHER DAY WHEN THE GOA WENT TO LENGTHS TO DISASSOCIATE MARTINEZ DE HOZ MEETINGS IN WASHINGTON FROM GOA ANNOUNCEMENT THEY WERE NOT GOING TO THE OLYMPICS. FURTHERMORE THEY ARE PROBABLY WONDERING IF RESPECTABILITY CONFERRED BY THE INVITATION EXTENDS TO RELIEF FROM NEGATIVE LOAN VOICES IN IFI'S AND HUMPHREY-KENNEDY AMENDMENT. THEY WOULD PROBABLY BE SKEPTICAL ABOUT VALUE OF AN INVITATION IF IT IS NOT ASSOCIATED WITH SOME SUBSTANTIVE CHANGE SHOWING RELATIONS ARE IMPROVING.

5. FROM MY PERSPECTIVE THE BENEFITS OF AN INVITATION ARE NOT GOING TO BE SIGNIFICANT UNTIL THE ARGENTINE LEADERS SHOW MORE ENTHUSIASM. I WILL BE GLAD TO DISCUSS THIS FURTHER DURING MY CONSULTATION NEXT WEEK.

AFTER THE EXHIBITION, THE "STATELINERS" INVITED GENERAL GALTIERI, HIS WIFE, AND PARTY TO PARTICIPATE IN BOTH SQUARE AND ROUND DANCING. THEY BOTH DID SO WITH GREAT ENTHUSIASM AND ENJOYMENT. HE DEMONSTRATED FIRING A GROUND TOW SYSTEM AS WELL AS A DRAGON. HE DID NOT SHOOT LIVE MISSILES.

9. MRS. GALTIERI SPENT THE DAY WITH MY WIFE VISITING ARMY COMMUNITY SERVICES, CHILDREN'S WORLD, THE COMMUNITY LIFE CENTER, THE MUSEUM, AND THE POST EXCHANGE. HE INDICATED THAT HE THOUGHT IT WOULD BE DESIRABLE TO FORM AN AIR ASSAULT BRIGADE IN THE ARGENTINE ARMY. HE ALSO INDICATED THAT HE WAS SERIOUSLY CONSIDERING EXPANDING HIS EXCHANGE PROGRAM TO INCLUDE THE 101ST ABN DIV (AASLT). FACTS.

1. Tri-service test range in the Patagonia. A 20 kilometer by 50 kilometer range has been proposed in the Golfo de San Matias area (4130S 6415W).

2. The Minister of Defense is in charge of the project and the Argentine Air Force seemed to be the prevailing contender with a French based company.

3. It was brought to Lieutenant General Galtieri's attention that a US company (Test and Evaluation International) was not being given a "fair chance" to compete for the contract.

REPORT — *LESS ENCLOSURES*

The background of negotiations carried out before the Research and Development Directorate (Ministry of Defense) and the Ministry of Defense.

Because of the research and analysis which this important project implies, on several occasions the Ministry of Defense (DGID) has sent delegations to Europe where in France, England, Austria and Italy they have been discussing the basic plans for the reported project. Under such conditions, U.S. firms made identical proposals to the DIGID in which they offered the Investigation Commission the possibility of visiting bases and research institutions under a plan which is attached to Enclosure Number 1. (The invitation was made verbally during the last week of September and was officially extended in a letter dated 24 December 1980. See Enclosure Number 6.) The Director did not approve the visit to the U.S. since the offer was made upon the departure of the commission. Nevertheless, the Commission began the trip 42 days after receiving said invitation. The Director assured our firms that the results of the trip to Europe would be made available so that everyone involved would have the same information. The Commission returned from Europe on the ____ and it has not been possible to obtain any information, in spite of that stated in the letter dated 5 November (see Enclosure 4). Finally, so that the invitation of our firms might be received by the Director General of DIGID, it was necessary to appeal to the Minister of Defense, since the Director General systematically refused to meet with us until the Commission

had left for its trip to Europe. Attached is a photocopy of the letter sent to the Minister of Defense (Enclosure 3).

