Subject: Americans to Free Captive Nations, Inc.

[REDACTED] of our organization recently met with the President and Board Chairman of Americans to Free Captive Nations, Inc., Mr. Alfred Korn. From this meeting [REDACTED] ascertained the following information regarding this organization:

Americans to Free Captive Nations, Inc., evolved from the Republican Nationalities Committees of the 1964 Presidential campaign. Mr. Korn had been active in the campaign in the New York area. Having elicited the cooperation of many of the exiles represented on the Board of Directors, Mr. Korn felt that the opportunity to continue the association should not be missed.

The activities of this new organization appear to lie mainly in the area of "manifestations", resolutions, declarations, etc. The attached literature indicates that the "causes" of many and varied peoples of the world are represented, including the Ukraine, Czechia, Slovakia, White Ruthenia, Mainland China, Armenia, etc. In its literature Americans to Free Captive Nations, Inc., describes itself as "...an American nationalist anti-totalitarian organization supported by industrialists."

Mr. Korn is by profession a public accountant, obviously not too successful financially though not lacking in ambition. He seemed on the surface well-intentioned, though puzzled as to how to get his organization rolling. The organization's office in the Pan Am Building is actually a corner of a conference room and serves merely as a post office address and telephone center. Its chief hope for funds rests with the Fu-Yen Free Catholic University on Taiwan. In his conversation with [REDACTED] Mr.

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informally solicited Free Europe's support; however, [REDACTED] offered no hope.

Prior to contacting [REDACTED] Mr. Korn had held preliminary discussions with Brutus Coste at the ACEN last spring. At that time he received Mr. Coste's sympathy and tentative agreement to cooperate on certain projects such as Captive Nations Week. Mr. Korn asked [REDACTED] to offer him the same cooperation when feasible during the course of the year. [REDACTED] told Mr. Korn that if a situation arose in which cooperation was possible he would contact him.

To our knowledge, there has been no contact between Mr. Korn and any of Free Europe's other affiliated organizations. Because of the inclusion of many separatist groups in Mr. Korn's outfit, if any contacts were made, it is doubtful that they would be encouraged.

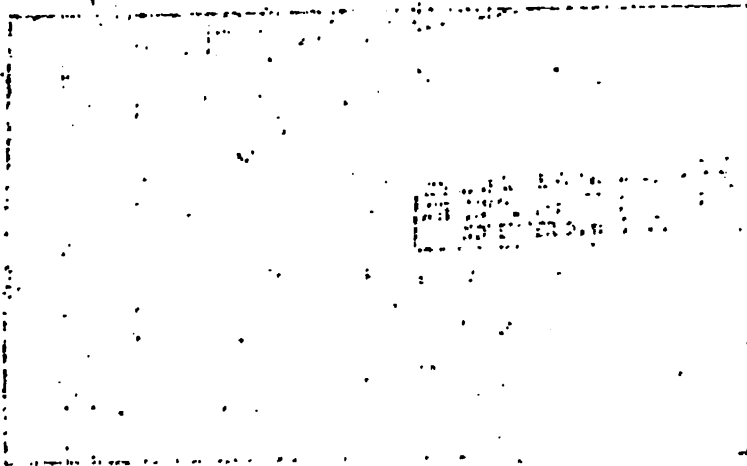

## RESOLUTIONS

We, the participants of the anti-communist Manifestation, initiated and organized by the Americans to Free Captive Nations, Inc., held on November 27, 1965, at the High School of Fashion Industries in New York, hereby affirm the following resolution:



These Resolutions were signed by the Representatives of:

America (U.S.A.), Albania, Azerbaijan,  
Byelorussia, Bulgaria, Nat. China, Czechoslovakia,  
Croatia, Idel-Ural, North Caucas, Poland,  
Georgia, Germany, Serbia, Slovakia, Tibet,  
Viet Nam and Ukraine.

