




The Rotunda is where the Declaration of Independence,
Constitution of the United States and Bill of Rights are proudly
displayed, sealed and scientifically preserved in the National Archives.
Together they are called the Charters of Freedom. The Emancipation
Proclamation, which declared freedom for persons held as slaves, is
kept at the Archives, too.


