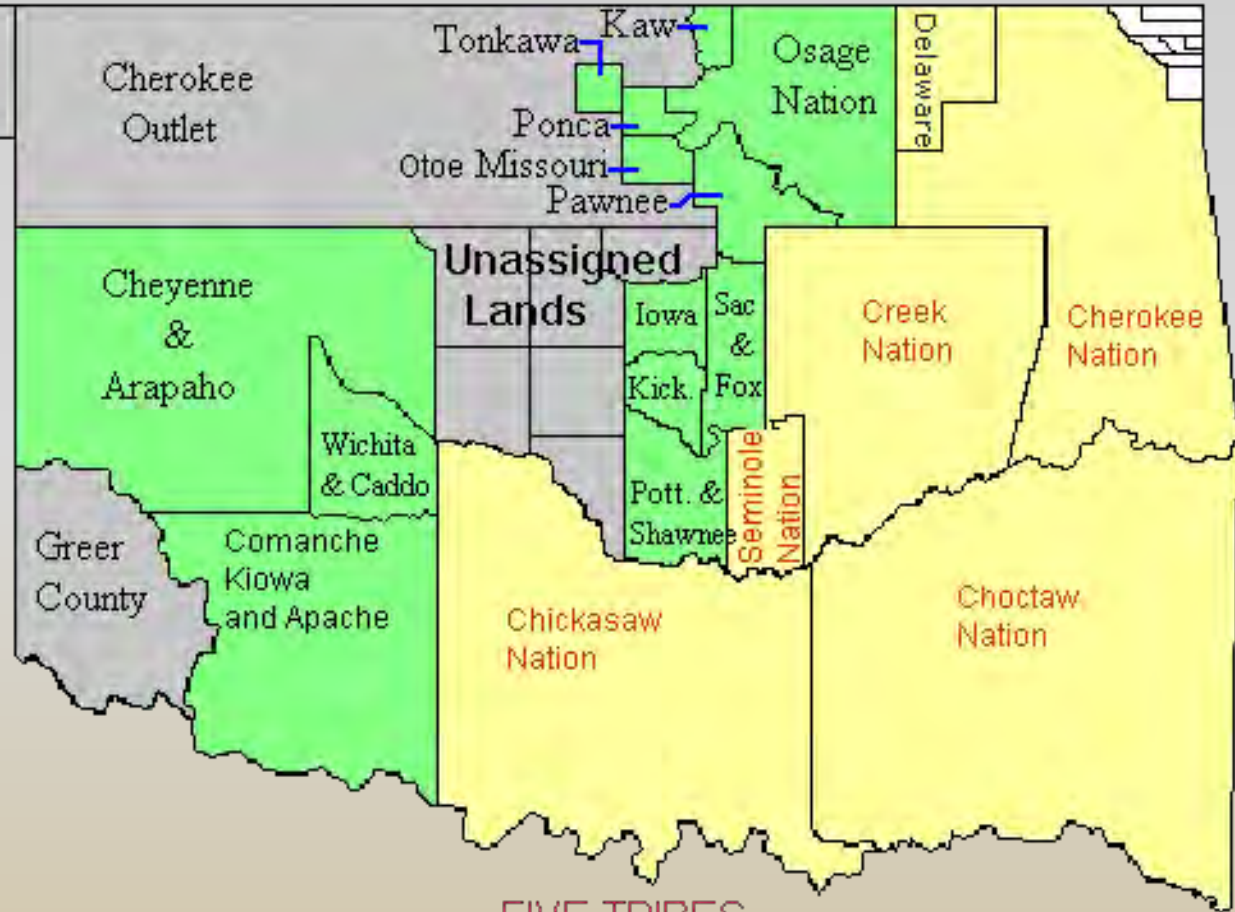

# Starting the Dawes Search

**An act of Congress in 1893, authorized the establishment of a commission to negotiate agreements with each of the Five Civilized Tribes that would eventually abolish the tribal governments and permit the allotment of land to individual tribal members.**

ORIGINAL DAWES COMMISSION

- **Former Senator Henry L. Dawes of Massachusetts was appointed chairman of the commission on November 1, 1893 and it was commonly referred to thereafter as the DAWES COMMISSION.**



# 1896 Applications

- Commission authorized to add names to existing tribal rolls—except for the Seminole.
- The Tribes had the right to dispute claims and reject enrollment.
- Those who were rejected had the right to appeal.

