Dear Mr. Warrington:

In accordance with the requirements of the Presidential Records Act (PRA), as amended, 44 U.S.C. §§2201-2209, this letter constitutes a formal notice from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to the incumbent President of our intent to open Clinton Presidential records in response to the systematic processing projects listed in Attachment A.

These records, consisting of 64,404 pages, have been reviewed for all applicable FOIA exemptions, resulting in 466 pages restricted in whole or in part. NARA is proposing to open the remaining 63,938 pages. A copy of any records proposed for release under this notice will be provided to you upon your request.

We are also concurrently informing former President Clinton's representative, Bruce Lindsey, of our intent to release these records. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a), NARA will release the records 60 working days from the date of this letter, which is April 2, 2026, unless the former or incumbent President requests a one-time extension of an additional 30 working days or asserts a constitutionally based privilege, in accordance with 44 U.S.C. 2208(b)-(d). Please let us know if you are able to complete your review before the expiration of the 60 working day period. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. 2208(a)(1)(B), we will make this notice available to the public on the NARA website.

Blocker helped promote legislation on behalf of the Clinton Administration, including the Accountable Pipeline Safety and Partnership Act of 1996, Coast Guard Authorization Act of 1996, the Taxpayer Reduction Act of 1997, Balanced Budget Act of 1997, and the Financial Services Competition Act of 1997. He also worked closely with members of the Congressional Black Caucus. The Clinton Presidential Records to be opened consist of agendas, correspondence, drafts of bills, fact sheets, reports, speeches, handwritten notes, memoranda, briefings, press releases, talking points, newspaper clippings, publications, and printed emails, concerning a variety of issues, including affirmative action, age discrimination, the U.S. Coast Guard, Small Business Administration's 8(a) Program, Amtrak, Historically Black Colleges and Universities, education tax credits, schools, Empowerment Zones, race relations, executive departments, and the White House Leadership Conference.
