Methodology

- 1. Collateral Lines find your ancestors siblings
 - Check 1850 and later census for the place where your ancestor lived, note other families with the same surname
 - Check ages of household members for possible parents along with places of birth
 - Check post-1850 census to see if elderly parents are in the household with siblings
 - Look at published genealogies, town histories, newspapers, church records, etc., to find records to confirm sibling relationships



Methodology, cont.

2. Find Your Ancestor's Parents

- * Using Ancestry or other census websites, search for the surname of interest in the state where your ancestor was born. Check census depending on year of birth of your ancestor.
- Check each family and match the ages with the siblings you've found
- Check previous and future years to locate the family and check children's ages




Methodology, cont.

3. Use other sources to confirm findings

Use <u>www.familysearch.org</u> to find microfilmed records from the area where they lived to confirm findings

Check on-line sources such as USGenWeb, local historical societies, or a local library where your ancestors lived

Israel Goodman b. 13 Oct. 1822 in Marietta Township, Lancaster, PA. He married Elizabeth Finley on 11 Dec. 1845 in Delaware, Delaware County, Ohio. He died on 4 July 1890 in Indianola, Warren County, Iowa.

Elizabeth Finley was born 19 April 1828 in Delaware, Delaware County, Ohio and died on 14 Oct. 1900 in Indianola, Warren County, Iowa.

Israel and Elizabeth's children were:

- 1. Samuel Oscar "Butch" Goodman, b. 10 Sept. 1847 in Delaware, Ohio

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Finding Migration Routes in Federal Census Records

Probably the most useful set of records held by the National Archives and Records Administration for migration studies is the federal census. The key to using the census for migration research is to work methodically back through time from census to census, starting with the most recent known point of residence. Researchers may also have information that tells where a family started out, or what the stops were along the way, and this will simplify the search. And, as long as the search is in the records after 1850, each census can hold the clues to a migration route.

Finding the census at the last residence, or in any census after 1850, can show the researcher where children were born, which is an important element in tracing the migration route. And, beginning in 1870, the census also shows places of birth of the parents which suggests where they started from.

For example, I knew from my mother that my great grandfather, Israel Goodman, lived in Indianola, Iowa. She had no idea where he was from but she did remember sitting on her grandmother Sophia's lap listening to stories of a wagon train. Her cousin Dorothy filled in the fact that the wagon train went from Ohio to Iowa. The 1870 census for Indianola, Iowa, shows Israel's place of birth as Pennsylvania and his father's birthplace listed as Germany with his mother's birthplace listed as Pennsylvania.1

The 1870 census also helps me determine the route the family took to Iowa. It shows that

Westward Ho! New Englanders to Ohio

The manuscript collections of the New England Historic Genealogical Society contain two narrow hand-sewn books, titled Book of numbers of the city lots, drawn on the east bank of Muskingum, July 1, 1788 and the Draught of the several lots drawn for the proprietors of the Ohio Company. Both books record essentially the same information in neat flowing script: the name and residence of each of the one thousand would-be emigrants belonging to the Ohio Company of Associates. The majority of the subscribers intended to move to new territory in Ohio and leave New England permanently. They hailed from all over New England - from the cities of Boston, Providence, and Hartford, as well as from rural towns such as Durham, New Hampshire, Sanford, Maine, and Hebron, Connecticut. By July of 1788 many subscribers could already list their place of residence as Ohio.

The groundwork for westward migration out of New England — and the entire Eastern Seaboard - was laid when the Continental Congress of the United States passed the Northwest Ordinance in July of 1787. The Ordinance established the Northwest Territory, which included the land west of Pennsylvania between the Ohio and the Mississippi rivers — the area that later became the states of Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, Wisconsin, and part of Minnesota. This land had been officially ceded to the United States as part of the Treaty of Paris in 1783 and was first made available for settlement through the Northwest Ordinance. The Northwest Ordinance also established policies for the sale of land, formation of government, advancement of education, the preservation of civil liberties, and the exclusion of slavery. Using Maps in Genealogical Research

An 1880 map of Osage County, Kansas, reveals the opportunities and the results of settlement in the county during the twenty some years before its publication. The map shows township, range and section lines from the federal survey preparatory to settlement; village boundaries and subdivisions of village centers into blocks; rivers, creeks and springs; public and private roads; railroads – the Atchison Topeka & Santa Fe, the Carbondale & Lawrence, and the proposed St. Louis & Walnut Valley as well as train stations; post offices, numbered schoolhouses, and churches which lie outside of village centers; cemeteries; coal mines; stone quarries; and brick and lime kilns.

