



Electronic Records Research at the National Archives

The Electronic Records Division (RDE) of the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) acquires, preserves, and provides access to U.S. Federal Government electronic records of continuing value.



The holdings include electronic records created by numerous executive branch agencies, various Presidential commissions, the Executive Office of the President, and the courts.

Most of the records date since the 1960s, with some dating as early as World War II.

The subject areas represented in the holdings include agriculture, economic and financial statistics, demographics, labor, education, health and social services, attitudinal data, international issues, military, science and technology, and environment, to name a few.
