

John holds B.A. and M.A. degrees in American History from Gettysburg College (1987) and The Pennsylvania State University (1990).

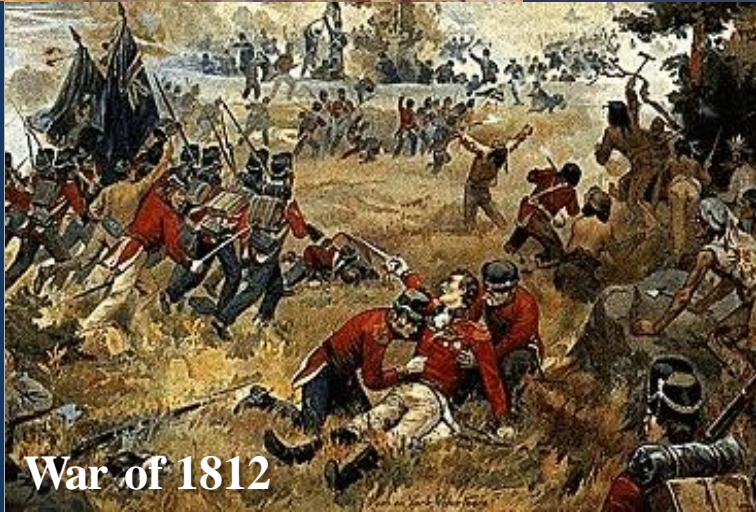

# VOLUNTEER SERVICE

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## Compiled Military Service Records

- ⦿ Created in the 1890s to help the War Department verify service for pension claims
- ⦿ Compiled from various original sources such as muster rolls, payrolls, returns, hospital records, and prison records
- ⦿ Arranged by
  - State
  - Military unit
  - Surname (alphabetical)

# Enlistment paper for John Easton, December 15, 1864

I, *John Easton*  
do acknowledge that I have voluntarily enlisted myself to serve four years in the Marine Corps of the UNITED STATES unless sooner discharged, upon the terms mentioned in the act passed the 11th day of July, 1798, entitled "An act for establishing and organizing a Marine Corps;" also the act passed the 2d day of March, 1833, entitled "An act to improve the condition of the non-commissioned Officers and Privates of the Army and Marine Corps of the United States, and to prevent desertion;" also the act passed 30th June, 1834, entitled "An act for the better organization of the United States Marine Corps;" and also the acts passed the 2d day of March, 1837, entitled "An act to provide for the enlistment of boys for the Naval service, and to extend the term of the enlistment of seamen;" and February 20, 1845, entitled "An act to amend an act entitled "An act to provide for the enlistment of boys for the Naval service, and to extend the term of the enlistment of seamen," and also the 9th section of an act passed March 3, 1845, "making appropriations for the Naval service for the year ending the 30th of June, 1846:" and that I have had read to me the Rules and Articles of the Army and Navy against Mutiny and Desertion.

Witness my hand, this *Fifteenth* day of *December* 1864.

do solemnly swear or affirm, (as the case may be) that I will bear true allegiance to the United States of America, and that I will serve them honestly and faithfully against all their enemies or opposers whosoever, and observe and obey the order of the President of the United States, and the orders of the officers appointed over me, according to the Rules and Articles for the government of the Army and Navy of the United States. And further, that I am of the full age of *Twenty-one* years.

- ◉ Based on service in the U.S. military between 1775 and 1916
- ◉ Different types of pensions:
  - Disability pensions
  - Service pensions
  - Widow/dependent pensions
- ◉ Many different pensions acts
  - If rejected under one act, applications could reapply under a later one

  - Date(s) of enlistment
  - Period(s) of service
  - Units individual served with
  - Residence
  - Medical history
  - Death dates
  - Information about Widow and/or Children

# William Graham's Declaration of Pension

- April 21, 1818 (age 62)
- Filed in Hadley (Saratoga Co., New York)
- Enlisted in Capt. Abraham Hunt's Co. (1st MA Reg.) in 1777 for a period of three years
- Fought at the Battle of Bunker Hill under Capt. William Scott of the New Hampshire Line
- Lost his discharge papers
- Statement of Lewis Scott, son of William Scott

STATE OF NEW-YORK, } ss.  
SARATOGA COUNTY.

