SUBJECT: Continuing Correspondence from [REDACTED]

You will recall that [REDACTED] after receiving from the President a gracious reply in response to [REDACTED] gift of a color print, sent Mr. Deaver a price list for similar prints to be placed in every federal building, noting that [REDACTED] was "out to make a buck." Deaver sent the package to you and you sent a very restrained and polite response to what was a rather crass letter. Now [REDACTED] has sent you a nasty letter, objecting to your answering the letter [REDACTED] sent to Deaver.
