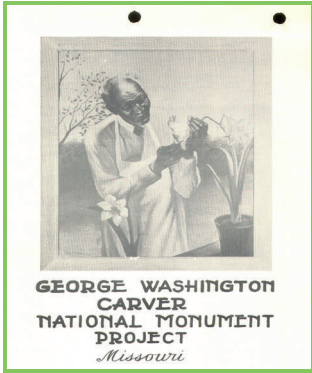

Innovation in History: Impact and Change

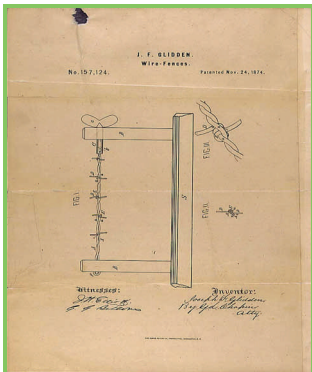