# SEARCHING ONLINE FOR THE 1896 APPLICATIONS

## Ancestry

- 1) From the main page, scroll down to More Collections, and select All Databases.
- 2) Under the Ancestry Database Card Catalog, enter **U.S. Native American Applications for Enrollment in Five Civilized Tribes, 1896** (or parts thereof) in the Database Title and enter.
- 3) Select the **Applications** from the Title list.
- 4) You can either enter the name and hit enter or you can browse the collection for the tribe, application type (which is the census card number), and hit **All** under Surname Letter.
- 5) Click the arrows pointing right until you get to the census card number desired.

# What Records Will I Find?

The 1896 process, especially if appealed, could result in an informational gold mine

- Testimony
- Vital records submitted as ‘proof’ may include birth certificates, marriage licenses, letters, and affidavits





Before the Commission to the Five Civilized Tribes:

In the matter of the Claim of Elisha Sawyer for Citizenship in the Chectaw Nation.

The applicant would state for his claim for Citizenship in the Chectaw Nation that his age is 40 years and that his Post Office is Cadde I. T.

The applicant would further state that he is an intermarried Citizen of the Chectaw Nation having married Miss Caroline Stewart a Chectaw Indian by blood in the year of 1874 month of Sept and the 29<sup>th</sup> day of said month.

The applicant further states that he married according to the laws of the Chectaw Nation governing the marriage of White United States Citizens to Citizens of the Chectaw Nation as will be seen by a certified copy of the marriage License and a certified copy of the marriage Certificate filed herewith and made a part of this application and marked "Exhibit A"

The applicant would ask the Commission to extend Chectaw Citizenship unto him and place him on the roll prepared by them for the Chectaw Nation as a Citizenship roll.

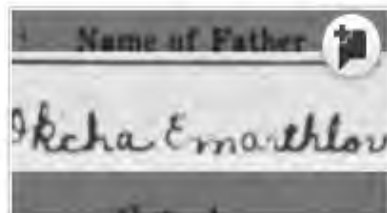

Q What is your post office address? A Stonewall, ~~kemper~~ temporarily at Ada get my mail at Ada now and will for awhile.  
Q You are a Chickasaw by blood? A Yes, sir.  
Q And on the approved roll? A Yes, sir, number one, first one to break the ice.  
Q Do you know Mary I. Walker? A Yes, sir.  
Q What relation is she to you, if any? A My wife.  
Q When were you married to her? A In '65.  
Q Do you know the month? A I think it was June if I ain't mistaken.  
Q Where were you married? A On Blue, near Emet.  
Q Chickasaw Nation? A Yes, sir, Tishomingo county.  
Q Where were you a resident of at the time of your marriage? A Chickasaw Nation.  
Q And your wife? A Chickasaw Nation.  
Q Was she your first wife? A Yes, sir.  
Q Were you her first husband? A Yes, sir.  
Q Were you married twice to her? A Yes, sir.  
Q When was the second marriage? A At Fort Smith after the war when it became so we could go down there without any danger; we were married before a Catholic Priest, it was her desire.  
Q By whom were you married the first time? A Judge Thomas Cheadle.  
Q What was his official position? A Circuit Judge if I ain't mistaken.  
Q Since that time have you and she lived together as husband and wife? A Yes, sir.

