



## Personnel Records of the National Archives at St. Louis

Bryan K. McGraw

Mr. McGraw provides an overview of the extensive holdings of the National Archives at St. Louis. This large federal archive is home to tens of millions of personal data series records including the official military personnel file of former military members of all branches of the U.S. military, official personnel folders of former federal civilian

employees, selective service registration cards and ledgers, various courts martial records, individual deceased personnel files of former military members, Veterans Administration deceased claim files, and many others. He will also discuss how to request records on-site and off-site, and additional resources for further research.

Bryan McGraw joined the National Archives and Records
Administration in 2004 and was selected to his current position in 2012. Mr. McGraw is responsible for and oversees the day-to-day operations of five federal archives, in Chicago, Denver, Fort Worth, Kansas City, and St. Louis.

Mr. McGraw's education includes a Bachelor of Science Degree from Southeast Missouri State University, a Master of Public Administration from the University of Oklahoma, and a Ph.D. (all but the dissertation) in Public Policy from Saint Louis University. He is also a Senior Fellow and graduate of the Partnership for Public Service Excellence in Government Fellowship Program.


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#### Records Available for Research

- National Archives at St. Louis is a personal data records series archive
  - Official Military Personnel File (OMPF)
  - Official Personnel Folder (OPF)
  - Selective Service System Registration Cards & Ledgers
  - Army Courts Martial Records
  - Many other personnel-related records rich in genealogical material

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### Military Personnel Records at NARA



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#### OMPFs - Archival Date

- All OMPFs become a public, archival record 62 years tothe-day from when the veteran retired, separated (final) or was killed in service
- This is a rolling date...
  - (62 Today's date) = October 21, 1953
- Any record with this date of retirement, separation or KIA or EARLIER is a public, archival record
  - Anyone can request & review or purchase a copy (subject to Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) Privacy Screening requirements
  - If a record is newer that the current archival date it has limited access
    - Veteran, Next-of-Kin, military service department, law enforcement

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#### What is in an OMPF?

- The OMPF documents the individual's military service:
  - Date and type of enlistment/appointment
  - Duty stations and assignments
  - Training & qualifications
  - Performance reports
  - Awards and decorations received
  - Non-judicial disciplinary actions (e.g., Article 15; Letter of Reprimand)
  - Insurance
  - Emergency data
  - Administrative remarks
  - Date and type of separation/discharge/retirement (including DD Form 214, Report of Separation, or equivalent)
  - May also contain: birth certificates, marriage certificates, divorce decrees, letters, and photographs
- Detailed information about the veteran's participation in battles and their military engagements is NOT contained in the record


### Persons of Exceptional Prominence (PEP)

- Records of prominent individuals which served in the military (or as a civil servant):
  - Presidents, members of Congress and the Supreme Court; famous military leaders; decorated heroes; celebrities; infamous characters & other cultural figures who served in the military


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#### The 1973 Fire

Records damaged or lost include an estimated 16-18 million military records. Records damage occurred from both fire and water

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## Official Personnel Folders (OPFs) [Federal Civilian Personnel Files]

- Archival records date from the mid-nineteenth century through 1951:
  - In the complete custody of NARA
  - Information is available to the public
  - Certain information is restricted under terms of the Freedom of Information Act [5 U.S.C. 552 (b) (6)]
- Non-archival records date 1952 to the present
  - In the custody of the agency that created the record
  - The National Personnel Records Center has physical custody of the records
  - Information is available to the public under FOIA
  - Information is protected by the Privacy Act of 1974


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### Official Personnel Folders (OPFs)

#### OPFs may contain the following documents:

- Applications
- Oaths of Office
- Correspondence
- Appraisals
- Leave and Pay Information
- Letters of Recommendation/Protest
- Changes in Work Status
- Photographs
- Rarely: Vital Records

## Selective Service System Registration Cards & Ledgers

National Archives at St. Louis maintains World War II through Vietnam era Selective Service Records – men born **April 28, 1877 to March 28, 1957** 

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
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## World War II 4<sup>th</sup> Registration April 27<sup>th</sup> 1942: "Old Man's Draft"

- -DOB- April 28<sup>th</sup> 1877- February 16<sup>th</sup> 1897
- -Not liable for military service
- -Occupational Strength
- -Registered 14,369,325 men (911,630 in NYC alone)

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#### Access to Records

- Archived holdings of the National Archives at St. Louis are available to anyone and everyone
  - Some records are subject to privacy screening under FOIA
    - Social Security numbers
    - 3<sup>rd</sup> Party information
    - OMPFs: criminal activity which could cause embarrassment to surviving family members must be redacted
    - If subject of record is deceased privacy restrictions are relaxed
- Access to records can be either on-site (research room) or off-site (written reference)
- Archival records are subject to copy fees (44 USC 2116)

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### How to Request Records: (OMPFs)



- Veteran's complete name as used in service
- Service number
- Branch of service
- Date and place of birth
- Dates of service

For records affected by the 1973 fire additional information such as:

- place of discharge
- last assigned unit &
- place of entry into service may be useful

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### How to Request Records: (OPFs)



- Full name of employee and any alternate names or spellings
- Date of birth
- Employing agency/agencies
- Dates of employment
- Location of employment
- Social security number (if known)

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#### How to Request Records: CCC & WPA



- Full name used at the time of service
- Social Security Number (if known)
- Date of birth
- Place of birth
- Hometown (city and state) at time of employment
- Parents' name
- Spouse's name (for WPA employment)
- Dates of service (day, month and year)
- Location of employment
- Forms are available at:
  - Works Progress Administration: Form NA 14137
  - Civilian Conservation Corps: Form NA 14136