Given the course which has been followed until the now frustrated attempt of U.S. participation in this important project of our Armed Forces, we believe that the time has come to inform the Commander in Chief of the surprising and unclear attitude of the General Directorate of DIGID in:

--Withholding from us vital information for the tendering of an offer equal in conditions to those of European firms.

--Denying us the possibility that commissions from our Armed Forces may inspect U.S. military bases.

--Denying us the possibility that the same inspection may be carried out at private enterprises, which are capable of providing the required material, and at the respective research institutions.

--Denying the Commission that traveled to Europe for more than 60 days, on two occasions, to undertake the same type of trip to the U.S., (upon returning from some of their trips), and to undertake the same studies as they did in France, England, Austria and Italy; (Enclosure 4).

--To authorize, on the other hand, the visit to countries having limited supplies of the material required.

--To refuse, hold up, and delay the request for meetings, for the purpose of finding out the existing and non-stated reasons which prevent U.S. participation in said project, finally revealing to us that:

-The tendering U.S. firms were (virtually) unknown in the specific area required. We only added to this false imputation that the firms working in this particular area are the ones responsible for the NATO projects in this (same) field, for U.S. bases built for these purposes and that, for the same purposes as required by Argentina,

they are presently carrying out a similar project sponsored by the U.S. in Ryad, the capital of Saudia Arabia.

Faced with the impossibility of relying on DIGID requirements for establishing the initial bases of the project, Intec Mark Corporation and Test & Evaluation International, Inc. made a theoretical technical approach study using as a base available elements from the NATO project. Said report was divided into two chapters: that corresponding to the Master Plan concept and to the National Range Center. Both documents were presented to the DIGID Director on 26 March 1981. As on other occasions, there was no response. See Enclosure 5.

Comparably, past evidence has permitted us to establish that fortuitous misunderstandings brought about by the Ministry of Defense have not existed since:

--European firms, in accord with the DIGID, have drawn up the bases of said project. Their studies have already been presented and are now at DIGID offices for consideration.

--European firms have already submitted bids to the DIGID, which means that they have evaluated technical specifications provided, in their entirety, by that General Directorate.

--European firms have received study and analysis bases which were denied our firms.

--The DIGID is currently working with study and research data obtained on successive visits made to Europe, with which it is not very difficult to envisage the type of technical requirements which will be needed in order to respond to the demand which the DIGID will impose in the final comparison.

Finally, on 28 April 1981, we were received by the General Director to present a new proposal, listed in Enclosure Number 1, which is discussed below. However, the results of said meeting, the arguments used and the positions maintained are irrelevant, doubtful, lacking in conceptual clarity, ignorant of Argentine political conditions as well as of the conventions of our Armed Forces, presenting fears of possible inter-service jealousy (rivalry), and caution due to the lack of definition on the part of our own Forces. Here, we have put in writing the results of the negotiations, the verification of which is now in the hands of appropriate authorities. As we stated in the above paragraph, at this time we only present the nature of our presentation which took place on 28 April 1981, with photocopies attached. Given the absolute lack of the possibility of the U.S. offer being considered by the DIGID, on 3 April 1981 I traveled to Washington, suggesting that the U.S. military-contractor group make its presentation to officials at the Argentine Military Mission accredited to Washington, with the purpose of outlining the scope and nature of our offer. According to that which has already been agreed upon with the Argentine Military Attache, General Mallea Gil, on 8 May at 1500 hours, the military-contractor group, headed by Major General Patrick W. Powers, President of Test & Evaluation International, Inc., will meet with General Mallea Gil and Admiral Bonino, Defense Attache, in order to discuss the referenced offer, to outline it to him in detail, and to ask that the same be brought to the attention of respective officials in our Ministry of Defense.

1. (U) PURPOSE. To propose message from CSA to US Ambassador, Argentina, which outlines initiatives discussed on recent visit by CSA and solicits Ambassador's advice on followup actions related to proposals.