1. We fully support the U.S. government efforts to put an end to the Soviet Russia and Red China aggression in South Viet Nam whose purpose is to destroy its national freedom and state independence, and to enslave not only its people but other nations in Asia, thus using their defeat as a springboard for seizure of the whole world into Communist slavery.

2. We send our warm greetings to our brave soldiers who heroically fight in the jungles of South Viet Nam for freedom, and appeal to all freedom-loving Americans to manifest your moral support to them by giving your blood to the wounded.

3. In the name of the traditional principles of freedom and democracy, defending the statements of the Bill of Rights, we firmly condemn the Communist followers, blind pacifists, ignorant beatniks, agitated students for their actions against U.S. policy in South Viet Nam which are used by our enemies to morally weaken the U.S.

4. We stand for the peace in the whole world, but we want the just peace that guarantees freedom for all nations and countries. We believe that their peace must be by all means protected, otherwise every appeasement, every concession to the Communist aggression inspires them to further expansion which leads to a new inevitable world's war. The peace can be saved if Soviet Russia and Red China will be constantly aware that we are alert and determined to defend our peace and freedom.

5. Moscow and Peking shamelessly accuse, by their false propaganda and in the statements of their official representatives, the U.S. of their "colonialism" and "imperialism" although they know that the U.S. gained not an inch of foreign territory **neither** after the First World War nor after the Second World War; that the U.S. enslaved no nation, whereas the Soviet Russia and Red China did.

6. We state that freedom and independence of the free countries in the world are threatened by Communist colonial imperialism. In our time of downfall of the colonial empires and rising of the national independence states, the vast Communist colonial empire, under the name of U.S.S.R., still remains; it continuously threatens the whole world and the free countries. This empire exploits brutally not only non-Russian nations within the U.S.S.R., but also nations of so-called "satellites."

7. We testify that the characteristic features of Red Moscow and Red Peking enslavement are the most inhuman and cruel, such as expropriation, expropriation, pauperization, slave labor, suppression of human rights and fundamental freedoms, Russification, terror, murder, mass deportation of the population of the captive nations.

In committing and continuing these acts, Soviet Russia violated the United Nations Charter, the United Nations Declaration, the Atlantic Charter, the Convention on the Suppression of the Crimes on Genocide, and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights -- all these documents bearing the signatures of the U.S.S.R. representatives.

8. Therefore, we request the United Nations, the U.S. government and the U.S. representatives in the United Nations to put on the agenda of its General Assembly the problem of the Soviet-Moscow colonialism in Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Armenia, Georgia, Azerbaijan, Byelorussia, Bulgaria, Czechia, Cossackia, East Germany, Hungary, Idel-Ural, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, North Caucasus, Turkistan, Ukraine, and in other countries subjugated by Communist imperialism such as Albania, Cuba, Tibet, North Viet Nam and North Korea enslaved by Red China. We condemn such colonialism and ask to exclude all Communist governments from the United Nations, and in their stead to admit the authorized representatives of the captive nations.

9. We warn our government and the whole free world against the policy of so-called co-existence which aims at the recognition by the free world of the status quo of Red Russia and Red China conquests as basis for the subversion action in the free world and for their further expansion to enslave free countries.

10. We support the Public Law 86-90 of the Captive Nations Week resolution of the U.S. Congress which expresses sympathy for the aspirations of peoples everywhere and to recognize the independence of the nations of the world such as Poland, Hungary, Lithuania, Ukraine, Czechia, Slovakia, Latvia, Estonia, White Ruthenia, East Germany, Bulgaria, mainland China, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, North Korea, Albania, Idel-Ural, Tibet, Cossackia, Turkistan, North Viet Nam and other nations against Communist tyranny and Red Moscow and Red Chinese foreign rule, and urge the re-establishment of their national freedom and state independence. Slovakia should also be recognized as an independent state.

11. We also back up the members of the U.S. Congress in their efforts to establish a standing committee to deal
