The attached were furnished by U.S. Customs, San Francisco. Forms reveal that travelers Marlene Dixon, ~~Chauffler~~ ^{mct} Richard Chauffler, and Olga Castillo Talamante traveled to Nicaragua and Cuba. They entered the U.S. at SF, Ca. on 12/17/84, from Mexico, City aboard Mexicana AL flight 976.

Marlene Dixon is a leader of CISPES and Talamante is a leader of a group named US Out of Central

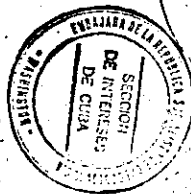

Out of Argentine Prison

Olga Tastes

Freedom

Olga Talamante, 27, the California farm worker's daughter who spent 16 months in an Argentine prison, looked vaguely uncomfortable yesterday with her newfound freedom.

"It's nice to be free," she said in the midst of constant interruptions as she sat over untouched coffee and Mexican pastry in her family's Gilroy home.

It was hard to get a word in edgewise. The phone rarely stopped ringing, a parade of friends, old and new, streamed through the front door and she kissed each and again her father's cheek for the benefit of yet another photographer.

A small woman in a pink blouse and blue denim trousers, she seemed weary, a trifle disconcerted and somewhat incredulous as the joyous reunion scene unfolded around her.

Four days ago, inside a tiny Argentine prison, where she said she had been tortured and abused during her confinement on political subversion charges, she had feared for her life.

A military junta had seized control of the government, ousted President Isabel Peron and reinstated the death penalty for anyone convicted of subversion.

On Thursday night ("I'm still mixed up on the dates") the military officials "came to my cell in Azul, placed me in handcuffs and took me away.

"You're going now," they said, but they didn't tell me where," she said.

"I had hoped I was going home."

Miss Talamante was flown by small plane to Buenos Aires

and released last Saturday to her relief.

The phone rang at 8 that night at the Talamante home on

Gavilan court on the edge of the vast garlic fields her father, Eduardo, works.

"Olga is free," a State De-

partment official told her joyous mother, Refugio.

"I still can't believe it," Mrs. Talamante said, scarcely taking her eyes off her daughter.

Her husband emerged from the bathroom with a clean-shaven chin and a wide grin. He'd grown a thick beard, vowing not to shave it until his only daughter was home safe. His wife rubbed his smooth cheek and smiled.
