Dear Mr. Eggleston:

In accordance with the requirements of the Presidential Records Act (PRA), as amended, 44 U.S.C. §§2201-2209, this letter constitutes a formal notice from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to the incumbent President of our intent to open Clinton Presidential records in response to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) appeal listed in Attachment A.

In light of this appeal of NARA's original determination to restrict 181 pages of Clinton Presidential records, this material has now been reviewed by the appellate authority for Clinton Presidential records. As a result of this review, it was determined that 171 pages in whole and 10 pages in part do not require closure under 44 U.S.C. §2204 and can be released. Therefore, NARA is proposing to open these records. A copy of any records proposed for release under this notice will be provided to you upon your request.

We are also concurrently informing former President Clinton's representative, Bruce Lindsey, of our intent to release these records. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a), NARA will release the records 60 working days from the date of this letter, which is April 8, 2015, unless the former or incumbent President requests a one-time extension of an additional 30 working days or asserts a constitutionally based privilege, in accordance with 44 U.S.C. 2208(b)-(d). Please let us know if you are able to complete your review before the expiration of the 60 working day period. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a)(1)(B), we will make this notice available to the public on the NARA website.

The researcher submitted an appeal of restricted materials containing any b(7) restriction in the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for records related to immigration detention policies. The material proposed for opening consists of reports and emails regarding enforcement of immigration law during the 1990s. This includes a 1990 Immigration and Naturalization Service report entitled “Investigations: Challenge & Response – Enforcement Strategies, Fiscal Year 1990.” The material also contains emails transmitted for periodic Coast Guard briefs regarding the interdiction of Haitian and Cuban migrant vessels in the Caribbean between 1997 and 2000. Finally, there is an unclassified cable regarding the arrest of individuals associated with an alleged Hizballah cell in North Carolina. While all of these materials touch on law enforcement matters, they are of a general nature.
