they having been living together as man and wife for about Twenty and years past,
and have had, as the result thereof, the following children, viz:

Stephen Provines Aged about 19 years. Stephen
went off with Genl. Wilders command of U. S. Troops
in 1863. and was heard from at Louisville Ky soon
after Hood's raid to Nashville, probably went by
the name of Sanders or Calhoun