The map implies considerable information for the genealogist. It shows population density in the number and extent of villages; the abundance of rivers, creeks and streams suggests that the area is hospitable to settlement throughout; the network of roads and railroads reinforces those assumptions and provides the possibility of travel within and beyond the area. However, in an area that flooded frequently before the building of lakes and dams in the second half of the twentieth century, the presence of so many rivers and creeks may also indicate the vulnerability of the settlers' homes. The presence of stone quarries, brick and lime kilns and saw mills suggests the materials used in building homes, public buildings, and streets. The coal mines provide useful data on the economy, available jobs and sources of income as well as the nature of fuel used for heating. A Flouring Mill and Cheese Factory reveal nutritional

possibilities for the early residents. The schools and churches that dot the countryside indicate values in the culture and the frequency and nature of social interaction.

An Illustrated Historical Atlas of Osage County, Kansas, Compiled, Drawn and Published from Personal Examinations and Surveys, was published in Philadelphia by Edwards Brothers in 1879, just a year earlier. In addition to less detailed county and state maps, the atlas also has individual and special features of their land such as the presence of coal mines. Their names may be linked to institutions such as banks, newspapers or factories. And as one researches other sources, newspapers of the period, census records, photographs, or family letters, for example, it becomes possible to test the assumptions made from the map just as the map may be used to test the hypotheses created from other data.


maps for each township and village in the county. The township maps, on a scale of two inches to the mile, show further subdivisions of sections with names of landowners, the number of acres owned, and the location of the farmhouse on the property. Greater detail in these maps allows one to see spurs from the main line of the railroad off to coal mines.


Village maps of varying scales show the layout of streets and their names, the location of post offices, churches, schools, banks, factories, public parks and squares and other significant institutions such as newspaper publishers and min-

> ing companies. For churches the denomination is given. Banks, parks and squares, publishers and mining company owners are named. The product of factories is identified.


The detail of township and village maps significantly enhances the genealogist's understanding of the lives of ancestors. From the maps one can know not only where ancestors lived in 1879 but also who their neighbors were and the distance between their houses. The presence of several farmhouses on one owner's property suggests multiple related families in a community living close to each other. One can determine the proximity of their homes to post offices and to towns where they might have shopped. There are clues to where the children might have attended school, where the family might have worshipped and where they might have buried their dead. There are implications as to their assets in the size and location of the land holdings




NOTE:

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Finding Family Relationships on Pre-1850 Census

Methodology

- 1. Using post-1850 census, vital records, genealogies, etc., find siblings for your ancestor.
 - a. Check 1850 census for the place your ancestor was living, note other families with the same surname.
 - b. Check ages of those heads of household to see if they might be parents or siblings.
 - c. Check 1860, 1870, 1880 for all known siblings to see if elderly parents are living in the household.
 - d. Look at published genealogies, town histories, newspapers, church records, probate records, etc., to find records to confirm sibling relationships.

Methodology, cont.

- 2. Using published pre-1850 census indexes, Ancestry.com or Heritagequest.com, compile listings of that surname for the state where your ancestor was born.
 - a. If your ancestor was born in the 1820s, like Israel Goodman, look at the 1830 and 1840 census.
 - b. Once you have the list compiled, start checking each family and match the ages with the siblings you've found to rule out families.
 - c. Once you've narrowed the field to a few families in a certain year, check previous and later census to see if the families are still there or have moved.


Methodology, cont.

- 3. When you have only a few families left, it's time to go to other sources, hopefully to confirm your findings.
 - a. Using <u>www.familysearch.org's</u> on-line catalog to their microfilm holdings, check the location to see if any church, probate or tax records, genealogies, or newspapers are available.
 - b. Order films from your local Family History Center (in Pittsfield at the Berkshire Athenaeum).
 - c. Check on-line resources such as USGenWeb, the local historical society in the area you're researching, or the local library to see if they have anything available.






