This responds to your May 9, 2015 request for assistance from the Office of Government Information Services (OGIS), which we received via email. Your request for assistance pertains to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request to U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS).

Congress created OGIS to complement existing FOIA practice and procedure; we strive to work in conjunction with the existing request and appeal process. The goal is for OGIS to allow, whenever practical, the requester to exhaust his or her remedies within the agency, including the appeal process. OGIS has no investigatory or enforcement power, nor can we compel an agency to release documents. OGIS serves as the Federal FOIA Ombudsman and our jurisdiction is limited to assisting with the FOIA process.

OGIS staff contacted USCIS to discuss your request, particularly your concern that the agency may not understand the age of the records you seek (in light of its response to your first request). As the agency's letter explains, arrival records (such as the passenger or crewmen manifest or I-94) that date prior to December 31, 1982 are transferred to the National Archives. Since the subject of your request immigrated to the U.S. sometime in **December**, USCIS no longer has the records you seek.

I hope that this information about your request is useful to you. At this time, there is no further assistance OGIS can offer. Thank you for bringing this matter to OGIS. We will close your case.