2. (C) DISCUSSION.

a. As result of recent USG decision to improve relations with Argentina, CSA visited that country from 5-9 Apr 81. Prior to visit, Interagency Group, State, and OASD/ISA approved following military-to-military initiatives for CSA to propose during visit:

- (1) Invitation for GEN Galtieri to visit United States in Aug 81.
- (2) Security consultations between US and Argentine military (Tab B).
- (3) Exchange visit by 10-12 Argentine officers and NCOs (Tab C).
- (4) Offer to provide technical assistance for Argentine Army land reclamation project (Tab D).
- (5) Invitation for Argentine Guest Instructor at US Army School of Americas (Tab E).

b. In addition to above initiatives, CSA and CINC, Argentine Army, discussed following two initiatives which are currently being studied by ARSTAF.

(1) Exchange of officers under PEP auspices. Letter will be sent this week from ARSTAF to OASD/ISA requesting DOD and State approval to initiate PEP programs with both Argentina and Chile. Indications are State will approve.

(2) US Army guest lecturer at Argentine Military Academy. ARSTAF is studying and will submit proposal to CSA by 27 Apr 81.

c. In 11 Apr 81 message to US Ambassador, Argentina (Tab F), CSA indicated proposed actions on US-Argentine initiatives would be provided for comment; message at Tab A responds to that requirement.

{2} US-ARGENTINE SECURITY CONSULTATIONS. THESE PERIODIC DISCUSSIONS OF APPROXIMATELY 3 DAYS IN LENGTH BETWEEN JOINT STAFF AND SERVICE REPRESENTATIVES FROM U.S. AND ARGENTINA WILL FOCUS ON EXCHANGE OF IDEAS AND INTELLIGENCE ON KEY HEMISPHERIC AND GLOBAL

DEFENSE ISSUES. INITIAL TALKS (WHICH WOULD BE SIMILAR TO THE BRAZILIAN CONSULTATIVE SERIES) ARE PROPOSED FOR WASHINGTON THIS FALL.

FOLLOWUP ACTION: JOINT STAFF WILL DETERMINE APPROPRIATE DATE AND CHAIRMAN. JCS, GEN DAVID JONES, WILL SEND LETTER WITHIN 30 TO 60 DAYS TO CHIEF OF THE ARGENTINE JOINT GENERAL STAFF, INVITING ARGENTINE MILITARY TO SEND REPRESENTATIVES TO SUBJECT TALKS.

{3} EXCHANGE VISIT. THIS INITIATIVE ENTAILS 2 WEEK VISIT BY 10-12 ARGENTINE ARMY OFFICERS AND NCOS TO US ARMY DIVISION.

ARGENTINES WOULD INTERFACE WITH COUNTERPARTS IN US ARMY DIVISION AND OBSERVE/PARTICIPATE IN NORMALLY PLANNED ACTIVITIES OF THAT UNIT. FOLLOW-ON RECIPROCAL VISIT WOULD BE CONDUCTED AT LATER DATE BY LIKE NUMBER OF US ARMY PERSONNEL FOR LIKE PERIOD OF TIME.

FOLLOWUP ACTION: ARGENTINE ARMY SHOULD INITIATE BY SENDING LETTER/MESSAGE, EITHER FROM THEIR ATTACHE TO U.S. ARMY DIRECTOR OF FOREIGN LIAISON OR BY NOTIFYING OUR ARMY ATTACHE IN BUENOS AIRES OF DATES AND UNIT THEY WOULD LIKE TO VISIT. WE WILL TAKE BALL FROM THAT POINT.

{4} LAND RECLAMATION PROJECT. IN APR 79, ARGENTINE ARMY REQUESTED US ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEER ASSISTANCE IN FORMULATING PRELIMINARY

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STUDY/PLAN TO RECLAIM 10.5 MILLION HECTARES OF SWAMPLAND. BECAUSE OF HUMAN RIGHTS SITUATION AT THE TIME, STATE TURNED DOWN REQUEST. IF ARGENTINES STILL NEED ASSISTANCE, U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS ARE PREPARED TO ASSIST WITH SURVEY TEAM OR ACCOMMODATE VISIT BY ARGENTINE ENGINEERS TO SIMILAR PROJECTS IN U.S.

