

State, Local, Tribal, Public Sector Policy Advisory Committee (SLTPS-PAC) Meeting Minutes June 29, 2022

The SLTPS-PAC held its 22nd meeting on Wednesday, June 29, 2022, virtually. Mr. Mark Bradley, Director, Information Security Oversight Office (ISOO) served as Chair.

Government members of the requirement to annually file the financial disclosure report with the National Archives and Record Administration (NARA) Office of the General Counsel (OGC). There are currently a few slots open on the PAC.

This this will be Mr. Greg Pannoni's last meeting. Mr. Pannoni had served as an Associate Director at ISOO, as well as being the Designated Federal Officer (DFO) for the SLTPS-PAC. The Chair discussed Mr. Pannoni's numerous contributions to the security community.

There were three outstanding items from the last SLTPS meeting:

- The Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) is still working on providing its SLTPS security data to the Defense Counterintelligence Security Agency (DCSA) to include identifying non-task force officers in their system for inclusion in the data transfer. The FBI has been involved in end-to-end testing of the data process with DCSA. ISOO requests the FBI to provide an update in 2023 during our next meeting.
- When COVID restrictions have ended, ISOO will host a meeting in its SCIF with ODNI and other entities to examine why the intelligence community (IC) is unable to determine the current number of SLTPS personnel.
- There are continuing discussions on the recommendations and the comments from cyber threat information sharing working group between the Department of Homeland Security and ISOO. The chair determines potential ways forward and communicate them to the SLTPS-PAC membership.

ISOO will work on getting engagement from the Secret Service School for Law Enforcement that work in forensics the United States Secret Service (USSS) National Computer Forensics Institute (NCFI). Ms. Meghann Teubner recommended that the information be sent to the New York Police Department's (NYPD) Office of Professional Development and Training Bureau. This would greatly serve Operation Sentry, a network of 500 law enforcement agencies across the U.S. These are local law enforcement that has been created for information sharing purposes. This program reaches 400-500 agencies with 800 individual participants for the Sentry program.

Mr. Richard McComb, Executive Agent for the SLTPS program, was next. DHS is recommending that a member of the Cyber Security and Infrastructure Security Agency serve as a member of their PAC. Mr. Bradley heartily endorsed that idea.

Mr. Pannoni mentioned that two executive orders (EO), EO 13526, Classified National Security Information Program and EO 13556, Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI), will be open for revisions. Proposed changes should be sent to ISOO.

Mr. Ricardo Durón, who is responsible for the DHS Security and Compliance Program, noted that 88% of the DHS security population have a Secret clearance and 12% have a Top Secret clearance. Secondly, DHS performed two room certifications for two fusion centers. They also conducted six onsite security performance assessments. DHS is also gathering data and compiling the list to create a fiscal year (FY) 2023 compliance schedule to perform with their community partners. DHS has also processed and closed out seven security incidents involving state and local employees, which were assigned to the fusion centers.
