Dear Mr. Warrington:

In accordance with the requirements of the Presidential Records Act (PRA), as amended, 44 U.S.C. §§2201-2209, this letter constitutes a formal notice from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) to the incumbent President of our intent to open Pence Vice Presidential records in response to the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests listed in Attachment A.

This material, consisting of 7 electronic files, has been reviewed for the six PRA Presidential restrictive categories, including confidential communications requesting or submitting advice (P5) and material related to appointments to federal office (P2). These records were also reviewed for all applicable FOIA exemptions. As a result of this review, 1 electronic file in part has been restricted. Therefore, NARA is proposing to open the remaining 6 electronic files in whole and 1 electronic file in part that do not require closure under 44 U.S.C. § 2204. A copy of any records proposed for release under this notice will be provided to you upon your request.

We are providing this notification to White House Counsel in your role as legal representative for the incumbent and as point of contact for records from President Trump's previous administration. We are also concurrently informing former Vice President Pence's representative, Greg Jacob, of our intent to release these records. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. § 2208(a), NARA will release the records 60 working days from the date of this letter, which is October 21, 2026, unless the former President, former Vice President, or incumbent President requests a one-time extension of an additional 30 working days or if the former or incumbent President asserts a constitutionally based privilege, in accordance with 44 U.S.C. 2208(b)-(d). Please let us know if you are able to complete your review before the expiration of the 60 working day period. Pursuant to 44 U.S.C. § 2208(a)(1)(B), we will make this notice available to the public on the NARA website.

These records include copies of federal policies which reference AVIP, the U.S. Department of Defense policy for administering anthrax vaccines to military and certain civilian personnel. Records include a chapter of a senior officer legal orientation for emergency essential civilians on the battlefield, the 2006 edition of the Operational Law Handbook guide for Judge Advocates, and the 2010 edition of the United States Code Title 10 – Armed Forces (10 U.S.C.). Each sets forth parameters for participation in AVIP and include other policies pertaining to military and civilian personnel.