FOLLOWUP ACTION: I WILL ASK LTG GALTIERI FOR ARGENTINE ARMY TO NOTIFY U.S. ARMY ATTACHE IN BUENOS AIRES IF THEY STILL WANT OUR ASSISTANCE IN THIS AREA. WHEN AND IF REQUEST IS RECEIVED, WE WILL BE PREPARED TO ACT IN EXPEDITIOUS MANNER.

{5} USARSA GUEST INSTRUCTOR. WE HAVE HAD INFORMATION FOR MORE THAN YEAR THAT ARGENTINE ARMY WOULD LIKE TO RENEW GUEST INSTRUCTOR RELATIONSHIP TERMINATED IN 1979 BECAUSE OF HUMAN RIGHTS PROBLEM. NORMAL TOUR FOR GUEST INSTRUCTORS IS EITHER ONE OR TWO YEARS.

FOLLOWUP ACTION: LTG NUTTING, USCINCSO, WILL SEND LETTER SHORTLY WHICH INVITES ARGENTINE ARMY TO SEND GUEST INSTRUCTOR TO USARSA.

B. INITIATIVES WHICH WERE DISCUSSED WITH LTG GALTIERI, BUT WHICH DO NOT YET HAVE OSD/STATE BLESSING:

{1} PERSONNEL EXCHANGE PROGRAM {PEP}. THIS PROGRAM ENTAILS EXCHANGE OF OFFICERS FOR PERIOD OF TWO YEARS. ARGENTINE OFFICERS WOULD SERVE IN POSITIONS IN OUR ARMY AND U.S. OFFICERS WOULD FILL BILLET'S

IN ARGENTINE ARMY. CURRENTLY, THE U.S. ARMY HAS SIMILAR PROGRAMS WITH OTHER LATIN AMERICAN ARMIES. THE ARMY STAFF WILL SEND REQUEST THIS WEEK, TO OASD/ISA REQUESTING DOD AND STATE APPROVAL FOR EXTENDING ARMY PEP TO ARGENTINA AND CHILE. YOUR STRONG ENDORSEMENT OF THIS INITIATIVE WILL BE GREAT HELP.

FOLLOWUP ACTION: I INTEND TO INFORM LTG GALTIERI THAT ARMY STAFF IS CURRENTLY STUDYING IDEA AND THAT I WILL SEND HIM LETTER ON SUBJECT WITHIN 30 DAYS.

{2} MILITARY ACADEMY GUEST LECTURER. THIS INITIATIVE ENTAILS VISIT AND LECTURES BY U.S. OFFICER OR SMALL BRIEFING TEAM TO EXPLAIN CURRENT DOCTRINE, TACTICS, AND ORGANIZATION OF U.S. ARMY. PURPOSE OF LECTURES WOULD BE TO ACQUAINT UPCOMING ARGENTINE OFFICERS WITH U.S. ARMY. WITH TERMINATION OF IMET AND FMS, YOUNGER OFFICERS HAVE NOT HAD OPPORTUNITY TO INTERFACE WITH U.S. ARMY. WE ARE CURRENTLY STUDYING IDEA WITH POSSIBILITY OF EXTENDING TO OTHER INTERESTED COUNTRIES.

FOLLOWUP ACTION: I INTEND TO NOTIFY LTG GALTIERI THAT WE ARE STUDYING IDEA AND THAT I WILL SEND HIM LETTER ON PROPOSAL WITHIN 30 DAYS.

SUBJECT: Concept for Security Consultations (U)

- Interagency group on Argentina has recommended that CSA introduce idea of conducting high-level security consultations with Argentine military during forthcoming visit to Argentina.

- Discussions would focus on exchange of ideas and intelligence on key hemispheric and global defense issues.

- Would be similar in format to US-Brazilian consultative series.

- ° 3-5 day exchange visit would be headed by flag officer from Joint Staff (or USSOUTHCOM) and should include representative from each Service.

- ° Initial talks would be held in Washington, DC, with each side paying own expenses. If Argentines prefer, however, talks can commence in Argentina.

- Discussion topics should be mutually agreed upon and could include:

- ° US strategic capabilities.

