Dear Mr. Cipollone:

In accordance with the requirements of the Presidential Records Act (PRA), as amended, 44 U.S.C. §§2201-2209, this letter constitutes a formal notice from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to the incumbent President of our intent to open George W. Bush Presidential records in response to the systematic processing projects and Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests listed in Attachment A.

This material, consisting of 41,082 pages and 13,854 assets, has been reviewed for the six PRA Presidential restrictive categories, including confidential communications requesting or submitting advice (P5) and material related to appointments to federal office (P2), as they were eased by President George W. Bush on November 15, 2010. These records were also reviewed for all applicable FOIA exemptions. As a result of this review, 19,500 pages and 7,840 assets in whole and 1,979 pages and 625 assets in part have been restricted. Therefore, NARA is proposing to open the remaining 19,603 pages and 5,389 assets in whole and 1,979 pages and 625 assets in part that do not require closure under 44 U.S.C. § 2204. A copy of any records proposed for release under this notice will be provided to you upon your request.

We are also concurrently informing former President George W. Bush's representative, Freddy Ford, of our intent to release these records. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a), NARA will release the records 60 working days from the date of this letter, which is November 5, 2020, unless the former or incumbent President requests a one-time extension of an additional 30 working days or asserts a constitutionally based privilege, in accordance with 44 U.S.C. 2208(b)-(d). Please let us know if you are able to complete your review before the expiration of the 60 working day period. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a)(1)(B), we will make this notice available to the public on the NARA website.

Bush Presidential electronic records proposed for opening are emails containing newspaper articles or portions thereof; press releases; mass-distributed emails from MoveOn; talking points; final drafts of speeches; compilations of factual information about outside interest groups; transcripts of public Congressional testimony and portions thereof; factual emails about protestors at various events; published policy papers; newsletters; fact sheets; petitions; vetting results; lists of resources for individuals affected by hurricanes; transcripts of television and radio programs; schedules; and correspondence with members of the press. The bulk of the records consist of newspaper articles, quotations from websites, newsletters, and talking points related to MoveOn or rebutting MoveOn statements about various policies of the George W. Bush administration. These policies include Social Security reform, the war in Iraq, judicial nominations, legislative reform related to 527 organizations, Medicare, Karl Rove's speeches and other activities on behalf of the administration, and General David Petraeus's testimony to Congress. These materials are from the Automated Records Management System (ARMS), Exchange Email, Exchange Email Restored – 21 Days, Exchange Email Restored – 33 Days, Exchange Email Restored – 40 Days, and RNC Personal Storage Table (PST) Search and Access Sets.

There are reports to Congress, including the Third Report to the Congress on the Operation of the Andean Trade Preference Act as Amended and the First Annual Report to Congress on the Inter-American Convention Against Corruption. Included are several routine head of state letters such as a letter to President George W. Bush from Bolivian President Jorge Quiroga declining an invitation to an inauguration, a letter from President Gonzalo Sanchez de Lozada on the anniversary of 9/11, and a cable offering condolence on the death of former President Hugo Banzer. These materials are from the National Security Council and cover the topic of the Andean Trade Promotion and Drug Eradication Act.

Bush and Mrs. Bush from friends and associates, signed grin-and-grin

photographs from events, responses to letters originally addressed to the White House from various agencies, scheduling requests, and invitations. These materials are from the White House Office of Records Management Subject Files.

Electronic records proposed for opening consist of articles, news compilations, invitations, agendas, press guidance, and letters from organizations. There are many emails concerning The Committee of 100 Annual Conference at which Anna Chennault was honored in 2005, such as invitations to White House staff, including President George W. Bush and Vice President Richard B. Cheney, agendas, biographical information of speakers, and event logistical information. Also present are media information and press releases regarding the release by the State Department of "Foreign Relations, 1964-1968, volume VII, Vietnam, September 1968-January 1969" which mentions Anna Chennault. Some records simply list Mrs. Chennault as a member of an organization in letterhead for letters sent to the White House from organizations. Lastly, there is a Worker and Visitor Entry System record for Mrs. Chennault from a March 27, 2003 visit to the OEOB. These electronic records are from the Automated Records Management System (ARMS), Exchange Email, Exchange Email Restored - 40 Days, RNC Personal Storage Table (PST), NSC Shared Drive, OA Shared Drive, PFIAB Shared Drive, WHO Shared Drive, and WAVES (Worker and Visitor Entry System) Search and Access Sets.
