

National Archives at St. Louis: Understanding the 1973 NPRC Fire and Its Impact on Genealogical Research

The catastrophic fire at the National Personnel Records Center in 1973 destroyed millions of military personnel records and presents a variety of challenges for researchers. This presentation will examine the fire, record losses, and common myths, and will provide guidance on how to research the records of veterans who were affected

by the fire. Part of overcoming these challenges is knowing about other records that are available to supplement information lost in the fire. This presentation will highlight those record series at the National Archives at St. Louis and their usefulness for unlocking information from the past.



Triage: Saving What Could be Saved

Triage: Saving What Could be Saved (continued)

Triage: Saving What Could be Saved (continued)



A portion of "tent city." Stacked rows of milk crates can be seen in the middle left. Several thousand crates were purchased for the salvage operation. The square columns of stacked crates were called "hog pens."








- Not all World War II records were destroyed in the fire.

United States Navy Record Group 24: Records of the Bureau of Naval Personnel









Lambrecht, 17051814, Air Corps, was reported missing in action since 20 June 1944, in Germany, while in flying pay status, by Gasualty Shipsent No. 110, ETO, and was presented dead as of 21 June 1945, under the provisions of Section 5, Missing Ferrons Act.

 Missing Air Grew Report No. 5897, dated 11 June 1944, and submitted by the 96th Group, 339th Squadron, reveals that subject enlisted man was a crew member, consisting of ten men, of a 8-170 sype aircraft, serial No. 42-102612, which departed AF Station 136, (England) on an operational mis-sion to Magdeburg, Germany, on 20 June 1944. The aircraft was last sighted over the target area, at 0915 hours and was believed to have been lost as the regult of enemy aircraft fire. 3. A request for the Service Record for Tec Sergeant Lambrecht, or for the disposition made of it, was addressed to the Commanding General, European Theater of Operations, on 19 April 1945. This communication was returned by lith indersement stating that the Service Record had been forwarded to the War Department 21 July 1944, At the time the case was reviewed and Technical Sergeant Lambrecht was presized dead, a diligent search was made for the Service Record, but it could not be located. At the present date it is not on file in his enlisted jacket.

4. Captured German Becords, now of record in this office, record the downing of a FORTRESS at 0930, 20 June 1944 at Erxleben, 29 km west-north-west Magdeburg, Germany, scrial No. 2102612, and lists by name and scrial No. nine members of the crew as prisoners. The name of subject enlisted wan is not included in their me

cording. The report also shows that the prisoners were captured at 1200 hours on the outskirts of Hillersleben, Germany.

5. The following statements are quoted from the Individual Casualty Questionnaires filled in by the returned crew members regarding Technical Sergeant Lambrecht:

By S Sgt. Glenn A. Smith. 19149725:

"Heard him start fireing on E/A attacking. I saw him (or I believed it to be him) fall below the plane as I prepared to jump from the rear door. His chute was not yet open. My beleaf is that he was murdered by civilians upon reaching the ground and that his body was hidden to prevent disclosure of the crime. I was the second person to leave the plane. I reached the ground at 0930 all other crew members bailed out successfully and were picked up by the enery with the exception of Top-turret gunner, T/Sgt Lambrecht, Alexander John 19051679 (Believed to be the first man to bail out). Aircraft exploded before striking the ground. No one was left in the aircraft."

By 1st Lt. Richard DeBrandes 0808798:

"He said 'The Top Turret guns are damaged and No. 2 and 3 engines were afire.' He was not injured to my knowledge. Upon interrogation of my crew shortly after capture results: Waist Gunners believed to have seen Sgt. Lambrecht's leave plane with parachute. Supposition: Due to the treatment we received from German civilians and German Landwatchers which was brutal and hostile, we believe that Sgt. Lasbrecht had he fallen into their hands may have been killed. This is my personal bolief."

By 2nd Lt. Joe Cuincy Armstrong, 0757679:

"He was lst man to jump, leaving before the Navigator. Last seen-Jumping through escape hatch in nose. I was told by a German Interrogator that they hadn't been able to find him. The civilians were very hostile giving us all a bad time, what with beating us & all. MORIA direraft blew up in ate."