- ° NATO-Warsaw Pact posture.

- ° Southwest Asia.

- ° Situation in Central America.

- ° Soviet presence in Cuba.

- ° Soviet/Cuban activity in Africa.

- ° Strategic importance of the South Atlantic.

- Conference agenda and format would be worked out between OJCS, US Defense Attache, and the Argentine Joint General Staff.

- ° Each side would give 30-45 minute presentation or only one side may wish to address specific issue.

- ° Presentations would be followed by open discussions.

- US should take lead in initiating consultation series by inviting Argentines to send high-level team to Washington in Sep-Oct 81 timeframe (this has been cleared with Joint Staff).

- ° Reciprocal visit by US can follow in approximately 9-12 months.

SUBJECT: Argentine Army Exchange Visit (U)

- Current President of Argentina (then CINC Army), LTG Viola, informally broached idea with CSA at 1979 Conference of American Armies.

- Would entail 2-3 week visit by 10 to 12 Argentine Army officers and NCOs to US Army division.

- ° Argentine officers and NCOs would interface with counterparts within US Army division and observe/participate in normally planned activities of that unit.

- ° Argentines do not want special schedule developed for them.

- Argentine Army will pay expenses associated with their end of visit.

- As reciprocal matter, Argentine Army will invite like number of US Army officers/NCOs to visit their Army for similar period of time.

- ° Ideally, US Army personnel should come from unit visited by Argentines.

- ° US Army will be expected to fund its personnel going to Argentina.

- After CSA informally broaches idea with Argentine Army, it is expected that Argentine military attache to US will approach ARSTAF as to specific times and unit that Argentine Army wants to visit. At that time, detailed coordination can be made with FORSCOM.

- ° Effort will be made to have exchange visit coincide with active/exciting portion of unit's training cycle.

SUBJECT: Argentine Army Request for US Army Corps of Engineer Assistance

1. On 11 April 1979, Argentine Army Engineer Corps requested US Army Corps of Engineer (COE) assistance in formulating preliminary study/plan on civic action plan to reclaim 10.5 million hectares of swampland. Provinces affected include Santiago Del Estero, Chaco, and Santa Fe (see attached map). The reclaimed areas will be used to raise grain and beef cattle.
2. Because Argentine Army was well aware of COE success in reclamation projects, it requested plans, technical advice, and methodology used by US Army engineers to reclaim flooded land. At time of initial request, it was apparent that Argentine Army would probably request authorization for some of its planning staff to visit similar US projects to gain knowledge of techniques and problems.
3. Coordinator, Reimbursable Development Programs (RDP), Agency for International Development, received copy of requesting message from Argentina and indicated support for project. It was informally agreed that RDP would provide Section 661 funding (\$30,000) for Phase I visit to define scope of work and that any Phase II activities (more detailed assistance) would be funded by Argentina. On 22 May 1979, State sent message to American Embassy Buenos Aires (Incl) recognizing that strict legal guidelines would have permitted such program, but indicating human rights considerations precluded favorable consideration at that time.
4. In light of improvement in Argentine human rights situation, humanitarian/developmental nature of project, and current attempt to improve US-GOA relations, State has authorized CSA to raise issue with Argentine Army. If Argentine Army is still interested, COE is prepared to send team to Argentina to conduct appropriate survey.

SUBJECT: Argentine Guest Instructor for US Army School of the Americas (USARSA)

In April 1980, US Army element in Panama was informed by Argentine Armed Forces Attache to Panama that Argentina would like to renew guest instructor relationship with USARSA (last Argentine guest instructor departed that in June 1979).

There are currently 27 guest instructors from various Latin American countries at USARSA. They provide training, developed and managed by US Army, to Latin American and US students.

US Army Judge Advocate General and General Counsel for Defense Security Assistance Agency have agreed that neither Humphrey-Kennedy Amendment nor any other portion of Foreign Assistance Act would preclude US Army from inviting (and expending funds on) guest instructors from Argentina or other non-IMET country, they reason that:

- funds for USARSA are administrative and are not earmarked for specific countries;

- guest instructors fill positions in US Army school organizations and are not provided training.