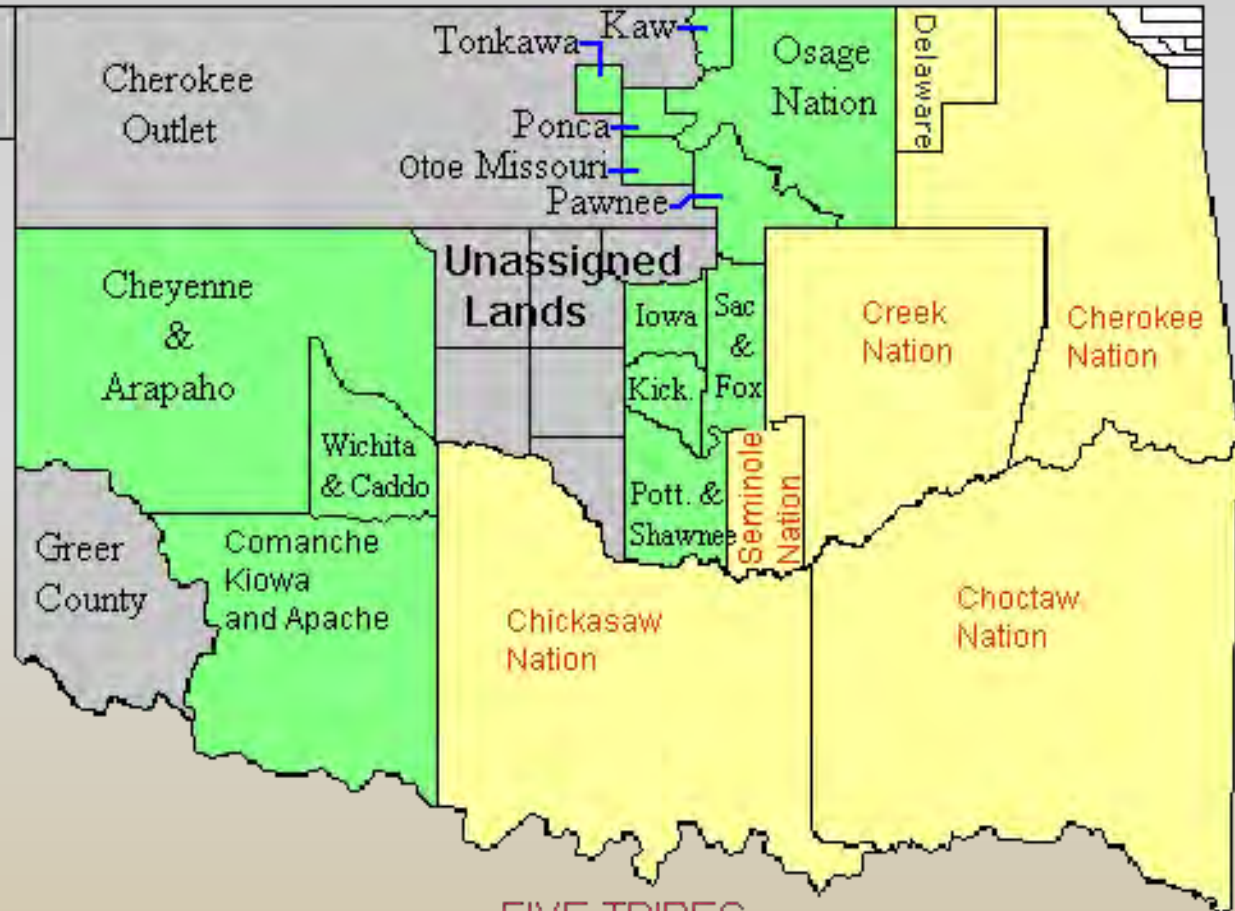

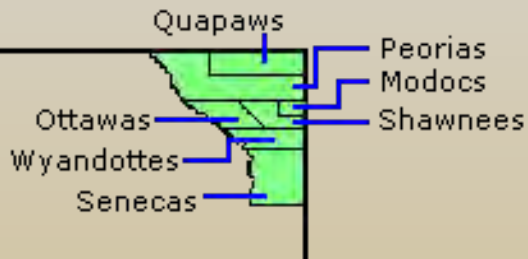
