I discussed Carl Rauh's requested letter with Ben this morning, and he had two concerns. First, why we really needed this; but, on that score, I think he is satisfied. Second, why it was necessary either for us to make this request at all and, in any event, why we had to agree to the limitations that are contained in the letter. I indicated to him that I assume that the Agency would not have sufficient interest in the matter on its own to make the request and that Carl had negotiated the letter in detail with the General Counsel's office.

The Attorney General made the corrections you see on the letter, and I told him that I would get back to Carl and see whether or not a different version could be negotiated. Since I have to testify this morning, I would appreciate your discussing this with Carl and attempting to resolve it.
