We invite you to discover the resources of your local National Archives branch and explore ways to enrich your social studies lessons and increase your historical understanding.



### **Archives:7358 - Introduction to Research & Resources at the National Archives**

Saturday, October 9: 9:00 AM – Noon

Discover the resources of the National Archives including the new *DocsTeach* web site! This workshop will provide guidance into conducting research at the National Archives at Chicago. Techniques will be shared to help you locate materials for classroom use on-site and online.

### **Crime of the '20s through Court Records**

Saturday, November 13: 1:00 – 3:00 PM

Culture clashes of the '20s can be seen in the "noble experiment" of Prohibition. This workshop will highlight the underside of Prohibition through U.S. District Court records. From the infamous Al Capone to the pedestrian, bootlegging police officer turned Leavenworth jailbird, we will examine cases and documents that can be used to help build your students' time period insights and literacy skill set.

### **American Indians of the Great Lakes**

Saturday, December 11: 10:00 AM – Noon

Enrich your students' understanding of the relationship between American Indians and the federal government during the twentieth century. From American Indian boarding schools to post-WWII urban relocation of Indians and other government assimilation efforts, this workshop will provide an entrée into the Great Lakes American Indians.

### **Becoming a U.S. Citizen**

Saturday, January 8: 10:00 AM – Noon

Explore the history of U.S. citizenship through National Archives documents. We will review early 20<sup>th</sup> century declaration of intentions and naturalization petitions, Chinese Exclusion Act case files, and other records relating to citizenship, including female repatriation documents (after citizenship lost due to marriage). Curriculum connections and ideas for classroom use will also be shared.

### **"Keep 'em Shooting": Activities of the World War II Midwest Home Front**

Saturday, March 12: 10:00 AM – Noon

Investigate the story of WWII mobilization and production efforts. From files demonstrating closed gate practices and the activities of the Fair Employment Practices Commission to ordnance plant propaganda pieces to celebrity draft cards, this workshop will feature documents that highlight various aspects of the WWII Midwest home front, as well as curricular components.

Sir: It being my intention to leave the United States on a temporary visit abroad, departing and returning through the Chinese port of entry of Szechuan, Peking, I hereby apply, under the provisions of Rule 23 of the Chinese Regulations (Hunan Circular No. 23), for reinvestigation of my claimed status as an American citizen by birth, submitting herewith such documentary proofs (if any) as I possess, and agreeing to appear in your office personally, and to produce therein witnesses, for oral examination regarding the claim made by me.

This application is submitted, in triplicate with my photograph attached to each copy, as required by said rule.
