2009 RM Self-Assessment

- ▶ NWM 16.2010, RM Self-Assessment for FY 2009
- ▶ Received 221 out of 245 recipients, 90 percent
- ▶ Scored responses to 40 questions in five sections (includes weighting)
 - E-mail management - 30 pts
 - Program management - 26 pts
 - Electronic records - 18 pts
 - Records disposition - 18 pts
 - Vital records - 8 pts
- ▶ Analysis based on identified levels of risk to records or programs
 - Low risk - 90-100 pts - 21%
 - Moderate risk - 60-89 pts - 43%
 - High risk - 0-59 pts - 36%

2009 RM Self-Assessment

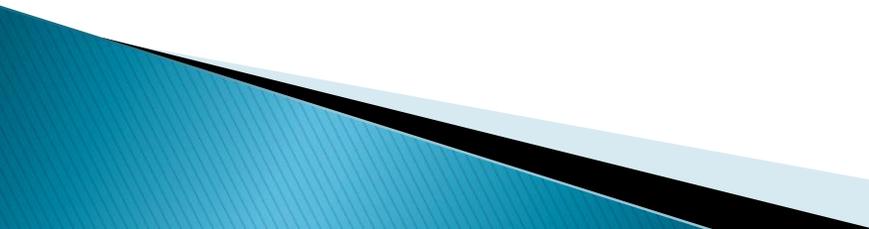
► Findings

- E-mail management continues to present challenges for agencies
 - Agency e-mail policies need strengthening; often do not meet criteria in 1236.22
 - Agency training on e-mail not regularly done and is not reaching highest levels
- E-records scheduling and transfer needs improvement
 - 54% of agencies reported more than 75% of systems scheduled
 - 27% of agencies reported web records as scheduled
 - 23% of agencies reported transferring e-records to NARA in FY 2009
- Audit and compliance requires more attention
 - 61% of agencies have conducted a recent evaluation of agency RM practices

2010 RM Self-Assessments

- ▶ FY 2010 Self-assessment due to be released May 17
 - Mandatory exercise for all Federal agencies
 - Agencies will have until midnight on June 11
 - Contains 55 questions, building upon FY 2009 lessons
 - Focus area on agency RM training activities

2010 RM Self-Assessments

- ▶ The questionnaire will not be distributed in advance (though it will be available as PDF)
 - ▶ Agencies must enter their responses via the web link only
 - ▶ No responses will be accepted after midnight, June 11

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E-Records Reporting

- ▶ September 30, 2009 reporting deadline set in NARA Bulletin 2006-02 (Issued December 15, 2005)
- ▶ Agency response was fair, peaking in September 2009
 - Reports received from 142 of 256 agencies – 55 percent
 - As of October 1, 2009, only 34% of all agencies are at 80% compliance level
- ▶ E-records reporting continues as ongoing agency responsibility (NARA Bulletin 2010-02)

E-Records Reporting

- ▶ Report on E-records scheduling and transfer activities from FY 2005 – FY 2010 due May 2010
- ▶ NARA Bulletin 2010-02 (Feb 25, 2010) supersedes previous E-Records Bulletins 2006-02 and 2008-03
- ▶ Newest requirement will be regular semi-annual reporting on agency E-records activities
 - March 31
 - September 30
- ▶ Attachment with guidance and tips to assist agencies in scheduling their e-records and systems

Flexible scheduling bulletin

- ▶ NARA Bulletin soon to be released with updated guidance on:
 - Big bucket schedules
 - Flexible retention periods
- ▶ Supersedes Bulletins 2008-04 and 2005-05
- ▶ Written in FAQ format

Flexible scheduling bulletin

- ▶ Why a new Bulletin now?
 - Builds upon lessons of Flexible Scheduling Study (2008)
 - <http://www.archives.gov/records-mgmt/resources/flexible-studies.html>
- ▶ Incorporates knowledge within NARA and agencies since idea initially proposed in 2003

Flexible scheduling bulletin

- ▶ New bulletin includes much of the previously issued content
- ▶ Adds *expanded* sections on:
 - Steps to develop a big bucket schedule
 - Examples of big bucket schedule items
- ▶ Includes *new* sections on:
 - Characteristics of BB schedules
 - Implementing BB schedules
 - Examples of BB schedule crosswalks
 - Implementing flexible retention periods
