Dear agents of the United States and Representatives on the FOIAAC, Unbelievably concealed from the public by the DOJ in its revised FOIA regulations proposed more than 39 MONTHS AGO are the twenty day adjudication limitations mandated by 5 USC 552(a)(6)(A) (i) and (ii) (see <http://www.gpo.gov/fdsys/pkg/FR-2011-03-21/pdf/2011-6473.pdf> 21/pdf/2011-6473.pdf). Further intentions of the DOJ to conceal such statutory limitations are manifested by its neglect to even specifically cite them under Parts 16.6 and 16.8. of such revised regulations. Ironic it is indeed that the "lead Federal agency responsible for implementation of the FOIA across the government" (see <http://www.judiciary.senate.gov/imo/media/doc/11-3-15%20Pustay%20Testimony.pdf>) is motivating the entire Executive branch to update their own FOIA regulations based on such a "model" of concealment.
