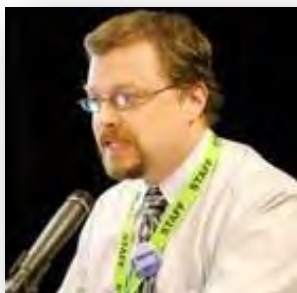

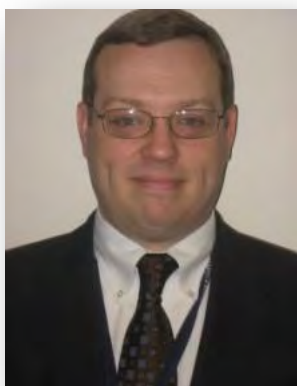
**Gavin, Alison**

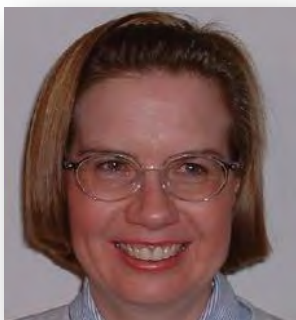

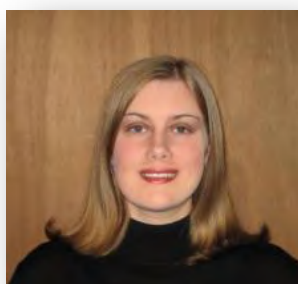