ON this twenty first day of April 1818, before me the subscriber, one of the Judges of the Court of Common Pleas in and for the county of Saratoga and state of New-York, personally appears William Graham aged sixty two years, resident in the town of Hadley in the County of Saratoga in the said state, who being by me first duly sworn, according to law, doth, on his oath, make the following declaration, in order to obtain the provision made by the late act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war." That the said William Graham

enlisted in the year 1777 as a Private Soldier in the state of Massachusetts for 3 years in the company commanded by Captain Abraham Hunt and served the full three of his enlistment that he continued to serve in the said corps, or in the service of the United States until the end of the War as a Private Soldier

when he was discharged from service in March 1783 at Quincy by General Washington and state of New York that he was in the battles of Bunker Hill, York Island, Whit Plains, & Oriskany and that he is in reduced circumstances, and stands in need of the assistance of his country for support; and that he has no other evidence now in his power of his said services except as follows to wit Lewis Scott that at the Battle of Bunker Hill he was under Captain William Scott of the New Hampshire Line previous to his enlistment under Captain Hunt and that after the enlistment expired under the said Capt Hunt he enlisted under Captain John Miller for during the war but that his discharge by some unavoidable accident has been lost.

Personally appeared before Lewis Scott and being duly sworn deposes and says that he has heard his father William Scott which is Captain William Scott above mentioned say that William Graham above alluded to, was in Bunker Hill Battle with him and that he served in the revolutionary war a considerable time thinks from general conversation that he was sworn to and declared before me, Salmon Child in during the War - Lewis Scott.  
Subscribed and sworn to before me, Salmon Child April 21st 1818

I Salmon Child Judge, &c. as aforesaid, do certify that it appears to my satisfaction that the said William Graham did serve in the revolutionary war, as stated in the preceding declaration, against the common enemy; and I now transmit the proceedings and testimony taken and had before me, to the Secretary for the War Department, pursuant to the directions of the aforesaid act of Congress. Salmon Child April 21st 1818

Pub. from the Verif. examination of the above named William Graham and personal acquaintance with the same Lewis Scott I was satisfied of justice of the said William Graham without any further testimony.

- States he would be unable to subsist without his pension or a private or public charity

My family consists of myself aged fifty four years a Mr and  
 thirty eight years and a Daughter aged thirty years - I am a  
 Basket maker by Profession but unable to follow it on account  
 of Paralytic affections, & subject to convulsion fits - and infirmity  
 of age - My Wife is unable to do labor in consequence of age and  
 is wholly unable to render me any Assistance towards a support  
 My Daughter is thirty years of age born lame, and has  
 never had the use of her limbs sufficiently to walk - She  
 is also subject to frequent & violent fits and has ever  
 been an expense to me so great that when I was able to Work  
 found it very difficult to gain a sufficient support for my  
 family and am now infirm by age and subject to afflicting  
 diseases - that even if not for the bounties granted me by  
 Government should be unable to subsist without resorting to public  
 or private charity

## Mary Graham's Declaration of Pension

o Filed in 1837 (age 86)

o Mary's declaration recapped the details of William's service:

On this 25<sup>th</sup> day of March 1837, personally appeared before  
Thomas B. Hicks, a Judge of County Courts,  
in the County of Warren Mary Graham a resident of  
Corinth in the County of Saratoga and State of New York,  
aged Eighty six years, who, being first duly sworn according to  
Law, doth, on her oath, make the following declaration, in  
order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by the Act of  
Congress, passed July 4. 1836, That she is the Widow of  
William Graham, who was a private Soldier in the  
Army of the Revolution.

