This responds to your April 16, 2015 request for assistance from the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS), which we received via email. Thank you for your interest in OGIS.

Re: Case No.: 201500634

As you are aware, Congress created OGIS to complement existing Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) practice and procedure; we strive to work in conjunction with the existing request and appeal process. The goal is for OGIS to allow, whenever practical, the requester to exhaust his or her remedies within the agency, including the appeal process. OGIS has no investigatory or enforcement power, nor can we compel an agency to release documents. OGIS serves as the Federal FOIA Ombudsman and our jurisdiction is limited to assisting with the FOIA process.

You contacted OGIS regard	ding a FOIA request that your client,
submitted to the Federal Br	areau of Investigation (FBI) for records on a third party
) whom	believes is deceased. In response to her request,
received an e	mail from the FBI informing her that she must submit
either proof of	death or his consent to release the records; you dispute
the FBI did not also inform	of the option to explain the public interest in
the records she seeks. Furtl	ner, you are concerned that the FBI's communication to
does not incl	ude information on how to appeal the FBI's action.

In response to your submission, we contacted FBI FOIA Public Liaison Dennis Argall to discuss your concerns. Mr. Argall explained the FBI's April 10, 2015 email was intended to inform that the FBI needed additional information to process her request. Mr. Argall also informed OGIS that the FBI will be sending a letter to that corrects FBI's initial response to her request.

This is also to inform you that we have informed our Review team of this matter; if OGIS reviews the FBI's FOIA unit sometime in the future, the team will evaluate this policy along with other OGIS FBI cases as part of its process.
