The American Community Survey (ACS) will collect decennial census long-form data every month instead of once every ten years. The Census Bureau will provide tabulations of these data a yearly basis rather than only once each decay after years of research, development and testing, the ACS began full implementation in January 2005 in every county of the U.S. with annual sample of three million housing units. Full implementation also included all municipid in Puerto Rico with an annual sample of approximately 432,000 housing units. The ACS data will be available every year for areas and population groups of 65,000 or more beginning Summer 2006. For small areas and population groups of 15,000 or less, it will take five year to accumulate a sample to provide estimates with accuracy similar to that of the decennial censurate means updated information for areas such a neighborhoods will be available starting in Summer 2010 and every year thereafter.
