Dear Sir

I have the honor to enclose to your attention, the Declaration of Geo. Barber of Annapolis claiming a Pension for Revolutionary Services with a request that you will present it to the proper Department and communicate the result to me in behalf of Captain Barber.

He has been sorely afflicted by Paralysis which has twisted his mouth and one Eye and enfeebled him. He has always been remarkable for his sober & Temperate Life tho' exposed to the Inclemency of the weather. His Declaration with the Proof or Deposition of Jos. Sands Secy. the Collector of the Port were prepared and by him given to me this evening with the above request.

The Evidence of those Services was formerly in the Auditor's Office but cannot be found by the Register of the Land Office who has charge of the Books & Papers since the abolition of the Office, which fell
