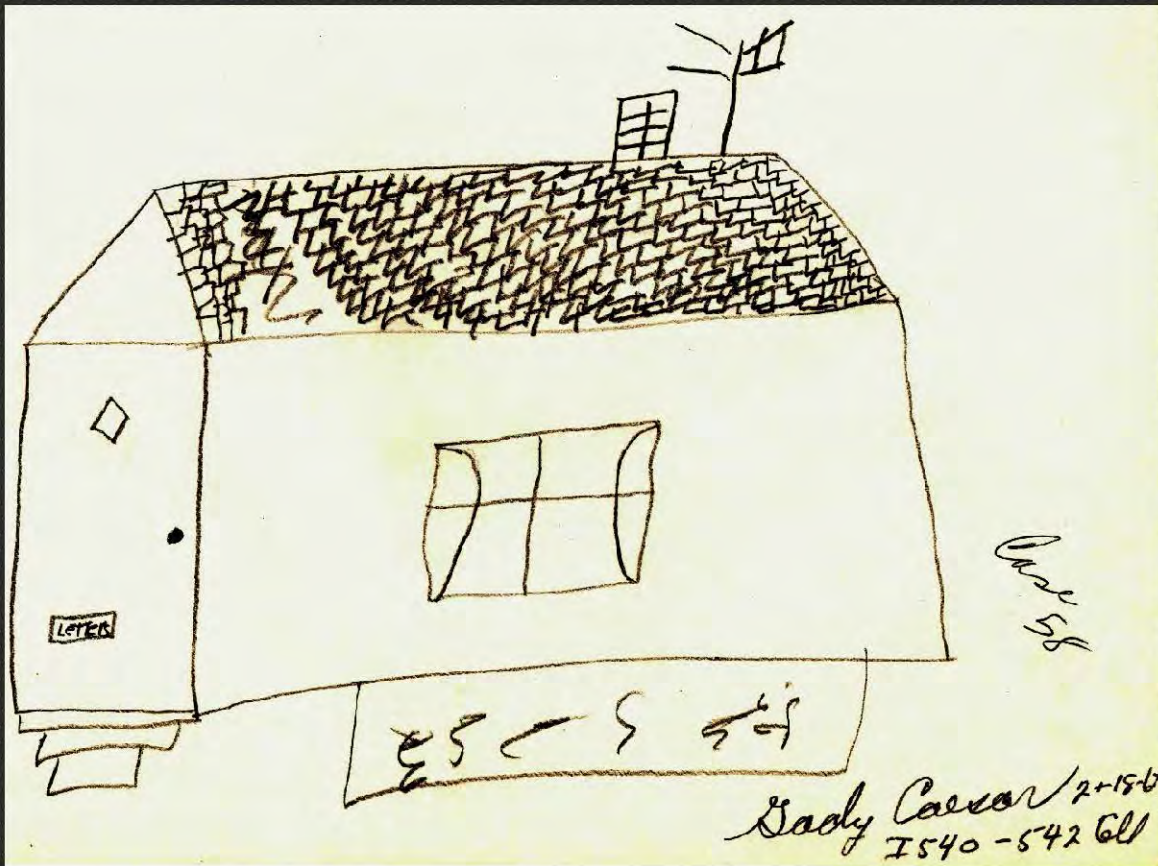

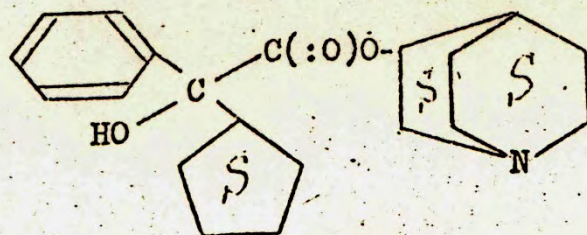

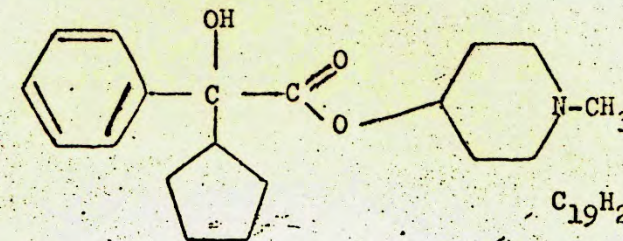

SUBJECT: Summary of Human Volunteer Studies on EA 3167

A total of 22 volunteers were given EA 3167. Twenty of these volunteers received the compound at Holmesburg Prison, Philadelphia, PA and two received the compound at Biomedical Laboratory, Edgewood Arsenal

Nineteen of the 20 prisoners at Holmesburg Prison were injected intramuscularly and one was injected intravenously. The investigators at Holmesburg were Drs. Herbert Copelan and David Kitzes. The contract project officers for the Holmesburg work were Dr. Van Sim and/or LTC J. Ketchum. The investigator at Edgewood Arsenal was LTC S. Cucinell. The two volunteers at Edgewood Arsenal received the EA 3167 twice percutaneously.

REACTIONS

I first noticed that I was being influenced by the drug when I started laughing uncontrollably. At the same time I began to notice that everything had a yellow-greenish tint to it. I tried to fight the drug nearly all of the time, but, of course, I was unable to do it. The sensation from the drug seemed to come in waves - a very definite thing that I could feel coming on. When these waves came, I had, at times, a rather "heady" feeling, similar to intoxication. It became hard to hold a pencil. Similarly, it was hard to write and, of course, to think. At times I felt very rational and able to do any work required of me, however, this was false, for when I tried to read or reason, I once again was not able to do it. The feeling of clarity usually came while standing outside talking to people - in a situation where no particular mental action was being required of me. During classroom work in the morning, I was unable to keep my mind on a map long enough to plot coordinates. After considerable difficulty in determining what the sequence of numbers was in the coordinate, I found that I could get no farther than finding the grid square before I would either lose interest or forget the coordinate.

Subject has been asleep for an hour and a half. The agent doesn't seem to affect the subject at all. All the things on the list that he is supposed to act like he does none of them. He only complains of having a dry mouth.

1355 - The real fuzzy, thick, wavy feeling is gone now. I still feel hungry, although I ate & enjoyed it - as I remember, I went through the chow line twice. The food tasted OK, but didn't really satisfy. The feeling of a slight backache across the kidneys. Things are better now, but I don't feel anything urgent about the problems we are getting. I am silly, & only interested in the passage of time & the serving of chow.

Mr. Zabala was quite cooperative during testing, adopting an attitude of task orientation, and paying close attention to instructions. Perseverance seemed improved on this occasion.

He complained, however, that he hadn't been able to think too well and that occasionally his mind would go blank for a minute or two. This, however, was not evident during testing.

Psychological Evaluation

Mr. Zabala's intellectual level does not show the impairment it did on Post-Drug I testing. His judgment, however, and his ability to size up situations is not up to the Pre-Drug level; nor is his ability to pay attention quite up to par. Visual-motor coordination and organization is improved, perhaps reflecting a greater ability to concentrate than was apparent during Pre-Drug

There is no evidence of memory impairment or organicity. Judgment and ability to size up situations are still not up to "Pre-Drug" level, although his ability to concentrate and pay attention have improved slightly.

Anthony (Alphonso F.) Zabala- Holmesburg Prison
Post Exposure Analysis:

Only one noticeable change in Mr. Zabala's personality is indicated. He appears to have less drive and is more apathetic and listless than during Pre-Drug testing. Less irritability, however, is also apparent.
