

## Foreign Economic Administration

### Record Group 169

Described below are the unscheduled records assigned to RG 169, currently under the purview of the Department of the Treasury, housed at the Washington National Records Center. Additional Foreign Economic Administration records will be scheduled with the concurrence of the Department of State.

Often intermingled with the permanent records are disposable materials which cannot easily be removed until the records are transferred to the National Archives where they can be screened during archival processing. In addition to those records identified in this schedule, the National Archives will remove records authorized for destruction under the following:

1. Records authorized for destruction by SF 115s approved for Bureau of Employment Security records;
2. Records authorized for destruction by the General Records Schedules, and;
3. Nonrecord, including duplicate materials.

#### Property Disposal Branch

1. Accounting Records Relating to Lend Lease Materials, 1942-50. 114 cubic feet. Arranged by subject.

Lend-lease accounts related to the Soviet Union, the United Kingdom, and Saudi Arabia. Included in the records are audit worksheets, invoices, bills of lading and manifests for lend-lease cargo placed on specified vessels for the Soviet Union. There are records relating to the Russian Diversion Project and include accounting reports on shipments of lend-lease supplies diverted from the USSR to ports in the United Kingdom. The records also include transaction reports, transfer receipts, statements of reimbursable charges, and invoices. In addition there is routine correspondence between the Department of the Treasury and the Office of Liquidation Commissioners on surplus materials related to British requisitions, and ledgers of statement of accounts with foreign nations. The records reveal an accounting of lend-lease dealings with Saudi Arabia and consist of monthly reports showing the status of lend-lease requisitions, summary reports on the accounting of lend-lease, bills of lading, and charges for ocean transport to the USSR and Saudi Arabia.

3. Accounting Records Relating to Lend-Lease Material for the United Kingdom, 1942-49. 24 cubic feet. Arranged by subject.

Correspondence, memoranda, reports, vouchers, billings, and requisitions related to the accounting of lend-lease surplus materials in the United Kingdom. The records include accounting for the appropriations and distribution of surplus materials involving the termination of lend-lease contracts, repossession of lend-lease materials, and schedules of collection payments. There are records of billings, vouchers, and requisitions related to transfer of lend-lease surplus medical supplies from the United Kingdom to the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration (UNRRA).
