We are also in the process of working with our NARA Account Manager to evaluate the cost-benefit of utilizing our existing interagency agreement to digitize our records through the Federal Records Center.

MSPB has backfilled the Records Officer position and is working to incorporate records and information management (RIM) when discussing new technology. We are also working to incorporate RIM into the onboarding and exit clearance policy.
