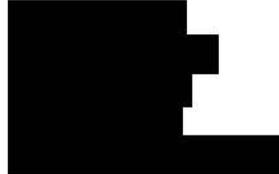

This responds to your February 6, 2015 request for assistance from the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS), which we received on February 26, 2015 via U.S. mail. Your request for assistance pertains to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to the Department of Justice, Executive Office for U.S. Attorneys (EOUSA).¹

Congress created OGIS to complement existing FOIA practice and procedure; we strive to work in conjunction with the existing request and appeal process. The goal is for OGIS to allow, whenever practical, the requester to exhaust his or her remedies within the agency, including the appeal process. OGIS has no investigatory or enforcement power, nor can we compel an agency to release documents. OGIS serves as the Federal FOIA Ombudsman and our jurisdiction is limited to assisting with the FOIA process.

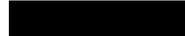
You requested OGIS assistance in obtaining the status of two undated requests that you explained were sent to EOUSA. We reached out to EOUSA's FOIA Public Liaison and learned that EOUSA did not receive any of the letters you enclosed in your correspondence to OGIS.

As a courtesy to you, EOUSA agreed to accept the undated letters you submitted to OGIS, and logged them in the agency's system as new FOIA requests from you. Attached for your records are EOUSA's responses to your requests. One acknowledges your request for salary information. The other is a final response concerning manuals on how DOJ deals with complaints and prosecutorial misconduct.

Please note that OGIS does not typically submit requests on behalf of customers; however, in the interest of good customer service, EOUSA accepted your requests from OGIS rather than requiring you to resubmit them.



¹ On March 12, 2015, OGIS responded to your request for assistance concerning the U.S. Sentencing Commission's denial of your request. This letter addresses the issues you raised concerning FOIA requests submitted to EOUSA.
