- Oct. 7, 2010** **Introduction to the National Archives (Tour included)**
Discover the amazing teaching resources of the National Archives. Explore your National Archives: it's your source for our nation's history. And go behind the scenes!
- Nov. 4, 2010** **World War II on the Home Front**
In recognition of Veterans' Day, we explore the effects of war on those at home. The records of domestic and wartime economy and scientific research reveal some the true stories of our nation at war.
- Dec. 2, 2010** **Teaching the Constitution: It's the Law**
It's the most long-lived national constitution in history. The stories of its origins, evolution, and challenges are heart-stirring. And teachers are required by law to teach about it. In observance of Bill of Rights Day.
- Jan. 6, 2011** **Application of Research Methods: Immigration/Migration**
How has human migration shaped our history? Use the records of the National Archives for research into this topic.
- Feb. 3, 2011** **Exploring Civil Rights**
Are all men created equal? Is there ever a reason for denying the rights of a specific group of people? What types of dissent have been documented over the years? How has the United States dealt with the challenges of righting past wrongs? This workshop explores the evolution of our documented rights.
- Mar. 3, 2011** **1775: Prequel to Independence**
The Lexington Alarm, Battle at North Bridge, Bunker Hill, the Siege and Evacuation of Boston are the events that led to Independence. It's our local history, and it's our nation's history.
- Apr. 7, 2011** **Soldiers & Sacrifice: Civil War Resources of the National Archives**
This observance of the 150th anniversary of the Civil War explores the vast resources available to teachers and to students, online and as original documents, from iconic photographs to local enrollment records.
- May 5, 2011** **Thar She Blows: Whaling**
Studying whaling is a context for all grades to incorporate literature, mathematics, geography, economics, and the arts all together. Explore the exciting maritime records of the National Archives.
- Jun. 2, 2011** **Application of Research Methods**
Research the original documents at the National Archives.
