USE OF AN AIRCRAFT TO HOUSE AN ALTERNATE COM-MAND AUTHORITY ENHANCES THE SURVIVABILITY OF A COM-MAND AND CONTROL SYSTEM UNDER NUCLEAR ATTACK. PRE-VIOUSLY, THE SOVIETS HAVE DEPENDED ON REDUNDANCY IN AND HARDENING OF GROUND-BASED FACILITIES FOR THIS PURPOSE, BUT RELIANCE SOLELY ON THIS APPROACH IS UNSATISFACTORY BECAUSE OF THE VULNERABILITY OF ANY SITE WHICH CAN BE TARGETED FOR A NUCLEAR STRIKE.

IT IS NOT CERTAIN WHETHER THE AIRBORNE SYSTEM IS NOW OPERATIONAL OR HOW MANY AIRCRAFT THE SOVIETS MAY CHOOSE TO DEPLOY. WHEN OPERATIONAL, HOWEVER, EMPLOYMENT OF AN AIRBORNE COMMAND POST ON A CONTINU-OUS BASIS WOULD SERVE TO HEIGHTEN THE CONFIDENCE OF THE SOVIETS BOTH IN THEIR ABILITY TO RESPOND IN THE FACE OF AN UNEXPECTED NUCLEAR ATTACK AND IN THF CREDIBILITY OF THEIR DETERRENT.
