I am contacting you for assistance with a recent request I made under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).

On September 1, 2009 I submitted a FOIA request to the National Archives and Records Administration for documents related to a book I am writing. On September 10, 2009 I received a letter from NARA informing me that the FOIA office had received my request and assigning me case no. 2009-1111. On November 9, 2009 I received 76 pages; the accompanying letter informed me that 12 pages were denied and cited Exemption 1. I appealed this finding in a letter dated November 20, 2009 and this appeal was denied in a letter dated December 12, 2009. I have attached copies of all of this correspondence for your review.

I don't understand why NARA could not release this information to me. The topic of my book does not relate to national security at all. I understand that your office provides mediation services for FOIA requests such as mine. I look forward to hearing from your office about how this disagreement can be mediated.
