# DESERT-LAND ENTRY.

Acts of March 3, 1877, and March 3, 1891.

## CLAIMANT'S TESTIMONY.

I, William F. Cody, a bona fide resident citizen of Big Horn County, Wyoming, having on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of Feb., 1901, made entry No. 480 of the 2W<sup>x</sup>4E<sup>x</sup>; 4E<sup>x</sup>3E<sup>x</sup>; W<sup>x</sup>3E<sup>x</sup>; E<sup>x</sup>2W<sup>x</sup> Sec. 21; 4W<sup>x</sup>4E<sup>x</sup>; 4E<sup>x</sup>4W<sup>x</sup> of section 28, in township 50 N. of range 105 W., containing 320 acres, at the district land office at LANDER, WYOMING, under the desert-land laws of the United States, do solemnly swear that during the second year after making said entry, that is, after the 27 day of Feb, 1902, and before the 27 day of Feb, 1903, I expended in the necessary irrigation, reclamation, and cultivation of said land, the sum of \$600<sup>00</sup>, being not less than one dollar per acre of the area thereof, and that said sum was expended in the manner following, viz:

\* Constructing ditches, fences, breaking and seeding.
