TIPS:

- **Make a list of all the people you want to look for in the 1940 Census. Collect addresses for these people using the above worksheet.** Addresses are needed to determine the 1940 Census Enumeration District (ED). Addresses can be found from resources, such as:
 - National Archives resources e.g., : World War II Draft Records , Naturalization Petitions or Declarations of Intent filed around 1940.
 - Local area resources e.g., : City and telephone directories, birth, marriage, or death certificates, yearbooks, newspapers, deeds, tax records and more.
- **If you know the address use the *One-Step converter* :** <http://www.stevemorse.org/census> to find the ED for the 1940 Census. (Use the *One-Step* to convert 1930 Census EDs to 1940 EDs for people who did not move between 1930 and 1940).
 If your city is not listed on the *One-Step*, use the National Archives Online Public Access tool at: <http://www.archives.gov/research/search/> to search for a 1940 Census Enumeration District county/city map. By searching a map, you will get the full listing of EDs you can search through.
- **Once you have the enumeration district, you can search the 1940 Census. The 1940 Census will be available at 1940census.archives.gov on April 2, 2012.**
 At that site you can search for a. digitized copies of the Census by Enumeration District and then b. browse the schedules for your family members' entry.
