Dear Mr. Warrington:

In accordance with the requirements of the Presidential Records Act (PRA), as amended, 44 U.S.C. §§2201-2209, this letter constitutes a formal notice from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to the incumbent President of our intent to open George W. Bush Presidential records in response to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests and systematic processing projects listed in Attachment A.

These records, consisting of 69,927 pages, 29,379 assets, and 12 video clips have been reviewed for all applicable FOIA exemptions, resulting in 4,820 pages, 1,704 assets, and 5 video clips withheld in whole and 1,059 pages, 1,334 assets and 1 video clip withheld in part. NARA is proposing to open the remaining 64,048 pages, 26,341 assets, and 6 video clips in whole and 1,059 pages, 1,334 assets and 1 video clip in part. A copy of any records proposed for release under this notice will be provided to you upon your request.

We are also concurrently informing former President George W. Bush's representative, Freddy Ford, of our intent to release these records. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a), NARA will release the records 60 working days from the date of this letter, which is October 8, 2026, unless the former or incumbent President requests a one-time extension of an additional 30 working days or asserts a constitutionally based privilege, in accordance with 44 U.S.C. 2208(b)-(d). Please let us know if you are able to complete your review before the expiration of the 60 working day period. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a)(1)(B), we will make this notice available to the public on the NARA website.

This researcher submitted a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for records on the Japanese government under Prime Minister Junichiro Koizumi regarding the Iraq War and privatization of the Japan Post. The George W. Bush Presidential electronic records proposed for opening are emails containing speech drafts, memoranda, reports, talking points, cables, news articles and summaries, legislation, briefings, transcripts, and meeting minutes. Materials relating to the Japan Post summarize internal U.S. government discussion regarding the issue, as well as negotiations with the Japanese government meant to alleviate concerns with the privatization process. The central figure in these records is Deputy Assistant U.S. Trade Representative for Japan Michael Beeman, although other figures from the Department of Commerce, Department of State, National Security Council, and Office of the U.S. Trade Representative are featured. Correspondence and memoranda show extensive planning for meetings between the two governments, as well as minutes and after-action reports detailing what was covered. Japanese and U.S. officials provide numerous drafts of the annual "Report to Leaders," which covered the mutual positions of each government on economic and trade issues. The records additionally demonstrate the role of the U.S. shipping and insurance industries in Japan Post negotiations, including their say in influencing Japan Post legislation. These emails raise other issues of note between the two countries, with particular emphasis on American beef exports to Japan and testing for Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE). The records for Japan and the Iraq War are almost entirely composed of news articles and news summaries. White House News Summaries, as well as news summaries from the Department of Defense and Department of State, offer details on Japan's role in the Iraq War, its decision to send troops from the Japan Self-Defense Forces (SDF) to Iraq, and the reaction of the Japanese public to the SDF's presence in Iraq. These materials are from the Automated Records Management System (ARMS), Exchange Email, Exchange Email Restored – 21 Days, Exchange Email Restored – 33 Days, and Exchange Email Restored – 40 Days Search and Access Sets.

Included are remarks at "Saluting Those Who Serve," an inaugural gala at the MCI Center including President George W. Bush, Mrs. Laura Bush, Mrs. Lynne Cheney, Vice President Dick Cheney, First Lady Barbara Bush, and former President George H.W. Bush. Also pictured are remarks at "America's Future Rocks Today - A Call to Service," a youth event at the DC Armory where Hilary Duff performed and remarks at the Chairman's Reception at the Andrew W. Mellon Auditorium. Photographs from January 19th include President George W. Bush with staff, remarks at the Chairman's Luncheon at the Andrew W. Mellon Auditorium, an official family portrait and White House family luncheon in honor of the Presidential Inauguration in the State Dining Room, a visit to the National Archives, Barney and Miss Beazley playing in the snow on the South Lawn, remarks at A Celebration of Freedom Inaugural Concert on The Ellipse with Vice President Dick Cheney and Mrs. Lynne Cheney, fireworks over the White House, and the Black Tie and Boots Ball with Jenna and Barbara

Bush. Photographs from January 20th include an Inaugural Day prayer service at St. John's Church, coffee with the Joint Congressional Committee on Inaugural Ceremonies Leadership, the Inaugural Swearing-In Ceremony at the United States Capitol, an Inaugural Day Luncheon, the Presidential Inaugural Parade, official portraits, and various Inaugural Balls. Photographs from September 2nd primarily include a trip to Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana to view Hurricane Katrina damage. These photographs include staff Aboard Air Force One, a meeting with Homeland Security Secretary Michael Chertoff aboard Air Force One, a briefing on hurricane damage at the Coast Guard Aviation Training Center at the Mobile Regional Airport in Mobile, Alabama, a walking tour of Biloxi, Mississippi hurricane damaged neighborhoods, a visit to a Salvation Army emergency disaster services truck food distribution site, and a Marine One aerial tour of Hurricane Katrina damage along the Mississippi coastline. Photographs in Louisiana include a meeting aboard Air Force One with Louisiana officials, a Marine One aerial tour of Louisiana Hurricane Katrina damage, a walking tour of New Orleans infrastructure damage including the 17th Street Levy in Metairie Parish, a briefing by Col. Richard Wagenaar of the Army Corps of Engineers, and a statement by President George W. Bush on Hurricane Katrina Recovery Efforts from the Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport. Other events include a briefing on Hurricane Katrina Relief in the Situation Room, the signing of a supplemental bill for relief aid in the Oval Office, and a visit by Mrs. Laura Bush with Hurricane Katrina victims at the Cajundome at the University of Louisiana and with first responders to Hurricane Katrina at the Acadian Ambulance Center in Lafayette, Louisiana. These materials are from the White House Photo System – Presidential Search and Access Set.

These records, consisting of 69,927 pages, 29,379 assets, and 12 video clips have been reviewed for all applicable FOIA exemptions, resulting in 4,820 pages, 1,704 assets, and 5 video clips withheld in whole and 1,059 pages, 1,334 assets and 1 video clip withheld in part. NARA is proposing to open the remaining 64,048 pages, 26,341 assets, and 6 video clips in whole and 1,059 pages, 1,334 assets and 1 video clip in part. We are also concurrently informing the incumbent President of our intent to release these George W. Bush Presidential records.
