

- Created in the 1890s to help the War Department verify service for pension claims
- Compiled from various original sources such as muster rolls, payrolls, returns, hospital records, and prison records
- Arranged by

  - Surname (alphabetical)

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

- Modern military service relates chiefly to the major wars and conflicts of the 20th century and later, including:
  - World War I (1917–1918)
  - World War II (1941–1945)
  - Korean War (1950-1953)
  - Vietnam War (1965-1975)
  - Operation Desert Storm (1991)
- Military service records: National Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, MO
  - 1973 fire

Reconnaissance Report, 1st Pursuit Group, September 26, 1918

The patrol was ordered to straff troops on the Romagne-B ntheville Road just north of Romanee.

I observed about five transports, not more than seven. The patrol descended to So meters and shot up the road causing some disorder. We were heavily archied just east of Bantheville. In the northern edge of the woods just east of Bantheville a Hum archie battery is very active. About 12 h 10 a fourth unknown Spad joined our patrol (probably from the Third Pureuit Broup). About 12 h 20 I observed an EA two-seater probably Rumpler flying west, north of Montfaucon at 400 meters. About 200 meters above the two seater were 5 Pokkers and above the 5 Fokkers were four more Fokker just in the light fluffy clouds. I fired at long range on the 5 Fokkers and they turned north. I then attacked the two-meater and the Fokkers suddenly returned and I was

forced to withdraw. The Folkers again withdraw and I resumed the attack again withdrawing on the appracch of the Fokkers. The Huns pulled into Hunland for a space and my patrol continued back down the lines. We gain turned west and just north of Hontfaucon we again encountered the two seater at 12 h 40 and the Fokkers did not tumble down. I opened with a regular gum and the balloon gum from above with Lieut. Resumentureright and Lieut. Simon from below. The two seater fell in flames just north of Gierges. The unhown Spad seemed to be in the combat but was higherned than when we ware when we attacked. I saw no Hun balloons. Squarren Operations C.


