continued by adjournment to and including the 25th
day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand
nine hundred and fourteen.

SOUTHERN DISTRICT OF NEW YORK, ss: The Jurors
of the United States of America, within and for the
District aforesaid, on their oath present that
MARGARET H. SANGER, late of the City and County of
New York, in the District aforesaid, heretofore, to
wit, on the twenty-seventh day of March in the year
of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fourteen,
at the Southern District of New York and within the
jurisdiction of this Court, unlawfully, willfully,
knowingly and feloniously did deposit and cause to
be deposited in the Post Office Establishment of
the United States, to wit, at the General Post
Office, in the City and County of New York, in the
District aforesaid, an authorized depository for
mail matter, for mailing and delivery, certain non-
mailable matter, that is to say, a certain obscene,
lewd, lascivious and filthy pamphlet, paper and pub-
lication of an indecent character, contained then
and there in a paper wrapper, post-paid and addressed
to:

"Mrs. M. Gorham
Butte Mont."

and the said pamphlet, paper and publication contained eight printed pages; and in and upon the first page thereof, the same being Page 1, upon the top thereof, appeared the following words and figures, to wit:

"The
WOMAN
REBEL
No Gods No Masters
Vol.I. March 1914 No.1.

and in and upon the first page thereof appeared the following printed matter, to wit:

"It will also be the aim of the WOMAN REBEL to advocate the prevention of conception and to impart such knowledge in the columns of this paper."

and in and upon the eighth page thereof appeared certain printed matter, the same comprising an article entitled:

"THE PREVENTION OF CONCEPTION",

but the said article is of such vile, obscene, filthy and indecent character that a further description thereof would defile the records of this Court, and therefore such description is not set forth in this indictment;

And the said MARGARET H. SANGER, at the time when and at the place where she so as aforesaid deposited and caused to be deposited the said pamphlet, paper and publication in the said Post Office, well knew the contents thereof; against the peace of the United States and their dignity, and contrary to the form of the statute of the United States in such case made and provided. (§211 U.S.C.C.)
