



NARA Datasets on Data.gov

- ▶ **2007–2009 Code of Federal Regulations**
 - The codification of the general and permanent regulations of the Federal Government published in the Federal Register
- ▶ **2000–2010 Federal Register**
 - The official legal newspaper of the United States Government, documenting regulatory actions and policies of Federal agencies
- ▶ **Archival Descriptions from the Archival Research Catalog (ARC)**
 - Descriptions of the permanent holdings of the Federal Government including traditional paper holdings, electronic records, and artifacts
- ▶ **Organization Descriptions from the Archival Research Catalog (ARC)**
 - Highly detailed presentation of the evolution of names and administrative histories of Federal and non-Federal organizations

Forthcoming Datasets

- ▶ **Classification Management Data (July 2010)**
 - This information is used for ISOO's Annual Report to the President and shows the classification activity of each agency, as well as declassification activity.
- ▶ **ARC Performance Measures (July 2010)**
 - This data represents the percentage of holdings described in ARC, including traditional holdings, artifacts, and electronic holdings
- ▶ **Public Papers of the Presidents (Sept. 2010)**
 - The official publication of the writings, addresses, and remarks of the Presidents of the United States

Strategies for Fostering the Public's Use of Datasets

- ▶ Publicize the availability of datasets
 - ▶ Be a resource for questions and troubleshooting
 - ▶ We will explore an “Apps for Archives” contest to encourage technology development and innovation to benefit the public's access to our records
 - ▶ We will explore additional incentives for developers, institutions, and public interest groups