That her husband the said William Graham was a  
Pensioner of the United States under the Act of Congress, passed on the  
10<sup>th</sup> day of March 1814, at the time of his death, and that  
the following is an extract from a copy of the affidavit  
made by him before the Court of Common Pleas of the County of  
the County of Saratoga in the State of New York, on the 22<sup>nd</sup> day  
of August 1820, in open Court, to wit,

"That in the month of May 1770, he enlisted at  
first for the term of eight months at Peter'sburgh New Hamp-  
shire State, under Lieutenant Scott, in a Company com-  
manded by Captain Scott in the New Hampshire line.  
that he proceeded to Mistek near Dunkin hill, and joined  
the Regiment commanded by Colonel Starke, under whom  
and Colonel Sergeant, he served about One year and eight  
months faithfully and was discharged from Captain Scott's  
Company at ——— 11<sup>th</sup> December or January 1777

"That his original declaration was made on or about the 21<sup>st</sup> day  
of April 1812, and that his original Pension Certificate  
is numbered 1161.

"And he further saith that he was in the Battle at Rock Island,  
White Plains and at Bunker Hill — After which he enlisted  
again at Boston in a Company commanded by Captain John  
Hunt of the 1<sup>st</sup> Massachusetts Regiment commanded by  
Colonel Joseph Voe, enlisted for three years, after the  
expiration of said enlistment he again enlisted at New  
Castle under Captain John Miller in the Regiment com-  
manded by Colonel Joseph Voe for during the War, enlisted  
at North Castle and served under Capt Timothy Remick

## DETAILED REPORT of Pilots and Other Observations:

The patrol was ordered to straff troops on the Romagne-Bantheville Road just north of Romagne.

I observed about five transports, not more than seven. The patrol descended to 50 meters and shot up the road causing some disorder. We were heavily archied just east of Bantheville. In the northern edge of the woods just east of Bantheville a Hun archie battery is very active. About 12 h 10 a fourth unknown Spad joined our patrol (probably from the Third Pursuit Group). About 12 h 20 I observed an EA two-seater probably Biplane flying west, north of Montfaucon at 400 meters. About 200 meters above the two seater were 5 Fokkers and above the 5 Fokkers were four more Fokker just in the light fluffy clouds. I fired at long range on the 5 Fokkers and they turned north. I then attacked the two-seater and the Fokkers suddenly returned and I was forced to withdraw. The Fokkers again withdrew and I resumed the attack again withdrawing on the approach of the Fokkers. The Buns pulled into Hum-land for a space and my patrol continued back down the lines. We again turned west and just north of Montfaucon we again encountered the two seater at 12 h 40 and the Fokkers did not tumble down. I opened with a regular gun and the balloon gun from above with Lieut. McDermott and Lieut. Simon from below. The two seater fell in flames just north of Gierges. The unknown Spad seemed to be in the combat but was higher than when we were when we attacked. I saw no Hun balloons.

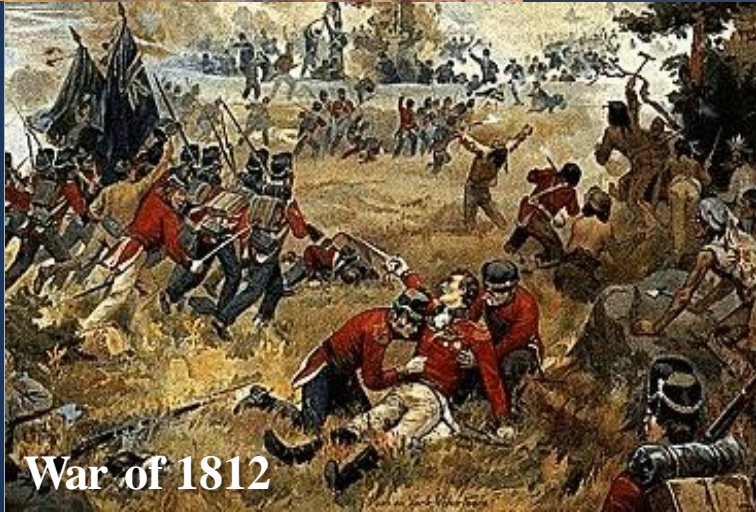
