UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, DISTRICT OF NEBRASKA,
QMAHA DIVISION.

The President of the United States of America:
To the Marshal of the United States for the District of
Nebraska, and to the Warden of the United States Penitentiary, at
Leavenworth, Kansus. GREFTING:-

Whereas, on the 11th day of November, A.D.1909, at a term of the District Court of the United States for the District of Nebraska, held at Omaha, in said District, Frank Grisware, otherwise called James Gordon, otherwise called E.E.Hollingshead, was convicted of the crime of robbing the United States sail, and placing the lives of the railway postal clerks in Jeopardy, by the use of dengerous weapons, contrary to the laws of the United States, and

SENTENCED to be imprisoned in the United States Penitentiary situated at Leacenworth, Kensas, at hard labor, for the term of his natural life.

Now, therefore, you, the said Marshal, are hereby commanded to deliver to said Warden of the said United States Penitentiary, situated at Leavenworth, Kansas, the body of Frank Grigware, otherwise called James Gordon, otherwise called E.M.Mollingshead, who is now in your custody.

And you, the said Warden of said United States Penitentiary are hereby commanded to receive the body of the said Frank Grigware, otherwise called James Gordon, otherwise called E.E. Hellingshead, and safely keep him in said Penitentiary until said sentence of imprisonment shall have been fully complied with, or until he shall have been discharged therefrom by due course of law.



- Social Interview




