Applicability: Inter-agency

Description: The Fire Program Analysis System (FPA) is a multi-agency initiative to develop a common, interagency system for wildfire preparedness analysis, planning, and budgeting. FPA-PM is a tool to consolidate the budget request and fire preparedness efforts of the five Federal wild land fire management agencies: USDA Forest Service, Department of the Interior's Bureau of Land Management, National Park Service, Fish and Wildlife Service, and Bureau of Indian Affairs.

a. Inputs. Data for this system includes fire preparedness data, weather and climate data, simulation of initial attack alternatives, and fire occurrence data.

TEMPORARY. Delete/Destroy after the data has been entered into the master file and verified.

b. Master File. Data includes ecosystem condition, fuel condition, weather and climate history, fire occurrence history, fire suppression resource type, kind and location, resources, and values at risk.

PERMANENT. Transfer a copy of the data to the National Archives every 3 years when the most recent data in the bundle is 5 years old in accordance with 36 CFR 1228.270.

c. Outputs. Suppression resources that are measured by "Weighted Acres Managed (WAM)" and used for budgetary reasons.

TEMPORARY. Destroy/Delete when no longer needed for agency business.

d. Documentation. User Guides, system requirements, data dictionary, and C & A.

PERMANENT. Transfer to the National Archives along with the Master File (Item 1b) in accordance with 36 CFR 1228.270.