Argentina would pay guest instructor's salary, while US Army would provide living allowance and pay travel expenses. Funds are available to accommodate instructor from Argentina.

23 February 1981 Interagency Group meeting on Argentina approved this initiative. It would be appropriate for CSA to extend verbal invitation for Argentine Army to send guest instructor to USARSA. If Argentines are amenable to idea, USARSA/USCINCSO would follow up with letter invitation which contain details.

1. I'M SORRY I DID NOT HAVE A CHANCE ON THURSDAY TO CHECK OUT WITH YOU PRIOR TO THE TIME WE LEFT BUENOS AIRES. CAROL AND I GREATLY APPRECIATE THE SUPPORT THE EMBASSY PROVIDED US DURING OUR VISIT. SKIP MACDONALD AND THE MILITARY CREW APPEAR TO BE A VERY EFFECTIVE GROUP AND I CAME AWAY WITH A GOOD FEELING CONCERNING THE CALIBER OF PEOPLE YOU HAVE ON BOARD. THE USE OF YOUR QUARTERS FOR THE RECIPROCAL RECEPTION WAS A SOCIAL AND, IF I MIGHT SAY, POLITICAL COUP. WE ARE BOTH GRATEFUL AND LOOK FORWARD TO SHARING OUR TABLE WITH YOU HERE IN WASHINGTON ON ONE OF YOUR FUTURE STATE-SIDE VISITS.
3. I DEVELOPED MY AFTER ACTION REPORT IN THE FORM OF A MESSAGE AS I HAD PROMISED. I BELIEVE IT COVERS THE HIGH POINTS OF THE DISCUSSIONS I HAD WITH THE SENIOR MEMBERS OF THE JUNTA, PRESIDENT VIOLA, AND SOME OF THE MORE INFLUENTIAL MEMBERS OF THE ARGENTINE MILITARY. A FEW OF THE MORE SENSITIVE ISSUES SUCH AS THE ARGENTINE ACTIVITY IN EL SALVADOR, RELATIONS WITH BOLIVIA, AND THE SOUTH AFRICAN LINK, I WILL DISCUSS IN MORE DETAIL THAN I OUTLINED IN THE MESSAGE WITH ONLY A FEW HERE IN WASHINGTON. SKIP MACDONALD WAS PRIVY TO MOST OF THOSE DISCUSSIONS, SO I BELIEVE HE CAN FILL YOU IN ON THE EL SALVADOR AND BOLIVIA ISSUES.
4. I HOPE BY THE MIDDLE OF NEXT WEEK TO BE ABLE TO FINALIZE THE LETTER TO GENERAL GALTIERI WHICH OUTLINES WHO HAS THE BALL ON THE INITIATIVES WHICH I PROPOSED. I WILL SEND YOU AN ADVANCED COPY OF THOSE INITIATIVES FOR ANY FINAL ADVICE YOU MAY HAVE ON ANY ONE OF THEM.
5. I DID GIVE YOU ONE BIT OF BAD INFORMATION WHILE I WAS THERE. I AM SURE YOU REALIZE THAT BY NOW. WHEN WE DISCUSSED THE SPANISH NEGOTIATIONS, I INDICATED I THOUGHT WE HAD ARRIVED AT SOME AGREEMENT. I WAS WRONG, AND OUR CURRENT PLANS HAVE BEEN PRETTY WELL OUTLINED BY AL HAIG AND CARRIED IN THE PRESS. I DON'T KNOW WHICH TWO DATA BITS WERE OUT OF ALIGNMENT IN MY HEAD BUT THEY CLEARLY WERE.
6. AGAIN THE VISIT WAS MOST USEFUL FOR ME AND WILL BE HELPFUL AS WE DEBATE THE OVERALL POLICY FOR LATIN AMERICA. MY UNDERSTANDING THE UNIQUE ISSUES OF THE SOUTHERN CONE WILL ENABLE ME TO BETTER ARTICULATE A RATIONALE FOR A COHERENT AND INTEGRATED LATIN AMERICAN POLICY.
