Dear Mr. Flood:

In accordance with the requirements of the Presidential Records Act (PRA), as amended, 44 U.S.C. §§2201-2209, this letter constitutes a formal notice from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to the incumbent President of our intent to open George W. Bush Presidential records in response to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests listed in Attachment A.

This material, consisting of 176,699 pages and 20,916 electronic files, has been reviewed for the six PRA Presidential restrictive categories, including confidential communications requesting or submitting advice (P5) and material related to appointments to federal office (P2), as they were eased by President George W. Bush on November 15, 2010. These records were also reviewed for all applicable FOIA exemptions. As a result of this review, 72,889 pages and 3,092 electronic files in whole and 11,724 pages and 11,307 electronic files in part have been restricted. Therefore, NARA is proposing to open the remaining 92,086 and 6,517 electronic files in whole and 11,724 pages and 11,307 electronic files in part that do not require closure under 44 U.S.C. § 2204. A copy of any records proposed for release under this notice will be provided to you upon your request.

We are also concurrently informing former President George W. Bush's representative, Freddy Ford, of our intent to release these records. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a), NARA will release the records 60 working days from the date of this letter, which is February 19, 2019, unless the former or incumbent President requests a one-time extension of an additional 30 working days or asserts a constitutionally based privilege, in accordance with 44 U.S.C. 2208(b)-(d). Please let us know if you are able to complete your review before the expiration of the 60 working day period. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a)(1)(B), we will make this notice available to the public on the NARA website.

Bush Presidential records proposed for opening are acts and bills, cables, calendars, chronologies, correspondence, cover sheets, distribution receipts, executive orders, fact sheets, forms, lists, National Intelligence Estimates, National Security Council Profile Sheets, unclassified National Security Presidential Directives, news articles, notes, press releases, a proclamation, Q and As, reports, schedules, statements, talking points, and transcripts. This FOIA primarily contains documents related to regime change in Iran, sanctions against Iran, Iran's nuclear ambitions, Iran financial assets, weapons of mass destruction, the Mojahedin-e Khalq (MEK), and reports related to counter-proliferation. These materials come in the form of news sources, timelines, reports to Congress, unclassified white papers, and open source reports. This FOIA also includes briefing book and trip book materials related to several trips President George W. Bush took between 2001 and 2005, notably to APEC meetings in 2001 and 2004; to G-8 Summits in 2003, 2004 and 2005; and to New York for the United Nations General Assembly in 2003. These briefing and trip book materials include scene setting reports on the places President George W. Bush would be visiting, calendars, press availabilities, talking points, and Q and As. There are also reports on Lebanon, the government structure of the Islamic Republic, several reports issued by the International Atomic Energy Agency, and copies of United Nations Security Council Resolutions. Lastly, this FOIA contains correspondence between President George W. Bush and members of Congress on matters related to Iran. These materials are from several staff office files in the National Security Council, the National Security Council-Records and Access Management PRS Originals files, and the White House Office of Records Management.

The George W. Bush Presidential textual records proposed for opening include Mail Analysis worksheets and database printouts on the collection, subject matter, and routing of mail. Additionally, there are samples of the public correspondence received: letters, emails, and group petitions. Much of the worksheet material categorizes incoming mail by intended destination: VIP, First Lady, pets, No Response Necessary (NRNs), and mail referred to federal agencies for additional action. Contained within the records is raw data on a weekly and monthly basis on the amount of incoming mail, as well as forms tracking the major national or international issues addressed in that correspondence. There are records that summarize the number of responses, by topic, sent by the White House. This FOIA also contains printed emails from the public that cover a variety of topics, dating from 2007 through 2008. The majority of the records date from 2006 through 2008. These materials are from the Office of Presidential Correspondence - Mail Analysis. Electronic records proposed for opening include emails transmitting various Mail Analysis reports which detail the amounts of mail received by various components of the White House Office of Presidential Correspondence as well as breakdowns of various topics. Also included are individual copies of Mail Analysis reports and a cover sheet for the reports. These records are from the Exchange Email, Automated Records Management System (ARMS), and WHO Shared Drive Search and Access Sets.

These materials are from the National Security Council and White House Office of Records Management Subject Files, and consist of memoranda requesting a delegation be sent to the State Funeral of former President Lennart Meri of Estonia on March 26, 2006 and congratulatory letters from President George W. Bush to Juhan Parts as he takes the position of prime minister and Siim Kallas as he leaves the position of prime minister. Also included is a letter from Estonian Minister of Foreign Affairs Kristiina Ojuland to Secretary of Commerce Donald L. Evans regarding Estonia's status as a non-market economy country and a letter from President Lennart Meri to President George W. Bush in August 2001. In addition, a request from the US-Baltic Foundation for a presidential message for their gala awards dinner honoring Former President Lennart Meri is present, including the presidential message and drafts thereof, background material, internet printouts, printed emails, and previous letters written to the foundation by President George W. Bush and President George H.W. Bush. Additionally, there are 9/11 condolence and support letters from numerous organizations both foreign and domestic as well as from foreign leaders such as President Lennart Meri, Prime Minister Mart Laar, the Dalai Lama, the President of Finland, the Prime Minister of Luxembourg, the Prime Minister of Denmark, and the Greenland Parliament. Electronic records proposed for opening consist of compiled lists of Presidential delegations, lists of foreign leaders attending the funeral service for President Ronald Reagan, and lists of current and former world leaders. Additionally, these records contain memoranda requesting a delegation be sent to the State Funeral of former President Lennart Meri of Estonia, Department of State protocol assignments for upcoming foreign visits and trips, and thank you letters to world leaders for their congratulations on the 2001 election. Electronic records proposed for opening consist of pool reports, press gaggles, press briefings, press releases, remarks, articles, scheduling materials, logistical information regarding the trip to Prairie Chapel Ranch, translation and interpretation information and feedback, the menu for the dinner at Prairie Chapel Ranch with President Vladimir Putin, and photos of the visit. These electronic records are from the Automated Records Management System (ARMS) Search and Access Set.

In accordance with the requirements of the Presidential Records Act (PRA), as amended, 44 U.S.C. §§2201-2209, this letter constitutes a formal notice from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to you, as former President George W. Bush's representative, of our intent to open George W. Bush Presidential records. These records were processed under the systematic processing projects and Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests described in Attachment A.

These records, consisting of 176,699 pages and 20,916 electronic files, have been reviewed for the six PRA Presidential restrictive categories, including confidential communications requesting or submitting advice (P5) and material related to appointments to federal office (P2), as they were eased by President George W. Bush on November 15, 2010. These pages were also reviewed for all applicable FOIA exemptions. As a result of this review, NARA has restricted 72,889 pages and 3,092 electronic files in whole and 11,724 pages and 11,307 electronic files in part. NARA is proposing to open the remaining 92,086 pages and 6,517 electronic files in whole and 11,724 pages and 11,307 electronic files in part that do not require closure under 44 U.S.C. § 2204. A copy of any records proposed for release under this notice will be made available to you upon your request.

We are also concurrently informing the incumbent President of our intent to release these George W. Bush Presidential records. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a), NARA will release the records 60 working days from the date of this letter, which is February 19, 2019, unless the former or incumbent President requests a one-time extension of an additional 30 working days or asserts a constitutionally based privilege, in accordance with 44 U.S.C. 2208(b)-(d). Please let us know if you are able to complete your review before the expiration of the 60 working day period. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a)(1)(B), we will make this notice available to the public on the NARA website.
