Subject: Americans to Free Nations, Inc.

met with the President and Board Chairman of Americans to Free Captive Nations, Inc., Mr. Alfred Korn. From this meeting ascertained the following information regarding this organization:

Americans to Free Captive Nations, Inc., evolved from the Republican Nationalities Committees of the 1964 Presidential compoign. Mr. Korn had been active in the campaign in the New York area. Having elicited the cooperation of many of the exiles represented on the Board of Directors, Mr. Korn felt that the opportunity to continue the association should not be missed.

. The activites of this new organization appear to lie mainly in the area of "manifestations", resolutions, declarations, etc. The attached literature indicates that the "causes" of many and varied peoples of the world are represented, including the Ukraine, Czechia, Slovakia, White Ruthenia, Mainland China, Armenia, etc. In its literature Americans to Free Captive Nations, Inc., describes itself as "...on American nationalist anti-totaliterian organization supported by industrialists."

Mr. Kern is by profession a public accountant, obviously not too successful financially though not lacking in ambition. He seemed on the surface well-intentioned, though puzzled as to now to get his organizationed,

Prior to contacting Mr. Korn had held preliminary discussions with Brutus Coste at the ACEN last spring. At that time he received Mr. Coste's sympathy and tentative agreement to cooperate on certain projects such as Captive Nations Week. Mr. Korn asked to offer him the same cooperation when feasible during the course of the year. Told Mr. Korn that if a situation arose in which cooperation was possible he would contact him.

To our knowledge, there has been no contact between Mr. Korn and any of Free Europe's other affiliated organizations. Because of the inclusion of many separatist groups in Mr. Korn's outift, if any contacts were made, it is doubtful that they would be encouraged.

RESOLUTIONS

We, the participants of the anti-communist Manifestation, initiated and organized by the Americans to Free Captive Nations. Inc., Held on Nevember 27, 1905, at the High School of Fashion Industries in New York, hereby affirm the following resolution:

These Resolutions were signed by the Representatives of:

America (B.S.A.), Albania, Arceloui) or, Byelorussia, Bulgaria, Nat. Chena, Consackia, Croatia, Idel-Bral, North Catens, Poland, Georgia, Germany, Serbio, Slovakia, Tibet, Viet Nam and Ukraine. 1. We fully support the U.S. government efforts to put an end to the Soviet Russia and Red China aggression in South Viet Nam whose purpose is to destroy its national freedom and state independence, and to enslave not only its people but other nations in Asia, thus using their defeat as a springboard for seizure of the whole world into Communist slavery.

- 2.. We send our warm prectings to our brave soldiers who heroically fight in the jumples of South Viet Ram for freedom, and appeal to all freedom-loving Americans to manifest your moral support to them by giving your blood to the wanded.
- 5. In the name of the traditional principles of freedom and democracy, defending the statements of the Hill of Rights, we firmly condemn the Communist followers, blind pacifists, ignorant beatniks, agi ated students for their actions against U.S. policy in South Viet Mam which are used by our enemies to morally weaken the U.S.
- 4. We stand for the peace in the whole world, but we want the just peace that guarantees freedom for all nations and countries. We believe that their peace must be by all means protected, otherwise every appearament, every concession to the Communist aggression inspires them to further expansion which leads to a new inevitable world's war. The peace can be saved if Soviet Russia and Red China will be constantly aware that we are alert and determined to defend our peace and freedom.
- 5. Moscow and Peking shamelessiy accuse, by their false propaganda and in the statements of their official representatives, the U.S. of their "colonialism" and "imperialism" although they know that the U.S. gained not an inchest foreign territory neither after the First World War nor after the Sucond World War; that the U.S. ensured no nation, wherear the Soviet Russia and Red China aid.
- o. We state that freedom and andependence of the free countries in the world are threatened by Communist coloral imperialism. In our time of downfall of the colonial empires and rising of the national independence states, the vast Communist colonial empire, under the name of U.S.S.R., still remains; it continuously threatens the whole world and the free countries. This empire exploits brutally not only non-Russian nations within the U.S.S.R., but also nations of so-called "satellites."

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7. he testify that the characteristic reacures of Red Moscow and Red Peking enslavement are the most infaman and eracl, such as expropriation, ex initation, paraperlation, slave labor, suppression of inuous rights and fundamental freedoms, Russification, terror, madder, mass deportation of the population of the control and const.

In committing and continuing these nots, Soviet Russia violated the United Nations Charter, the United Nations Declaration, the Atlantic Charter, the Convention on the Suppression of the Crimes on Genocide, and the Universal Declaration of Human Rights -- all those documents bearing the signatures of the U.S.S.R. representatives.

- 2. Therefore, we request the United Nations, the U.S. government and the U.S. representatives in the United Nations to put on the agenda of its General Assembly the problem of the Soviet-Moscow colonialism in Estenda, Latvia, Lichuchia, Armenia, Georgia, Azerba, jan, prelorussia, Bulgaria, Ctechia, Cossatkia, Bast Germany, lingury, Idel-Ural, Poland, Rumanza, Slovakia, North Cincasia, Turkestan, Ukraine, and in other countries subjugated by Communist imperialism such as Albania, Cuba, Tiber, Morth Viat Namend North Korea enslaved by Red China. We condemn such solonialism and ask to exclude all Communic governments from the United Nations, and in their stead to adait the authorized representatives of the captive nations.
- 9. We warn our government and the whole free world against the policy of so-called co-existence which also at the recognition by the free world of the status quo of Red Russia and Red China conquests as basis for the subversion action in the free world and for their further expansion to enslave free counties.

- 11. We also back up the members of the H.S. Congress in their efforts to establish a standing committee to deal

 with the problems of the captive nations, and to establish a Freedom Academy to serve the cause of their national independence.

12. Ne speak out for the liberation of the Chinese, Ecteans, Germans, Victoracse, and the re-unification of countries and peoples divided by Communist aggressors.

.13. To warn the Western world against supporting Titelam, which is the Trojan horse of Communism, and to support the re-establishment of the freedom and national independence of the Creatians, Serbians, Slevenians, and Macedonians, who are now condensed to live under Tato's regime of Communist Lyraphy.

114. We demand a just peace among all the peoples of the world a peace which presupposes the liquidation of every form of national subjugation, and the realization of indivisible freedom the world over.

. 15. We advocate the abti-communist freedom movements everywhere in the world where people are fighting dictatorable and seeking the pre-establishment of freedom and independence.

16. The nations in Asia and Africa would be every ascillable and means, expose the decline of Communism as an ideology which is foundated, and the college of the Communist rule which is frutal in instare, and should make it plain that their national and economic welfare to correct thoroughly erradicatedary their and misconception about Communism in consciousness as well as in form.

'The A global strategy for the advance of freedom should be formulated and adopted to unify all anti-communist efforts of the Free Warll to defeat Communism. In this global struggle against Communism the national and continental anti-communist efforts should be well coordinated components.
