Ironic it is indeed that the "lead Federal agency responsible for implementation of the FOIA across the government" (see http://www.judiciary.senate.gov/imo/media/doc/11-3-15%20Pustay%20Testimony.pdf) is motivating the entire Executive branch to update their own FOIA regulations based on such a "model" of law breaching.
